BANGKOK —(P)—The medical profession as well as the more enlightened press of Bangkok are aroused by a bill that almost became law in Parliament without anyone seeming to notice a "sleeper" clause. London Bank Turns Down Jerusalem Loan

TEL AVIV, ISRAEL —(P)—The newspaper "Hatzofeh" said Barclays Bank of London has refused to loan \$1,400,000 to the City of Jerusalem "owing to the uncertain political situation in the city."

The city had planned to use the money for new development schemes. The bank did, however, announce its readiness to lend \$280,000 if the loan was guaranteed by the Israeli government.

Tariff Given Blame For Small Olives

DAVIS, CALIF. —(P)—The average olive in California probably will be bigger if the tariff on imported olive oil is cut 50 per cent, as expected. Imported oil would thus be better able to compete with domestic oil, which is usually pressed from olives considered too small for canning.

Size can be increased by thinning part of the growing crop on the trees, reports H. T. Hartmann, University of California pomologist. He says trees with light crops generally produce fairly large fruit, while those with heavy crops yield a high percentage of olives too small for canning.

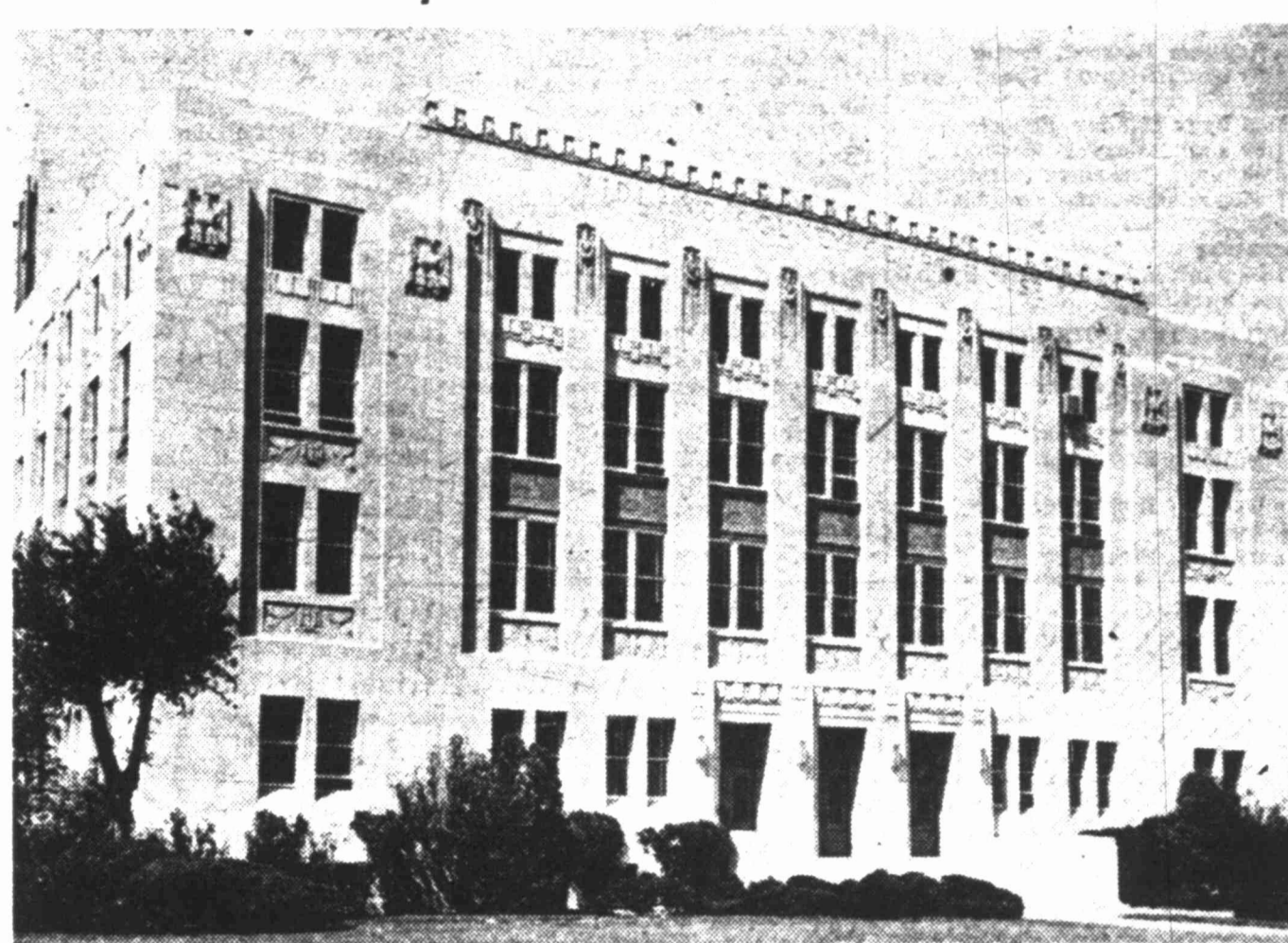

Pasteurized Milk Safer Than Certified; Has Fewer Vitamins

Cows' milk is one of the best foods for human consumption. Such questions as the following are, therefore, highly intelligent: Q—I use certified raw milk and wondered if I were taking a risk of exposing my family to diseases like undulant fever and tuberculosis. I have been led to believe that heat-

ing milk by pasteurization destroys much of the food value. A—Certified milk comes from cows which have been inspected carefully for disease and which has been collected, bottled, and distributed with the greatest possible care. Assuming that the inspection services have been good and are carried out frequently enough, such milk must be considered as relatively safe. Heating milk as is

done in pasteurization does not destroy much of the food value nor does it change the taste very much. It does kill germs which may be present and it does decrease the vitamin content slightly. From the safety standpoint pasteurized milk is better; from the taste standpoint and vitamin content, certified milk is the superior.

Q—I have bronchial asthma and I am using ultra-violet blood irradiation for treatment. What do you think of this? A—This method of treatment has been used for a long time but has not been considered favorably by most of those who have studied it impartially. Q—Will leukoplakia in the mouth cause cancer? A—If leukoplakia of the mouth is long-continued, cancer often develops at the same point. Would you please tell me if beer and tobacco are harmful to the heart and kidneys? A—Beer places an extra burden on the kidneys and because of the extra pumping involved, on the heart as well. There is a doubt as to the direct effect of tobacco on the heart, but I do not know of any reason why it should be considered harmful to the kidneys. Q—Is it true that the continual use of hair dye will cause one's hair to thin or fall off? A—Most effective hair dyes contain chemicals to which a few people are sensitive even though most are not. It is therefore possible that a hair dye would cause loss of hair in a person who was sensitive to one of the chemical ingredients. Q—What are the chances for a person with a dilated stomach to live a long and normal life? A—They are good. The stomach is an elastic organ and if the cause of the dilation can be discovered and corrected, it should have no effect on expectation of life. Q—Is mineral oil taken for a spastic colon harmful? A—Mineral oil is not generally advised for a spastic colon. It may make the condition worse and there are reasons to believe that it interferes with the absorption of certain vitamins. 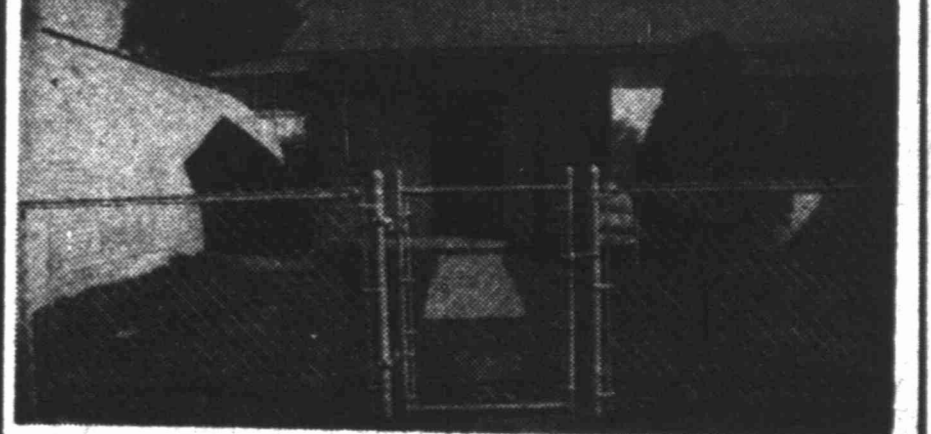
