"One of the many things I learned in Czechoslovakia was how their cooking really looked and tasted," said Mrs. Mike Skalicky, 609 Settles. "Now I know what my husband meant when he would describe my version of Chech cooking as, "That's nearly it."

Mr. and Mrs. Skalicky have recently returned from Czechoslovakia where they spent the month of September visiting with his father, whom Skalicky had not seen since 1949.



better than most people, cannot agree on the reasons for the unusual economic health of the nation. We are in the midst of the longest peacetime boom in recent history.

The British weekly, The Economist of London, was so intrigued over this sustained period of economic growth that it sent a special emissary here to look at the situation. He expressed his conclusion in the formula: JFK-plus-LBJ-equals-JMK-plus-JKG (John F. Kennedy plus Lyndon B. Johnson equals J. M. Keynes plus John Kenneth Galbraith).

"At least for a time, and in conditions that are inherently favorable. America has discovered the secret of balanced growth," the correspondent reported. ". . . There seems to be an equal rejuvenation in the vigour and purpose of society as a whole, in pursuit not merely of economic enrichment but of social balance. More astounding than the belated acceptance by the American business community of the economics of J. M. Keynes has been its surprisingly early bowing be-fore the politics of J. K. Galbraith."

Economists, who love an argument Galbraith is. On delivering the annual Arthur K. Salamon lecture at New York University's Graduate School of Business Administration, he did not propose that the money-changers be driven out of the temple, only that they be muzzled humanely and effec-

> "There has, one judges, been no harder truth for conservative authority to accept than the logic of low interest rates," he said. "In financial circles no other argument has ever rivaled in inventiveness, and versatility, the case that is made for higher interest rates. They are needed, depending on the season, to prevent inflation, to insure orderly expansion, to discourage excessive expansion, to protect the balance of payments, to strengthen the financial system, to promote sound enterprise. The case for lower rates, alas, arouses no comparable passion. Yet, in recent years, if we had yielded to authoritative opinion on interest rates, we would have been much of the time in a state of semidepression."

Well, that ought to provoke some eloquent and heated dissent. It may take time as well as debate to shed Keynes is no longer with us, but conclusive light on the subject.



In his syndicated column, veteran correspondent Roscoe Drummond raises some questions and some arguments which seem to capsulate the Viet Nam travail. He states these as arguments and answers.

We are in our late teens and we had to get married. Two months ago my husband decided he wants a divorce. He says he never loved me, after saying that he did, and that the baby is not his. I do love my husband, and feel so remorseful about what has happened. I find myself even blaming God. Can you help me? B.D.

Your experience demonstrates what I have long advocated: that sex experience before marriage lessens respect for each other, and too often ends in divorce, with the innocent children as the real victims.

When God says, "Thou shalt not commit immorality," He is not merely giving an arbitrary command; it is not just a whim. The moral law is made for the benefit of the individual, and for the security of the family.

Too often young people, like your-selves, are attracted to each other sexually on the animal level, with the spiritual dimension altogether lacking. Your husband says, "He never loved you," and realizing this, he allowed himself to become sexually involved with you. This is tragic: to use the marriage union, one of the highest relationships which God ordained, for selfish, pleasurable purposes, with no thought of permanency.

Both of you have sinned against God, and more, yourselves. You say you blame God. This is inconsistent because obviously you are in trouble because you ignored His counsel and commands. If both of you repent, a miracle can happen - God can give you love and respect for each other, and make your marriage a success.

FOR THE first time from Saigon, coincidental with Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara's visit, the figure of 300,000 American ground troops was used. The present total is 165,000. 
BUT THE political parallel on the domestic front is closer. From the Republican opposition led by Richard Nixon the demand is rising for bombing the crowded industrial area of Hanoi and the port of Haiphong. That clamor will be louder when Congress returns in January.

THE CLAIM of Gen. Curtis LeMay and others of the big bomber school is for a quick victory and by implication an easy victory. Between the lines the meaning is that all those round troops would be unnecessary if only Communist men and supplies were to be denied. That is nearly identical with the "privileged sanctuary" contention in the Korean War. The advocates of bombing in China across the Yalu River insisted that this would bring the war to a quick and triumphant end. President Truman resisted that demand and was roundly denounced for it.

WASHINGTON-Arthur Schlesinger Schlesinger Jr., discloses that Mr. Kennedy was thinking of removing Secretary of State Rusk because, it is said, the latter followed the advice of the career officers in the Department of State. This is an old criticism and has been heard again and again in many administrations. Foreign service officers who have served a long time and have been face-to-face with many a critical situation often are lambasted because they go back in history and point out the adverse consequences that may flow from hasty or ill-advised decisions.

> THERE IS nothing wrong, generally speaking, with bureaucratic advice in foreign policy. Persons inside the State Department are just as good Americans as those outside the department. Their judgment could be wrong on occasions, but the responsibility for reversing them must be upon persons who have carefully investigated all phases of the controversies that arise. This should not be done by men who have had no training or background in foreign affairs and who have been selected in a hurry by a new President of the United States when he takes of-

TOO MUCH emphasis is placed at the White House nowadays on political advice—as to what will be popular or unpopular-and too little thought is given to the long-range effects of the vital decisions that have to be made.

Some day the errors and mistakes of the present system will come into full view, and the American people will demand a remedy.


