Troubled Kashmir Has New Violence Outbreak

Twenty-three Indian policemen are missing after a new outbreak of violence between Pakistan and India in the troubled state of Kashmir.

The Indian Defense Ministry lodged a protest with U.N. observers, charging that troops from the Pakistani sector of Kashmir crossed the cease-fire line dividing the Himalayan state and attacked the Indian patrol Friday. Indian officials were able to account for only one member of the patrol.

AMBUSH The ambush occurred near Keran, about 70 miles west of Srinagar, Kashmir's summer capital, the ministry said. Paki-stani troops crossed the ceasefire line along the Krishen Ganga River and fired on the patrol while other Pakistanis opened a barrage from the opposite bank, the ministry said.

A spokesman for Prime Minister Nehru's Congress party said Pakistan may have deliberately staged the ambush to impress Communist Chinese Premier Chou En-lai, currently visiting Pakistan.





Just Who Is A 'Witness?'

Defense attorneys for Jack Ruby, charged with the Nov. 24, 1963, murder of Lee Harvey Oswald, have raised a question which may haunt this case until the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals or the Supreme Court of the United States makes a final ruling on it. The question is this: Can a witness serve as a juror?

The defense contends that any person who saw Oswald being shot is disqualified as a juror because he was a witness to the crime. Tens of thousands of Dallas County residents saw the original television sequence in which Oswald was shot, or saw later reruns of that sequence. An estimated 50 million television viewers throughout the nation also saw that incident.

District Judge Joe B. Brown rejected the defense argument, ruling in effect that television "witnesses" to the shooting were qualified jurors if they satisfied other requirements for jury service. But this is not the end of the matter by any means.

The defense is reported to be relying on Art. 619 of the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, which states: "No juror shall be impaneled when it appears that he is subject to the third, fourth or fifth clause of challenge in Art. 616, though both parties may consent.

The third clause of Art. 616 (concerning "challenge for cause") bars service of anyone convicted of any

felony. The fourth clause disqualifies anyone who is under indictment and the fifth clause disqualifies any insane person from jury service. Neither of these clauses appear to bear on the subject of disqualifying a witness. But Sec. 13 of Art. 616 does include this sentence which may have pertinence: "If it (a prospective juror's 'opinion' as to the guilt or innocence of the accused) appears to have been formed from reading newspaper accounts, communications, statements or reports, or mere rumor or hear-. ." then the juror is qualified if he says that he can set aside that opinion and be governed solely by the law and the evidence. This raises the crucial question: Can someone who saw a murder being committed really set aside an opinion he forms from

In the normal, sense a "witness" is one who was present at or near the scene of a crime and sees its commission or something relevant to the commission of that crime. But there is nothing in the law which applies specifically to the Ruby case on this point. The laws on the subject were written long before television came of

Should a higher court hold that television witnesses of the murder of Oswald cannot properly serve as jurors in the case. In that event, it taxes the imagination as to where the case might be transferred.

This and that: Ever wonder how man developed his language?

Dr. Ashley Montagu, a well-known anthropologist, says humans learned to talk only when they became hunters of big game. In the beginning, he adds, men were dumb beasts, just like all other animals.

IN RUNNING and the excitement of the chase, according to Dr. Montagu, "there would be a strong tendency toward violent expulsion of air, which could readily be converted into a meaningful cry or yell. All that is necessary is the repetition and imitation of such sounds for them to become established as words. In this manner a simple vocabulary would come into being. This could then serve as a basis for further develop-

IN THE HYPOTHESIS advanced by Dr. Montagu, language probably came into formal existence when two or more individuals began to attach the same meaning to the same sounds.

When the progenitors of man were forced to take up hunting as a way of life due to deforestation, the ability to communicate by sound with fellow hunters would have had great

selective advantages. So says Dr. Montagu.

WHO IS MENTALLY healthy? Someone once said over 90 per cent of us needed psychiatric treatment at one time or another. A top-ranking psychiatrist says the mentally healthy fits these six attributes:

(1) He accepts his assets and liabilities, without conceit for his abilities and without shame for his short-

(2) He knows who he is. He does not seek reflections of himself from other people to find himself and tell him what to do and how to act.

(3) HE IS motivated in his own growth, in becoming what he can, in reaching his upper potentialities. (4) He is able to integrate the different parts of his personality to each other. He has a tolerance of his own frustrations. And he's able to delay immediate satisfactions for future

(5) He has a degree of autonomy. He does not have to distort the facts of his life, nor need to create stories about himself.

(6) He has mastered his environment. He has learned to work, play and love. He is adequate to face any situation.

Johnson Faces Up To Castro

the early baseball season when the most redoubtable sluggers, as the saying goes, "can't buy a base hit." It was this kind of a springtime slump that afflicted President Johnson in his foreign affairs up to the moment when Castro turned off the water supply for the U. S. Navy Base at Guantanamo Bay in Cuba. Johnson swung hard on this seemingly minor crisis, whacking a clean hit, which could well mean that he's broken the slump.

TO BELIEVE in this happy omen, we must remember what kind of a player Johnson is, and must consider his background. At no time during his period of inability to hit the international pitches was Johnson missing any plays in the domestic area. A past master at politics and parliamentarianism, he scored in December by cramming the Foreign Aid bill through a fagged Congress. He repeated in January by whipping the tax bill past the Senate and the Civil Rights bill through the House. If he applied the "Texas twist" to many reluctant arms, that is a standard procedure. He developed this tactic nto a high political art while making his name as the most effective Senate Majority Leader in anybody's memory, and perhaps in anybody's history book.

BUT DOES the "Texas twist," a combination of bloodless power plays and wheeler-dealer persuasion, lend itself to international affairs? These have long been conducted by doing what resembles a slow waltz danced on a floor that has been sanded with gunpowder. Well, a new start has been made. It

took place in a White House huddle where some of Johnson's non-diplomatic aides were charged with thinking up schemes to make Castro rue the day he had challenged LBJ. Out of this skull-session, very reminiscent of those on Capital Hill in the 1950's, came the two arm-twisters that were clapped upon Castro:

1. ANTICIPATING that Castro himself would follow the water cut-off by forbidding the 3,000 Cuban workers to continue their jobs on the Navy base, Johnson beat Fidel to the punch. All the off-base workers are being replaced, thereby cutting off a dollar flow to Castro and loading him with the blame for disemployment. 2. To make the Guantanamo Base

self - sufficient in water, Johnson pulled off a highly imaginative, far-reaching play that far surpassed the clumsy, non-productive, bureaucraticminded scheme of physically hauling water from the Florida Everglades. He ordered that the huge, \$1.6 million desalting plant in San Diego, Calif., be dismantled, carried in a 15-week trek through the Panama Canal and re-established at Guantanamo.

> As background, it needs to be noted that the national program on desalination of salt and brakish water, and the San Diego desalting plant itself, came into existence by grace of some typical wheeler-dealer politics. Senator Clinton Anderson is co-author of the Water Resources resolution, which originally proposed five desalting plants, one on the Atlantic coast, one on the Pacific coast, and three in the country's interior. Anderson told the tale a couple of years ago in a jocular speech at the Interior Depart-

"I KNOW I CAN tell the story in complete privacy-and not a soul will mention it outside this room-but we had a little difficulty with that resolution . . . I went to see the then-Majority Leader, now the Vice President, and complained . . . He said: Tell me more about those coasts . . . You know, they have one that is known as the Gulf coast, too." Anderson modified the resolution to

include a desalting plant at Freeport, Texas, on the Gulf. The resolution zipped through the Senate. Johnson then took Anderson for a private talk with the late Speaker Rayburn (D., Tex.), and the resolution zipped through the House. Naturally, it was Lyndon Johnson, then Vice President, who, in due time, dedicated the Texas plant at Freeport. WITHOUT JOHNSON'S long and

well-documented concern with domestic water problems, without his chummy way of logrolling legislation with a shrewd eye to his own political interests, we might not have a desalting plant which we could move to Cuba

And without Johnson's political instinct for the opportune power play, we would not now be on the edge of a new kind of diplomacy. It is not delicate and not traditional, but it has the promise of broad, practical, robustous, sagacious action-a change, at least, that refreshes.

Seek Samples Of Pollution

LAMESA (SC)—The Dawson County Water Pollution Control Association has issued an appeal to farmers in the area for samples of known or suspected polluted water.

The samples will be analyzed and results recorded for use March 4 when the association takes its request for a no-pit or-der before the Texas Water Pollution Control Board in Austin.

Both Dawson and Terry counties will be represented at the hearing by Ed L. Reed, Midland hydrologist, and George W. Mc-Cleskey, Lubbock attorney.

Skeet Noret, chairman of the Dawson organization, has urged all farmers who have or suspect they have polluted water to catch samples immediately. To insure an accurate analy-

sis, pumps should be run 10-15 minutes prior to sampling. Water should be placed in a small jar, labeled with a description of the land from which it is taken and sealed. Reed will analyze the sam-

ples at no charge to the farmer. All samples must be turned in to the Chamber of Commerce office here by noon on Feb. 28. The organization is spearheading a local movement to obtain an order from the state board

banning the use of brine pits by oil operators. Both the oil industry and the Dawson-Terry units will be heard at the hearing.





Journalist Dies Saturday

OAKLAND, Calif. (AP)-Harold Turnblad, whose careful work and calculating courage scored a news beat on the world when Wiley Post and Will Rogers flew to death, died Saturday. He was 63.

Turnblad was working for The Associated Press in Seattle in 1935 when humorist Rogers and aviator Post took the singleengined plane northward.

Turnblad kept a meticulous chart of the flight with all reported landings and takeoffs recorded. When a gap suddenly appeared. He made a rapid check and discovered the plane had crashed after taking off from Point Barrow, Alaska.

Moving swiftly, Turnblad contacted a missionary who had taken a roll of photographs showing the inverted airplane in the water and witnesses at the scene. Turnblad bought the roll sight unseen, for \$1,500.

The photographs, clear and usable, were sent out over the hen-infant Associated Press Wirephoto network.

Turnblad worked for The Associated Press from 1923 to 1939 in Spokane, Olympia and Seattle and Washington, and was chief of bureau in San Francisco from 1939 to 1956. He was editor of the San Ma-

teo Times from 1956 to 1959, and then joined the staff of the Oakland Tribune as assistant man aging editor. In June of that year he be-

came acting managing editor of the Tribune until he was forced to leave the newspaper in No-vember with the brain tumor that caused his death.

Second Trial In Second Week

HOUSTON (AP)-The second trial of Carolyn Ann Lima, 21, charged with the torch and gun slaying three years ago of Fred Tones, 41, entered its second week today.

Her former lover, Leslie Douglas Ashley, 26, will be tried later.
