"I can see only one purpose to Truman's present course in foreign affairs." Bender said. "That is the political purpose of moving from one international crisis to another in order to establish himself as a leader who should not be abandoned in the midst of a virtual state

WASHINGTON -- (AP)-

In a new multi-million dollar action, the government Thursday filed with the Interstate Commerce Commission a claim against the nation's railroads for alleged overcharges on wartime shipments of

explosives and ammunition. The government's complaint, filed by the Justice. Department, does not give any specific figure which the government seeks to recover from 717 railroad companies, but officials, estimated that between \$30,000,000 and \$40,000,000 is invol ed.

The petition to ICC for investigation and a reparations order (for repayment of overcharges) is the eighth in a series of complaints which the Justice Department has made concerning the wartime freight charges by railroads.

Altogether, hundreds of millions of dollars are involved. The previous complaints alleged overcharges on interior storage of military equipment awaiting shipment overseas, on the hauling of

steel and aluminum airplane landing mats, and other items. Claims Rates Too High The complaint concerning charges for explosives and ammunition movements contends that "the

magnitude of the shipments of explosives and the successful safety measure placed in effect by the armed services, and other favorable transportation characteristics, entitled the government to rates much lower than those imposed by the railroads.".

Buchenwald

NEW YORK - P-There must be laughter in heaven and hell overthe news from Germany that Frau Ilse Koch is to spend the rest of + her life in prison.

There are thousands of spectral victims of Nazi persecution who would rather grop the scaffold beneath her, or haul her up gasping

into the sky. They are the dead people who once knew her as the "Queen of Buchenwald," the Nazi concentration camp outside Weimar where some 50,000 prisoners were put to

Frau Koch is an unbelieveable woman to the few people who still dismiss the Nazi mass executions as "war propaganda." Such people

I first saw Buchenwald, where the dead were piled like logs, shortly after Gen. George Patton's Third Army swept victoriously through the birthplace of Germany's shortlived Republic. I didn't get to meet Frau Kech. She wasn't there. But I did get to meet scores of prisoners who remembered her with curses. And I got to see her husband, former nuler of the camp. He was in a small jar. The Nazi authorities placed him there after cremating him for a bad habit he developed of stealing party funds.

Shakes The Ashes One prisoner, a former major general who had commanded the royal palace guard in Vienna when the Nazis moved into the Austrian capital picked up the jar of ashes and shook them in weak merri-

"It's nice that we have Herr Koch always with us," he said. "But Frau Koch should be here in another jar also. A wife belongs with her hus-

lise Koch denied during her trial she ever had prisoners killed merely to build up her collection of lampshades made of tattooed human skin. But the men in the camp said she often walked around barewaisted groups of prisoners seeking those with interesting tattoos to add to her collection. And I saw the lampshades of human skin. They weren't antique. She was quite a

He Koch had other interesting diversions too.

She leyed horseback riding. She liked to gellop through the woods adjoining Buchenwald and ride full tilt into groups of prisoner laborers too slow to escape. She never halted to determine the deaths or injuries she inflicted.

Ilse, a full-bodied woman, also enjoyed addressing obscene remarks to the prisoners and luring them into sexual overtures, whereupon she had them flogged for her pleas-

Cruetl, wicked and unpenitent, she managed to get herself with child while still imprisoned—a situation which her American Army captors find hard to explain. Did that help save her from the death penalty?



Thirty Mysterious Characters

They've all gone home now. But for several months during the last session of Congress, some 30 mysterious characters operated under cover in Washington, checking up on government expenses.

They became known as TBI men-Taber's Bureau of Investigation for his economizing "Operation Meat-Ax." Actually, says Rep. John Taber of New York, chairman of the House Appropriations Committee, "It wasn't a meat-ax job. A lot of people don't like the way I operate, but I know what I'm doing. They can't bulldoze

The 30 mysterious characters were recruited for Taber by Carl Herbert of the St. Paul Municipal Research Council. Members of the appropriations committee never knew who they were. They reported to Taber. They were paid, when employed, \$25 a day plus allowances for a maximum of \$33 a day. Total cost of the operation was about \$50,000. McKenney on Bridge

There are many fine card players who never can remember a good hand. Either they find the play of all hands so simple that they do not recognize the more interesting ones, or they just do not bother to remember them. This is not true, however, of Lee Hazen, vice president of the American Contract Bridge League. Lee runs across some very interesting hands and can outline the theory for correct

In today's hand, which is one of Hazen's East's problem was to keep from losing three diamond tricks. He would not have a problem if South held the ace and queen of diamonds; he would' simply lead toward dummy's jack and lose two diamond tricks. But he could not take that situation for granted. Hazen remembered that North had bid two clubs that North had bid two clubs. About the only thing North could



have at least the queen of diamonds, so Hazen proceeded to play the hand against the worst possible

South held the first club trick and shifted to a spade. Hazen winning in his own hand with the jack. He cashed the king of trumps and led over to the ace. South's ten falling. A small club was led from dummy and trumped by cashed and a small spade led to the ace. On the jack of clubs Hazen discarded the five of diamonds and South had to win this trick with the ace. If South returned a club, it would give Hazen a sluff and a ruff. The only thing South could do was to cash the ace of diamonds. Thus Hazen held his losers to three tricks.



Unless rain falls soon, European officials say, near-famine conditions will exist over wide areas again next winter.

This was the situation reported by Associated Press correspondents: Germany-The worst drought in 50 years has damaged all crops. The loss in the potato crop is expected to exceed 25 per cent generally and range to nearly 50 per cent in some sections, agricultural officials say. The sugar beet crop has suffered comparably and pastures and fodder crops are als badly affected.
