

Trial Delays In 2 Alabama **Deaths Sought**

HAYNEVILLE, Ala. (AP) — State Atty. Gen. Richmond Flowers planned to ask a state court judge today to postpone the separate trials of two white men accused of slaying two civil rights volunteers in this central Alabama county.

Meanwhile, federal court action on the same matter-but for different reasons - loomed as a strong possibility if Flow-

ers did not gain his objective. Flowers was scheduled to ap pear before Circuit Court Judge T. Werth Thagard to reques postponement of the trials this week of Thomas L. Coleman, 55, and a Birmingham area Ku Klux Klansman, Collie Leroy Wilkins Jr., 21.

ALLEGED BIAS Later, a three-judge federal panel in Montgomery was to hear requests filed by the American Civil Liberties Union that these two trials, and all others in which defendants face juries, be postponed because of alleged racial discrimination in

selecting of jury rolls. Coleman is scheduled for trial here Tuesday and Wilkins on Wednesday. Defense attorneys for both men said they wanted immediate trials with no de-

The attorney general originally had intended to ask only for a continuance in the trial of Coleman, part - time deputy sheriff and member of a promi nent Lowndes County family Coleman is charged with man slaughter in the shotgun slaying in August of Jonathan Daniels 27, an Episcopal seminary stu-dent from Kenne, N.H.

GUNNED DOWN Daniels was gunned down in front of a grocery store here shortly after his release from jail where he served six days for participation in demonstrations at nearby Fort Deposit.

Flowers, angered by failure of the Lowndes County grand jury to return a murder indictment against Coleman, vowed he'd seek a postponement of the trial. This would enable him to ask another grand jury later for a murder indictment.

But in U.S. district court in Montgomery on Friday, the ACLU filed an amended complaint asking for an injunction which would bar the trials of Coleman and Wilkins and any others whose fate is up to a

jury.
The ACLU charged that Negroes are systematically ex-cluded from jury rolls in Lowndes County.

BOTH TRIALS Flowers stated then that he would ask for delays in both

Wilkins, a mechanic from Fairfield, Ala., is one of three Klansmen charged with first-degree murder in the slaying last March on US 80 of Mrs. Viola Liuzzo of Detroit. Mrs. Liuzzo was shot to death as she drove a Negro youth from Sel-ma to Montgomery.





Challenging Task

Gov. John Connally gave the new College Coordinating Board a difficult but indispensable charge of truly statewide responsibility.

If the board is to do the vital job for which it was created, he said, its members must put aside any institutional or area loyalties and make their decisions strictly on the basis of what is best for the state's system of higher education as a whole.

The board's unprecedented powers for shaping that system of the future made it imperative that it follow the governor's admonition. It would be disastrous if the board should become involved in institutional rivalries and area politics, in logrolling and tradeouts, in its decisions on college

and university programs.

Certainly, the board can expect to be subjected to institutional pressures and area lobbying. Withstanding that to make impartial judgments regard-ing the programs of 22 state-support-ed colleges and universities and 32 state-aided junior colleges will require the new board members to rise to what Chairman John Gray of Beaumont aptly defined as "educational

Gov. Connally went so far as to advise any coordinating board member to resign if any institutional or local loyalty should come into conflict with statewide responsibility. That is a high standard to set, but we are convinced it is an essential one.

Costly Palaver

Rep. James D. Martin of Alabama is acting as if he has suddenly discovered the promised land. The fact that he is a freshman member of the House of Representatives may account for it.

Martin must have just learned that his weekly letter to constituents can be published in the Congressional Record. This accounts for four representative entries in the Congressional Record for Sept. 7 and four on Sept. Each is a reproduction of a Martin newsletter. The only thing wrong with them is that they are somewhat dated.

Readers are likely to be surprised when they read a total of six columns,

or two full pages of the Record at an estimated cost of \$85 a page devoted to Martin's columns for March 4, 11, 18 and 25, appearing in the Record for Sept. 7, and slightly more than two pages covering newsletters of April 1, 6, 8, and 22, appearing in

the Record for Sept. 8.

At that rate Martin should be able to publish all his back newsletters before Congress adjourns. He's a Republican, hitherto a rare bird in office in Alabama. He may feel the necessity for filling in his constituents on all his thoughts before the next election. At any rate, want them or not, his people are getting his thoughts through the Congressional Record.

pulsory unionization involves a violation of civil rights and runs contrary to the basic principles of individual freedom in a democracy.

The entire labor-management situation will be thoroughly explored in the Senate, not only on the issue of compulsory unionization but with respect to the many cases of fraud that have been uncovered in connection with the securing of a union majority

THE NATIONAL Labor Relations Board will be under fire, too. It has, for instance, compelled an employer to recognize a union without a secret election in case after case where union organizers have intimidated individual workers and forced them to sign cards declaring that they are willing to join a union.

The National Labor Relations Board itself has been accused of operating as an adjunct of the labor unions. The situation has gone to such an extreme that Congressman Robert P. Griffin, Republican of Michigan, coauthor of the Landrum-Griffin labor law, has introduced a bill to abolish the National Labor Relations Board and establish in its place a 15-man labor court. This would be similar to the U.S. Tax Court.

THE MAIN ISSUE, however, is whether the individual in America is to have the right to work or whether he is to be given the privilege only with the consent of a labor union.

One of the big arguments made by the labor unions is that the employes in a plant or shop who are not members of the union get the benefit of the negotiations conducted by the union and hence are "free riders. So the contention is that they should be required to join and pay dues to

JUST A FEW days ago, Henry C. Newton, director of information of the National Right-to-Work Committee wrote a spoofing letter to the Washington Evening Star relating an imaginary conversation between Hubert Humphrey and President John-son. The Vice President was quoted as having said to the President:

"I can't tell you how delighted I am at the prospect of striking down the right to work laws. But I believe there are some very important principles here that we've overlooked. For example, we're against free-riders, and that's good. But the scabs and loafers who won't join the union aren't the only free-riders around . . .

"I MEAN the Republicans, the in-dependents, all those who aren't Dem-ocrats—they're all free-riders on the good works and good government of the Democratic party . . .

"Most people don't do a thing to keep the Democratic party in office. And so, I propose dues-paying membership in the Democratic party as a condition of citizenship. Too many people are not doing a thing to advance the great society. Now a majority of the people are for us; and as long as we Democrats must bear the burdens of office, and, particularly, as long as Democrats in office are forced to represent all the people, all the peo-ple should support the Democrats— at least with their money."
