# Thanksgiving Day, 1950

The year 1950 brought us a war we never dreamed of in a place called Korea of which we knew little. It brought death and pain and new taxes and chafing controls—and the promise of more.

It has seen no lessening of the Communist threat which hangs over the free world. Rather has that menace grown, despite tremendous efforts on our part to reduce it. And so we find ourselves getting a bigger Army and Navy and Air Force, though "peace" has been the order of the day for a mere five years since World War II.

All the world seems beset by strife and strain. There is almost no quiet corner any more. Far-off Tibet, land of lost horizons, has tumbled off its high pedestal into the turbulent news of the day. What's next? Bali? Switzerland? Little America?

Yet it wouldn't be right to say we have nothing to be grateful for on this new Thanksgiving Day. We have much to be glad about.

Of course, our bountiful crops and thriving industry which together are lifting us to a plane of living we've never before enjoyed. Our nagging anxiety over, what's in store for us tomorrow can't wholly mar the basic material satisfactions an unmatched prosperity is bringing us.

But beyond all this we can be happy that liberty is still a word with meaning for us as individuals. All the turmoil and anguish of the times have not yet robbed us of that freedom which is our greatest hope for fulfillment.



Anyway, an emergency committee on excise taxes was formed then. Such taxes were said to be hurting business. Congress was sold on the idea, and was all ready to repeal many of these excise taxes when along came the Korean war. The committee of business leaders agitating for repeal of such taxes promptly advised Congress to forget it. So the taxes stayed on.

Anti-Tax Men Get Busy Later in the Summer, at the end of the regular session of Congress, when it became apparent that the Truman administration wanted a wartime excess profits tax slapped on, leaders of the old anti-excise tax committee began to get busy.

They held a little luncheon meeting in New York on October 19. Eleven days later they held a bigger meeting. Out of it was born this Business Committee on Emergency Corporate Taxation.

The argument of the committee is that it doesn't care how much the government says it has to raise by taxes on business. The government can name its own figure. 


