









### Touch Of Autumn Chills Midwest

CHICAGO —(AP)— There was a touch of Autumn in the air over the Midwest Friday, with refreshing weather in parts of Michigan and Wisconsin.

A flow of cool Canadian air dipped temperatures to unseasonably low readings over the Great Lakes region. The mercury dipped to 33—one degree above freezing—at Grand Marais, Mich. It was near that mark at Land o'Lakes and Grantsburg, Wis., and several degrees below normal over other Midwest areas. The cool air moved east and south into the Ohio Valley from Northern Illinois and Northern Indiana.

Readings over other parts of the country were near seasonal levels. Hot weather continued in the Gulf States and in the far Southwest.

### Plenty Of Shaving Cream But Too Few Guns, Tanks

WITH U. S. TROOPS IN KOREA  
—(AP)—One of the tragedies of the Korean war is that America has been able to supply its outnumbered troops with many of the comforts of home—but as yet hasn't delivered enough men or tools to win victory.

They are on the way—but many an American front-line doughboy unit gladly would give up its occasional ration of beer for a few more fresh soldiers or slugging Patton tanks.

"It wasn't this way in the last war," is a typical front-line comment.

The fact there are stacks of tooth brushes and razor blades here but very few modern tanks shows two things about the American soldier and the nation behind him:

1. The soldier likes the comforts and conveniences of peace in wartime so far as they are possible.

and his country likes to give them to him.

2. The United States has been in a better position to make its candy bars in mass production. Tanks haven't been mass-produced.

**Guns, Rice Vs. Hair Tonic**

The enemy has gambled on guns and rice rather than on chewing gum and hair tonic. And it is men, guns and rice they have.

"We should have insisted that both sides fight this war with tubes of brushless shaving cream," belly-ached one American tankman.

"Then we could have smothered them from the start. It would take them years to catch up with the edge we got in shaving cream."

This whole situation points up the major difference between GI Joe and the North Korean fighting man. The American fights on a tradition he will have plenty of everything. The North Korean doesn't. He never has known plenty. He has concentrated on the bare essentials of battle.

### Anti-Administration Forces Offer First Anti-Subversive Bill

WASHINGTON —(AP)— Senators Mundt (R-SD) and Ferguson (R-Mich) joined forces with Senator McCarran (D-Nev) Friday in a contest with Administration leaders to sponsor a proposed crackdown on Communists and subversives.

McCarran beat the Administration to the gun Thursday by offering in the Senate a catch-all internal security bill he said carries out the recommendations of President Truman made in a message to Congress Tuesday for tighter controls over foreign-trained saboteurs and spies.

Senator Lucas of Illinois, the Democratic leader, made it clear, however, that McCarran's offering isn't the Administration's bill. He said that one will be introduced soon.

### Father Shrugs Off Broadcast Quoting Captured GI Son

BAYTOWN, TEXAS —(AP)— Reuben K. Kimball, Sr., of Baytown says a Communist broadcast quoting his son as criticizing U. S. Air Force tactics in Korea is "mere Red propaganda."

The broadcast reported from London Thursday night said Pvt. C. Kimball, Jr., of Baytown now is a prisoner of war in Seoul.

The Texan's name is Reuben K. Kimball, Jr. It was not explained how the Reds mixed up his name. The father had no doubt it was his son.

The father said he had not been notified by the Department of Defense that his son was missing in action or captured.

If his son is captured, the father believes the Korean Reds merely are using his name in passing out propaganda.

"I have heard of that dodge before," the senior Kimball said. "It was a common practice in World War II and the Koreans just cut theirs to the same pattern."

**Captured July 26**

The Communist broadcast said young Kimball and an International News Service correspondent, Philip Deane, were captured July 26 after Deane had been wounded by machine gun fire.

There was no way to ascertain whether Kimball actually made the statements attributed to him or whether he was subjected to duress.

Kimball reportedly told his U. S. planes strafed six American prisoners of war walking along a road, killing three.

Kimball further was quoted as saying American pilots had orders that "anything that's moving—stop it; anything that's stopped—move it."

"I guess the Air Force is just trigger happy," the account added.

### German Industrial Plant Dismantling To End In October

FRANKFURT, GERMANY —(AP)— Western Allied authorities said Friday the dismantling of German industry will be completed by October 1 except for one plant.

This coincided with authoritative reports that America, Britain and France are considering the industrial rearmament of the Germans to bulwark the Western defense system.

Occupation officials said there has been no slackening of dismantling since the Korean war erupted. However, the tense international situation has forced consideration of the role German industry could play as a producer of West European armament.

Thus while one group of Allied officials is pushing dismantling to a conclusion, another group is exploring ways to use German industry to shore up Western Europe against the Communist threat.

Allied officials said the dismantling program is so nearly complete a stoppage now would have no effect on West Germany's industrial potential.

**Steel Capacity Slashed**

It is in steel, the sinew of war, that Allied dismantling has been felt most sharply by the Germans.

Allied officials said about 6,000,000 tons of steel capacity has been lost to the Germans through dismantling. A capacity of about 14,500,000 tons has been allowed to remain, but production is limited to 11,100,000 tons a year.

Allied experts in Germany now are discussing removal of the present limit on German steel production to help European rearmament and to stimulate economic recovery.

Dismantling has slashed West German aluminum capacity and cut out entirely many of the critical items necessary for war production. Aluminum plants now are producing at about one-sixth of capacity, officials said.

The dismantling of synthetic rubber plants, the rubber industry has surpassed its 1936 production by nine per cent. The chemical industry is now operating at 114 per cent of the 1936 rate although many chemical plants also were dismantled.

### Crane To Get Dial Telephone System

CRANE—A go-ahead sign was given to the Southwestern Bell Telephone Company to install a system of dial telephones in Crane before 1952 at a recent meeting of the city council.

The council approved an ordinance raising monthly telephone rates to the figure set by the company for dial system subscribers. The vote was three to two for passage.

LONDON —(AP)— Scotland Yard disclosed Friday it has recovered a portfolio of secret atomic research papers stolen from an official of the British Ministry of Supply three days ago.

A man arrested at Folkestone has been brought to London for questioning. His identity was not made public.

A suitcase containing the papers vanished Tuesday from the luggage of Frank M. Greenless, who works for the Supply Ministry's research laboratory at Risley.

The first semester, which opens September 5, will close January 19. Holidays during that time include Armistice Day, November 11; Thanksgiving holidays, November 23 and 24, and the Christmas holidays, December 23 to January 1.

The second semester will open January 22 and run until May 31. Holidays in the second semester include census day, March 1, and the Easter holidays, March 23 to 26.
