Tedious Problem

Commissioners are engaged in a ticklish task of revamping some voting precincts, a problem confounded by justice precincts and state laws regarding exemptees outside of cor-

This may tax patience and call for the wisdom of Solomon, for voting boxes may not straddle justice precinct lines any more than they can straddle commissioner precinct lines. Moreover, voting boxes can no longer include territory outside of Big Spring if the box is to be inside the corporate limits of Big Spring (because the city obviously comes under the category of a city over 10,000.

Those residing outside such cities do not have to have their exemption certificates.)

The matter is not insoluble, and perhaps this week the court will have a decision. Sooner or later, another problem is going to face the court, namely bringing the commissioner precinct lines more nearly into a population balance. Our court has recognized the general equity of this in the past, but recent Supreme Court decisions requiring representation on a purely population basis means than this ultimately will apply to commissioner precincts, too.

What we have in mind is the sloppy handling of a car that comes from simple failure to stay alert and keep an eve out for the other fellow.

Sometimes carelessness is a momentary thing; sometimes it grows prime accident cause.

Holmes Alexander The 'Hate America' Campaign

the Warren Commission, Chairman Edwin Willis (D., La.), of the House Un-American Activities Committee, has indicated that Lee Harvey Oswald is a product of a well-established "Hate America" campaign by which the Communists have made many other disciples among immature and emotionally-unstrung Americans.

SUPPOSE THAT Oswald had escaped detection and capture. How better could he have served the Communist cause than by letting loose in America the wave of "hate" (as, indeed, he did for a few hours) against the millions of innocent conservatives? They are the nation's toughest anti-Communists.

The Oswald case, as Willis puts it in prospective, not only deals with presidential murder. It deals with the murder motivation.

WILLIS TELLS of a recent scene on an American college campus where about 350 persons, mostly students, gathered to watch a Communist propaganda film. There was "loud applause," according to the press coverage, when Red Chinese Mao Tsetung embraced a Viet Cong leader. But when a student rose and shouted, "Let's have a round of applause for the Americans fighting and dying in Viet Nam," only some 15 of the 350 present responded.

HOW CAN such things be? The ringleaders of the meeting, or so it appeared, were a cadre from the 250 defiant persons who have visited Cuba since 1961 without valid passports. In Castroland, they received the same Communist indoctrination that Oswald received in Moscow and elsewhere. They became part of the assault wave which carries on the 'Hate America' teachings and examples in this country and abroad. Many of the visitors to Cuba came home to become Communist instigators in the race demonstrations of 1963-64. As Willis writes:

"The Communists' constant 'Hate America' barrage results in more than 'Yankee Go Home' signs in foreign lands . . . At home it results in certain of our own citizens defying our laws, stealing our secrets and engaging in other traitorous activi-

THE "HATE AMERICA" campaign -and Willis comes close to pinpointing it as a murder motivation-can be countered by tough law enforcement and tough legislation. Of the 250 travelers-sans-passports to Castro's Cuba (and 80-odd additional ones are said to be there today), only six have been indicted. The Justice Department seems singularly uninterested. But

Vacationing At Red River

One of the coming resort areas in this part of the world is Red River, N. M .- I use the word "coming" although many Big Spring people dis-covered the delightful little town years ago and have since been visiting t regularly.

More than a third again higher above sea level than the city of Denver, Red River itself is situated in a valley between towering cliffs of the Sangre De Christo range.

RED RIVER, created initially to attract the fisherman, is now catering to all vacationers, offering to its many visitors such things as horseback riding, community dancing, rides on ski lifts and the chance to explore woodland trails and mountain

The town has taken on the appearance of a 19th century western boom town because of its many wooden buildings but the exterior of such structures are, more likely than not, deceptive. Most of its motels are comfortably furnished and practically all are equipped with kitchens as well as bedroom facilities and bath.

RED RIVER has the usual amount of curio shops and stores specializing in the sale of western toggery. It also has a branch office of a bank, a post office and numerous restaurants.

The village consists in the main of two streets. The steady clop-clop of horses trudging up and down those thoroughfares during daylight hours reminds one of an old Civil War

SBIC's Lesson: Lemons With Pearls This could be a pre-mortem of a small business investment company. It's a sentimental saga of a noble

venture poised between liquidation, rebirth, or assimilation. Science Capital Corp., of Philadelphia, was organized in the world-isour-oyster days before the break in apparent who he's going to be. the stock market in 1962 and the super-break in over-the-counter shares.

FIVE HUNDRED thousand shares of stock were sold at \$8 per share, of which the underwriters received 80 cents. Thus did Science Capital bravely start with \$3,600,000 and a plan. Paul D. Hurwitz, its president and an engineer, hoped to invest in young, vibrant companies, headed by imaginative, venturesome men wise in the ways of computers, automation

and modern electronics. Sure, he'd pick some losers - companies which couldn't find a market for their products or ideas. But if he presidential candidate for "a could also "spring" some fledglings from the hatching coop, he and Science Capital stockholders would more than offset small write - offs

with big winnings. THE ANNUAL REPORT of Science Capital, just issued, establishes that business, as in nature, lemons mature more rapidly than pearls.

Of ten commitments, only five are still listed at book (purchase) value. Two companies have failed, several have "experienced difficulties in establishing profitable operations."
Only three have made "excellent progress."

to the records of the Small Business Administration. But some are betwixt and between - like Science Capital - thus raising a basic question: What was the original purpose of the Small Business Investment Act, as passed by Congress in 1958?

One interpretation is that the SBIC takes the place of the old-fashioned investment banker or venture capitalist, who financed an inventor or an entrepreneur with an idea. Then, when the venture succeeded, he would take the company, the stock, to market and make enough profit to offset three, four or five bad ven-

ANOTHER interpretation is that an SBIC should invest only in very small companies in which SBIC officers can be participating managers - close overseers. Advances would be secured by tangible assets. In short, the SBIC would be a quasi - banker, making loans that banks don't make and receiving as a kicker stocks or warrants to buy stock.

Hurwitz's recent letter to Science Capital stockholders probably reflects what other SBIC officers and directors are doing, if not saying: "Our directors are now considering various plans for the future of the company, including negotiations for the sale of our assets."

MEANWHILE, Science Capital stock is quoted at \$3 a share against a book value of \$4.41. Inference: Wall Street is not optimistic that Hurwitz's pearls will mature with such brilliance as to make up for the lemons or that the company can be revitalized to

David Lawrence New York Or Massachusetts?

Kennedy will not have to worry too much about whether he can run in New York state for a seat in the United States' Senate, even if Mayor Robert Wagner withholds his support at the New York state convention next month. For the Attorney General could run in Massachusetts if he so desired. This is because his brother, Senator Ted Kennedy, who is recuperating from a plane accident, might be willing to step aside for him. The UPI last week, in a dispatch from Boston, said:

"ASKED WHETHER his brother's condition would have any bearing on his political plans, Robert Kennedy said: 'I think it will be clarified when they (the hospital physicians) put out their announcement."

The election this autumn for U. S.

senator in Massachusetts is for a sixyear term, as Teddy Kennedy is serving the unexpired Senate term of his brother, the late John F. Kennedy. It has been an open question whether Senator Ted Kennedy-who was elected in 1962-will be able to participate in his own campaign. Certainly it would be easier for Attorney General Kennedy to win a Senate seat from Massachusetts than it would be for him to defeat Senator Kenneth Keating in New York state. So everything depends on how Teddy Kennedy is feeling, and whether he would be willing to give up his chance for re-election to the Senate now and try again at a later date, as he is today only 32 years old, while Bobby is approaching his 39th birthday.

IN MASSACHUSETTS, moreover, the naming of Democratic candidates is done by a state convention which the Kennedy forces pretty well con-trol, and there would be no doubt about the willingness of leaders there to name the Attorney General, whereas New York state might present some difficulties. Several of the local Democratic leaders already are voicing opposition to the nomination of someone who hasn't been a long-time resident of the state.

One reason perhaps for Mayor Wagner's hesitancy to throw his support

WASHINGTON - Maybe Bobby to the Attorney General is that a considerable measure of control of the Democratic party in New York state is at present in the mayor's hands, whereas if Bobby Kennedy became senator, the latter would have quite an influence in New York state politics and would share the party lead-

ership with Mr. Wagner. THE REPUBLICANS also would have a real dilemma on their hands if Bobby Kennedy gets the nomination from the New York state convention. Senator Keating already faces opposition from the Conservative party, and there is talk that Mrs. Clare Boothe Luce may run on that ticket. Also, Mr. Keating hasn't announced yet whether or not he will support Senator Goldwater, the Republican presidential nominee.

If the Attorney General entered the contest as the Democratic nominee, it would appear that the Republicans would have to forget their current differences and unite to prevent Bobby Kennedy from becoming senator from New York.

SO IF THE Attorney General really wants to be sure of a seat in the United States Senate and can persuade his younger brother to step aside, he can avoid a risky battle in New York state and at the same time get a chance to represent his native state-which he previously has listed as his legal residence.
