

# **Britons Seek** To Head Off Open Fight

NICOSIA, Cyprus (AP) -Britain ordered more troops to Cyprus today as a conflict between the Greek Cypriot and Turkish minority threatened to embroil NATO allies Greece and Turkey in open conflict.

Greece asked for an extraordinary session in Paris of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization's permanent council to discuss the crisis. Informed sources in Paris said the council met secretly Wednesday. The Cyprus government already has sent a complaint to

the United Nations. The Turkish government ordered two jet fighters to make warning flights over Cyprus Christmas Day after accusing Greek Cypriots of massacring Turkish Cypriots in communal fighting that has been raging since last Saturday

NAVAL VESSELS

Then as the fighting died down to sporadic firing, the office of President Makarios, leader of the Greek Cypriot community, asserted six Turkish navy vessels had taken up positions off Cyprus.

President Cemal Gursel of Turkey also expressed grave concern, accused the Greek Cypriots of a massacre, and appealed to President Johnson and other world leaders to intervene.

The situation was being watched closely in both London and Washington. Greece and Turkey, long at odds over Cyprus, guard the Far Eastern flank of the Atlantic Alliance.



Mrs. Waymon L. Phillips is a professional woman for only our hours each day. During that time she is an X-ray technician at Malone-Hogan Hospital

Twenty more hours a day she works at being a homemaker. The uniform may not be as glamorous - or the pay as steady-but the longer job is more rewarding in other ways.

During the morning hours when Mrs. Phillips is on duty, the family's home at 1606 Sunset is in the care of a housekeeper, Mrs. L. E. Taylor. Mrs. Taylor takes care of Randy, 4, and prepares the noon meal. Two other children, Greg, 10, and Debbie, 7, attend Washington Place school.

Mrs. Phillips takes over when she returns home from work at mid-day. In the several hours before the older children get out of school she starts the evening meal, plans the next day's menu, sews, or shops. "We use a lot of frozen



systems at least profess as a basic goal the elimination of poverty. That certainly is a fundamental objective of the United States' democratic capitalistic system, and it may claim more progress in material well-being than any other major nation.

Nevertheless, eradicating poverty paradoxically remains a yet distant goal in affluent America. Absolute abolition of poverty may be an impossibility; there may always be some voluntarily in that condition. But surely involuntary poverty can be overcome, and surely the wretched by choice are a small minority among the poor.

Studies by the Twentieth Century Fund and the National Policy Committee on Pockets of Poverty indicate that today some 20 million Americans, or about one in 10, live in "abject poverty." That is, their in come level is such that they are deprived of the bare necessities of healthy, decent living. Another 26 million are estimated to live under

All modern political and economic conditions of "minimum adequacy." Poverty is subject to varying definitions. But these studies show that poverty, however defined, remains a grave, chronic problem in the richest nation on earth.

The outstanding point in the studies of American poverty is that it is not eliminated by merely expanding economic activity, or by accelerating economic growth. Today's poor are hurt a little more by recessions, but helped little by business booms.

One of the great challenges facing our system is to somehow shrink these pockets and restore as many of these unfortunates as possible to a useful role in our society. The increasing number of elderly who can hardly more than subsist on their savings, social security or aid; the displacements of advancing technology; the penalty of inadequate education and training; the barriers of color and background-all these present formidable obstacles in the assault on poverty. Yet the attack must be pressed. Our system can do something about it.

#### Look Back With Fond Memories

It's all over now for another year, and our city firemen expect nothing out of their labors except a sense of satisfaction in brightening the holidays for little children. Yet, it is proper to say thanks to these men in their herculean effort to repair and renovate the hundreds of toys given so graciously by a public willing to

Year in and year out, the firemen have donated hundreds of man hours to restore toys to working order and to make them look like new. Others help by donating to the Christmas cheer fund to buy parts and supplies for this project, and by helping to refurbish and dress the scores upon scores of dolls. But basically, it is the unsung labor of love by our city firemen that sets all this into mo-

And the community's thanks, too, to the Salvation Army for its part in distributing the toys and for seeing that the needy have a basket of food to insure not only a good Christmas meal, but sustenance for many days. These are the sort of things which makes it possible to look back on Christmas with fond memories.

#### David Lawrence Politicking In The U.N.

WASHINGTON - The American the United States, Britain, France, people got only one side of the story of the United Nations last week. President Johnson lent his prestige to the organization when he addressed it with highsounding words for for reasons naturally spoke no words of criticism.

The whole story, however is a disturbing one-a betrayal of the simple rules of morality by an organization that is financially bankrupt because many of its members refuse to pay their assessments and depend instead on the United States to continue to bail the U.N. out of its financial dif-

CONCURRENTLY a plot has been hatched by the Afro-Asian bloc to exercise control over the Security Council, first by increasing the number of its members, and then by making such alterations in the U.N. charter from time to time as could paralyze the one-vote veto of the United States.

The first step came on December 17-the very day President Johnson was there-when the General Assembly adopted a resulution calling for an enlargement of the Security Council. The Afro-Asian bloc had the votes to put this through. The United States isn't pleased with the action. But, while it keeps on begging the Afro-Asian bloc not to go to extremes, it hesitates to speak out in the open to mobilize public opinion against such attempts to change the whole character of the U. N.

IN THIS INSTANCE, the American delegation seems to be relying on the Soviet Union to exercise a veto when the matter comes before the Security Council. But Russia's ostensible opposition at present may well be a cover-up of her real purposes, and eventually the Soviet government will play ball with the Afro-Asian group, most of which Moscow is suspected of controlling today anyhow.

If the Security Council is enlarged to 15 members, it would take a 9member group to pass a resolution. This, too, could work to the Soviet advantage. The Afro-Asian bloc proposes that the Security Council be composed of three members from Africa, two from Asia, one from East Europe, two from Latin America, two from West Europe and other states, plus the five permanent members-

MANY OF OUR officials here in Washington and the U.N. are brushing aside the dangers as they argue would have to be ratified by the U.S. Senate, since it would amount to a modification of an existing treaty, and that the present charter of the U.N. is an integral part of the treaty through which the United States entered the U.N. in the first place. But unless the United States chooses to withdraw from the U.N., the changes in the charter will have to be

Sooner or later the full story of how Uncle Sam plays the role of a "sucker" in the U.N. will come out in the open when Congress considers appropriations. Other nations are not paying an equitable share.

IN 1960, when the U. N. had less than 100 members, a European economic officer at the U.N. figured that 50 of these were contributing only 2.5 per cent of the costs of the whole organization. Yet these same 50 nations made up a majority in the General Assembly-enough to control its voting. The situation since then has not changed perceptibly .

Apart from financial troubles, the real failure of the U.N. is the lack of morality on the part of so many of the Afro-Asian governments. They regard the U.N. as their political tool. They brush aside consistency and long-standing principles of international conduct by indulging in conspiracies such as are common in corrupt political machines. ## Unhappy, Horrible, Holiday Happening

We are in the midst of a terrifying count . . . the number that will die in traffic before this time next week. Despite the cautionary warnings of police officers and safety officials, hundreds of people will die in the wreckage of their own cars while on a holiday trip.

SOME HAVE suggested that the various media picture the holiday accident picture too gruesomely. suggest these tragedies are not pictured enough, and submit they should be shown in greater detail. Perhaps, motorists could be shocked into doing something about the totals that, at this minute, are climbing higher.

Booze usually gets the blame for most such deaths, and I suppose it should have much of the responsibility. But there are many other reasons, speed probably being the worst offender. At any rate, slick highways, liquor and a speeding car constitute a dangerous combination. Any one of them is bad enough, but together they are murder.

FEW SIGHTS are more terrible than a wreck scene. I thought once of sending season's greeting cards showing such a scene, in the hopes the receivers would take care to insure it didn't happen to them during the holidays. The twisted metal, broken glass, scattered belongings leave a pitiful memory. The mangled bodies, covered by sheets or hastily taken away in an ambulance, are

IT'S DEPRESSING in a "season to

be jolly." But it happens; it's hap-pening right now. Perhaps in our county, surely in this area, and certainly in the state, someone is dying right this minute as the result of a

traffic mishap. Probably, the tragedy occurred to someone who was certain that "it might happen to someone else, but not to me." In fact, before this time next week, 96 Texans (this figure likely is conservative) will die in a horrible crash, according to official estimates. Not one of them thought they would wind up a statistic.

DESPITE all the publicity of previous years, I don't think the various media have made the point. Perhaps abrupt shock is the only way to encourage drivers to be more careful. Quoting statistics has been very successful. After years of this attack, motorists are still dying on the highways, in bigger numbers than ever.

If every holiday driver were forced to see one accident, see a family divided by needless death, watch the ambulance take away a crushed body, go to the funeral home to see the family in grief, perhaps this would bring home the fact that car accidents are needless and can be avoided. There is no reason why a season set aside for joy and holiday should be turned into some kind of highway slaughter event.

CAREFUL DRIVERS can return the season to a jolly one, as it should be. And every driver should be a careful one. You, too.

In the area, cousins, sisters, other relatives, abound. And these and old neighbors-ranchers, wranglers, foremen, local laboring men and businessmen and bankers-the President has always visited at or near Christmastime when he could.

THE LBJ RANCH is what Hyde Park was to Franklin Roosevelt, what Independence, Mo., was to Harry Truman. It is home. And it permits President Johnson a freedom of movement-rides through the mesquite on a bay horse, walks alone through the hills along the Pedernales Riverwhich do a good deal to restore his spirit and to ease, not the work itself, which always continues at the ranch about as here, but the pressure of the




