AUSTIN (AP)—Homer Garri-son, director of the Department of Public Safety, said today the new Texas code of criminal procedures "goes even farther...in shackling police investigative procedures" than the latest Su-preme Court decision on confes-

Speaking to the Texas Municipal League's institute for mayors, councilmen and commis sioners, Garrison said the Texas Police Association wants the Texas code amended to make its requirements on the admissibility of confessions the same as set forth by the Supreme

"The police association makes note of the fact that many grave crimes will go unsolved without the use of admissions and confessions," Garrison said. "There are many cases in which there are no witnesses to

see the crime committed and there is only meager or no physical evidence at all at the

"Admissions from the defendant which locate the weapon, the fruits of the crime, or other vital evidence are necessary to corroborate the physical evidence and such witness testimony as may be available." The Supreme Court held last

and indicates in any way that he does not want to be questioned, police may not question





#### Is Your Congressman A Saver?

WASHINGTON - Here in the Congressional mid-season, it is often a case of the pot calling the kettle black - Congress howls at President Johnson for being a wild spender, and the administration answers back in milder tones that Congress is a

checkkiter. It is true, heaven knows, that LBJ is a fast man with the federal buck when it comes to his Great Society programs, but Congress repeatedly outspends him by adding items for its self - interest. The President's budget for the year beginning in July (fiscal year, 1967) is \$112.8 billion and, of course, this is an estimate. Nobody knows what the future will

BUT ON matters that don't pertain to the Viet Nam War, Congress al-ready shows signs of budget-busting LBJ's estimates. For example, Congress has already authorized \$2.5 billion more than Johnson requested for three non-military departments HEW, HUD and Commerce.

Charles Schultze, the budget director, gives these illustrations. The new G.I. bill, if the House figure holds up, will cost the country \$100 million more than the President asked. There are two federal pay bills, one for military and one for civilian personnel, which the administration would like to see become effective next January. But the House has moved the effective dates up to July 1, 1966. This move will allow campaigning Congressmen to boast of what they have done for workers and service-

men in their districts. But it will cost the taxpayer an extra \$500 million in the spending for next year.

far, the House will outspend LBJ on school aid, college student loans, medical research, rural electrification, agricultural research, conservation, school lunches and school milk programs. All, you might say, are worthy projects, and may fetch votes in Norember - but the House can't have it both ways. It can't blame the President for overspending while over-

FOR REASONS not fathomable to me, Johnson gets little public appro-bation for his squeeze technique in cost - cutting. On April 19, 1966 (not for the first time by any means), he sent a directive to all agencies and departments, ordering them to find ways of saving money. He noted that these bureaucrats had responded to the same urgings in the past, and had shaved \$3 billion off the 1966-67 budgets - but he wasn't satisfied. "Controlling waste," says Johnson, "is like bailing out a boat . . . you must keep at it."

THERE IS an old swag slogan, credited to Tammany Hall: "Everybody's money is nobody's money. Neither the President nor Congress itiess of squandering really tries to give the public a break, and I'm not so sure that the average Congressman does likewise.

#### WHAT OTHERS SAY

Secretary of Defense McNamara has appeared often enough on home television screens to build up a strong "public image." We think it is no exaggeration to say that the image is one of a rather arrogant know-it-all. Most of the time he comes through as a severe lecturer, with slicked-down hair, rimless glasses, a mind like a computer, and total disdain for anyone who dares to disagree with the computer's findings.

His speech in Montreal knocked that image into limbo. The computer was still at work-he reeled off the figures to support his statements-but what emerged was a reflective inquiry, not only into the nature of defense, but into the very nature of man. The computer was suddenly re-vealed as a philosopher. "The United States has no mandate

from on high to police the world, and no inclination to do so," he said. Was this a rebuttal to Sen. Fulbright's charge about the "arrogance of power," or agreement with Fulbright and other administration critics? Was it an implied promise that after the Bay of Pigs, the Dominican intervention, and the still-growing commitment in Viet Nam, the administration will avoid similar entanglements in the future?

McNamara specifically cited Western Europe as an area where "fundamental changes are under way." He spoke of "breeching the isolation of Red China," and "building bridges" there, in terms that went beyond previous administration pronounce-

Nevertheless, McNamara's thought ful look shead offers hope that out of the present confusion and de bate is coming a different, more realistic, kind of thinking about the world and the United States' role in it. The tragedy is that so many of the ideas he expressed cannot be put into effect until the formidable barrier in Viet Nam is somehow cleared.
