

Male Nurse Draft Slated

WASHINGTON (AP) — For the first time in history the Pentagon is asking for a draft of nurses — 900, all male. Defense officials hold little hope of getting that many.

"We are not optimistic about getting 900," one source said today. Reason: "We doubt there are enough men with qualifications."

The Pentagon said last week it had asked the Selective Service System to provide 700 male nurses for the Army and 200 for the Navy beginning in April. The armed forces have used male nurses in small numbers since 1955.

CASUALTIES UP

The requirements were attributed to increased numbers of casualties in Viet Nam and additional medical care needs resulting from the hike in overall military manpower.

Why men nurses? Because women can't be drafted. The Defense Department also has asked for a draft of 2,496 doctors beginning in July.

One source said the Pentagon has given estimates that as many as 10,000 men in the 18-35 age bracket have received nurse training. But these estimates are discounted largely in view of the national shortage of

medical personnel. "There are no valid statistics in this area and frankly we doubt that we can come up with 900 draftable men who have the two or three years' necessary schooling," the spokesman explained.

OTHER AREAS

Whatever the number actually drafted, most probably will not go to Viet Nam, sources said. The majority will likely be sent to Europe or other areas where U.S. installations have experienced a steady drain of well-qualified, career nurses who have been dispatched to Viet Nam.

Male nurses with three years' training at an approved school can enter the service commissioned as a second lieutenant at annual pay around \$3,200. Men with two years' schooling can get a rank of warrant officer at pay of about \$100 a year less. More than 275 military nurses — men and women — now serve in Viet Nam. The Army has more than 200, the Navy and Air Force nearly 40 each. Of the Army total about 60 are men nurses, but only seven of these are assigned to combat units.

About 20 Air Force male nurses are stationed at various dispensaries throughout Viet Nam.

House Shooting Recalled Today

WASHINGTON (AP) — The sole political survivor of the five "Purple Heart" House members had to be reminded that it was exactly 42 years ago today that he and his colleagues were shot while attending a House session.

"Celebrate what?" replied Rep. George H. Fallon, 64, Maryland Democrat, when asked

if he intended to observe the anniversary of one of the weirdest episodes in congressional history.

"Gee, I had forgotten all about it," Fallon said.

TERRORISTS FIRE

Fallon was shot in the hip when four flag-waving Puerto Rican terrorists shouting, "Freedom for Puerto Rico," leaped from their seats in the House gallery and fired several volleys of bullets at members seated on the House floor beneath the gallery. The House was debating a Mexican labor bill at the time.

Rep. Alvin M. Bentley, R-Mich., was shot in the chest and liver; Rep. Clifford Davis, D-Tenn., was wounded in the leg; Rep. Ben F. Jensen, R-Iowa, was shot in the shoulder; and Rep. Kenneth A. Roberts, D-Ala., was shot in the leg.

For several years, the five victims gathered annually for luncheon on the anniversary. The practice stopped when the vagaries of politics removed four of them from the congressional scene. Bentley was an unsuccessful candidate for the Senate. Davis, Roberts and Jensen lost in bids for re-election to the House.

IN PEKING

Nkrumah was in Peking conferring with Red Chinese leaders when his regime was overthrown last Thursday in a military coup. He left the Communist Chinese capital Monday vowing to crush the army and police who deposed him.

In Accra, Lt. Gen. J.A. Ankrah, president of the National Liberation Council now governing Ghana, told a news conference that if Nkrumah "dares to come back to this country he will be tried for the crimes he has committed."

"LEAVE US ALONE" Ankrah said Ghana's airport was closed to all planes of the Soviet airline Aeroflot "because they carried Nkrumah away." The move apparently was intended to make sure the Soviets do not bring him back.

All four were captured quickly and were convicted in a federal court here on assault charges. They were Lolita Lebron, 34; Rafael Miranda, 25; Andres Figueroa Cordero, 29; and Irving Flores Rodriguez, 28. All were from New York and were members of the Puerto Rican Nationalist party.

STILL IMPRISONED

The woman was sentenced to from 16 to 50 years in prison. Her male accomplices received terms of from 25 to 75 years. They still are behind bars.

The wild attack set off a short-lived crusade for tighter security measures for the House, but nothing substantial came of it. Doormen now check more closely persons who have admission cards for the galleries. The cards must be obtained from members.

Depositions Due In Ashley Hearing

GATESVILLE, Tex. (AP)—Attorneys for Leslie Douglas Ashley said they expect to go home today, but that doesn't mean Ashley's confusing and unpredictable pre-trial hearing will be over.

Depositions must be taken from witnesses in Houston before some defense motions can be ruled on.

A hearing is set March 7 in U. S. District Court in Houston on the defense motion that Ashley should be released because he has not been tried in "a reasonable time."

WITH APPLICATION Overlaying the entire cause is an application for a writ of habeas corpus filed by Ashley attorneys.

The pre-trial hearing before Dist. Judge Truman Roberts entered its fourth day today.

Ashley, 25, is charged with the 1961 sex party slaying of Fred A. Tones, Houston real estate man.

A federal appeals court in March, 1963, reversed death sen-

tences for Ashley and his former girl friend, Carolyn Ann Lima, four hours before they were to die in the electric chair.

The federal court said any retrial "must be held within a reasonable time."

Miss Lima drew a five-year sentence on her retrial and now is free on parole.

Ashley was ruled insane in May, 1964, by a Wharton jury after the case was moved there on a venue change.

He was sent to a state hospital in San Antonio from where he escaped the following October. He was recaptured in Atlanta, Ga., last spring. Another Wharton jury ruled him sane a month and a half later.

The case was moved to Gatesville on another venue change.

A hearing on the writ of habeas corpus is scheduled as soon as the pre-trial hearing is concluded. If the writ is denied, Ashley's attorney can appeal such a decision immediately to the federal court.

Sports dialogue:
BILLY MARTIN, one of the football players picked up in the NFL expansion pool by Atlanta from the Chicago Bears:
"I leave Chicago with no regrets. I didn't like living there. If you were lying in the street bleeding up there, the people would just walk by. Coach Halas thought Ditka was inhuman. He'd get hurt, turn to the sidelines and wave me in. 'I'd start in and Halas would stop me and say, 'He'll shake it off in a couple of plays.' He knew Ditka could play with an injury. Halas likes that."

CHARLES McCABE, San Francisco columnist:

"Horseshoe has yet to meet ash, in that joyous copulation which brings America to bud each year; yet I find my mind turning to that thorny, dedicated female biological sport: the lady 'Frisco baseball nut. Or, fan. A fan is a nut who pays the price of admission. When I was down at Pebble Beach a while back, during the golf ceremonies presided over by that jolly cleric, Bing Crosby, a remark was passed around which mobilized all my feelings about the lady 'Frisco fan. 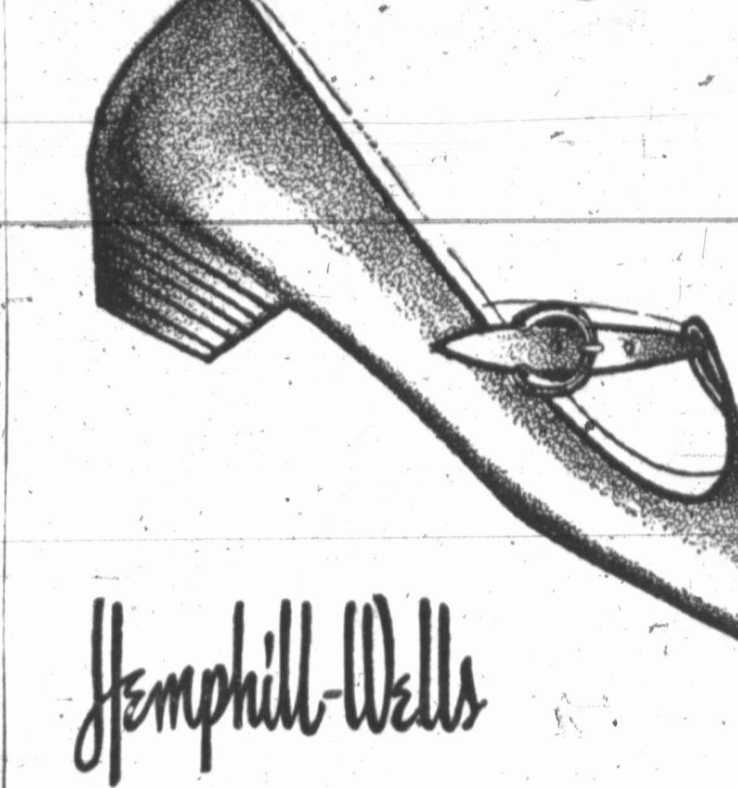

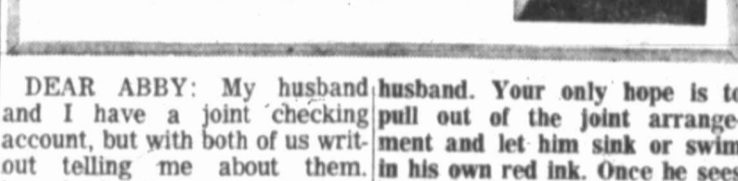
"I've just got to go," said Mrs. Haller. "My orphans are writing and asking for help.

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'Right Man' Found For Cancer Victim

BUFFALO, N.Y. (AP)— Robert F. Allen and the "right man" planned to meet this week for a rare operation which might save both from dying of cancer.

Allen, 28, a Tucson, Ariz., businessman, and an unidentified 65-year-old man from Philadelphia, are strangers to each other, but they have in common a rare type of bone cancer, osteogenic sarcoma.

Both also have the same blood type, O-positive, the key to the operation to be performed by doctors at Roswell Park Memorial Institute.

ONE HOPE Doctors gave Allen, father of three and a former University of Illinois football player, two to six months to live. They said they held one hope, that a man with the same type of cancer and identical blood type might be found.

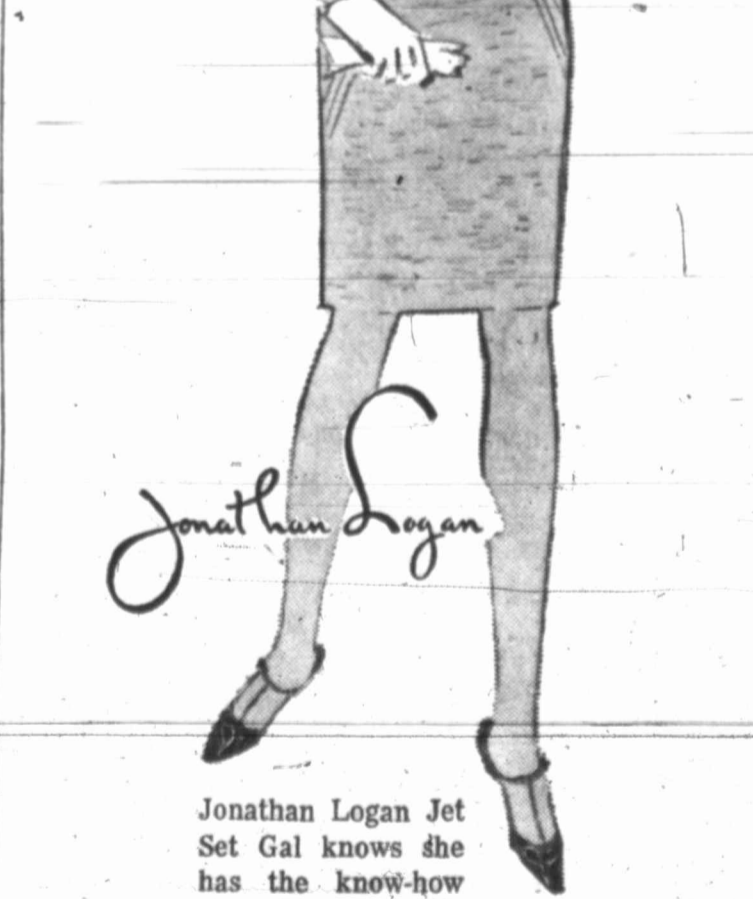
The Philadelphia man, picked after 100 others were screened, agreed Monday to come to Buffalo for the operation, which involves transplanting cancer tissue from each man into the other's thigh.

A similar operation was performed two years ago with apparent success, but on a patient with a different type of cancer, malignant melanoma.

Dr. Sigmund H. Nadler, associate chief cancer research surgeon at Roswell Park, New York State's cancer research and treatment center, said the treatment is still experimental and there is no assurance that it will work.

RESISTANCE SEEN Nadler and Dr. George E. Moore, also of Roswell Park, performed the earlier operation. Within 10 to 14 days after the transplant each patient's body reacted against the foreign cancer tissue, "indicating the development of some form of cancer resistance," Nadler said.

The resistance is carried by white blood cells, which combat the original cancer tissue after each patient's blood is transfused to the other.
