





### Russians Seize 30 Metal-Laden Trucks

BERLIN—(P)—The Russians seized 30 German trucks in the last 24 hours in stepped-up raids on metal shipments to and from Western Berlin, U. S. sector police reported Monday.

Western Allied officials indicated their fifth protest in a month is being prepared. Four Western protests already have been delivered against these and other Soviet actions, which have been crippling Berlin's traffic with Western Germany.

British officials said later the Russians released nine of the 30 trucks along with the cargoes of metals. The officials said they had no other details immediately.

Mal. Gen. Alexander Kotikov, the Soviet commandant in Berlin, has attempted to defend the Russian raids on metal shipments by telling the Western Allies, in a recent letter, that Berlin trucks were smuggling metals stolen from Eastern Germany.

### U. S. Assures Tito No Strings Attached To Any American Aid

BELGRADE, YUGOSLAVIA—(P)—U. S. Ambassador George Allen has assured Premier Marshal Tito there will be no political strings attached to any American monetary aid to Yugoslavia.

In a defiant speech Saturday, Tito challenged the U. S. and the West to make good what he called their promises of aid, but declared his country would "rather go barefooted" than sacrifice her Socialist principles in return for help.

"As I pointed out when I presented my credentials," Allen explained in an interview Sunday, "the policy of the United States is strict non-interference in the internal affairs of Yugoslavia. No political conditions were attached to the credits already extended to Yugoslavia and no such conditions are attached to the credits now under consideration."
