# Officer Shortage In Navy

Navy statistics show that the over-all retention rate among officers in the three Navy services - submarine, aviation and surface line — has fallen to a present low of 38.7 per cent, meaning barely one in three officers decides to stay on in the

For the noncareer officers the retention rate is 20.7 per cent. Officials report that it is even lower than that for surface line officers, although the Navy does not provide specific break-

The low retention rate has resulted in a shortage of 4,500 officers — about 43 per cent — among the commander, lieutenant commander and lieutenant ranks of the submarine and surface line services.

A Navy task force has been studying the retention problem for the past 20 months and re-cently reported to Secretary of the Navy Paul H. Nitze that,

# Scramble Egg Order For Family

Scrambled eggs is one good answer when baby needs half an egg, junior insists on three, sister wants "almost two," and daddy responds, "Oh, one or two: doesn't make any differ-

Of course the wide range in egg sizes gives a lot of leeway in portion control, too. According to standards established by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, jumbo eggs weigh a minimum of 30 ounces per dozen; pee-wee eggs, just half that weight. Large eggs fall in at 24 ounces; medium, 21; and small eggs, 18

But it's a bit inconvenient to keep eggs of all sizes on hand,

to match personal appetites.

Also, the relative economy of different sizes usually changes with the seasons. Right now, when mature hens are providing most of our eggs, large sizes are more abundant and hence lower priced than small eggs, ounce per ounce.

Scrambled eggs, however, as-sure each member of the family exactly the desired amount, no matter which size is used. Further, eggs of Grade B or C make just as good, just as nu-tritious, scrambled eggs as do those of the higher grades.

Another impressive feature of scrambled eggs is that they are easy to prepare and fun to serve in a variety of ways.

Here's a good basic recipe:
Take 6 eggs, ½ teaspoon salt,
a dash of pepper, 1-3 cup milk,
and 2 tablespoons butter, margarine, or other cooking fat or
oil. Beat eggs until fluffy. Add
salt, pepper and milk. Place
fat in frying pan and heat until
it just bubbles. Add egg mixture,





All this makes it difficult to translate repayment charges into simple interest. Nevertheless, pressure for such translations are persistent. The problem has occupied Congress for years now. And in Massachusetts, installment payments be-ginning in November must be translated by the lender into terms of simple interest.

DISCOUNTING Many people in Massachusetts will find they are not paying the rates they commonly see quoted

for large loans. These are the most common methods of determining loan

1. Discounting. Banks favor this method. The interest is circulated in advance and deducted or discounted from the principal amount of the loan. A \$1,-000 loan at 6 per cent gives you \$940; the interest has been de

However, in terms of simple interest you are paying much more than 6 per cent on this discount loan. Perhaps it is nearer 12 per cent, even a bit more. Why? Because you repay by the month. Simple interest assumes the loan is for a year. However, you are repaying constantly. You never do have a \$1,-000 loan for an entire year. Your average loan is about \$500.

ADDING ON method. You begin with the price of an object—an automo-bile, for example—and add on the interest charge in advance.
A \$3,000 loan at 6 per cent becomes \$3,180. The \$180 is interest paid in advance.

This also is not a 6 per cent

loan, based on simple interest calculations. Using a rule of thumb, your interest rate once again is close to double the 6 per cent. When you first took out the loan you had \$3,000. But just before the final payment you had less than a 10th of that. 3. Actuarial. This method is often used by small loan companies and on charge accounts. Interest is calculated not in advance but every month on the unpaid balance. It often figures out to 12 to 18 per cent.

### **New Industry Finance Source**

The Texas Industrial Commission is ecommending to the next session of the Texas legislature a constitutional amendment which would permit counties and municipalities to issue bonds for industrial development.

At first blush, this may appear another intrusion of government into business, even though on a local level. The commission, however, is recommending a number of guidelines to mitigate this objectional feature of the proposal. For instance, only revenue bonds could be issued upon approval of a majority of voters. These bonds could be amortized (as to interest and principal) solely out of a rental lease. Moreever, the property acquired shall be subject to all applicable ad valorem taxes. No subdivisions smaller than a municipality or a county could issue the bonds. The local government agencies would not have the power of condemnation in connection with the industrial projects. Flexibility is specified in location of the plants, equipment, etc. financed by the revenue bonds.

Whether bonds issued under these

circumstances would be easily marketable remains to be seen because the bonds are not so surely supported by clearly anticipated revenues like city water or sewer or utility issue. Assuming that they could be sold on an economical basis, there is some argument for this source of financing. There are cases of small industries which could utilize local workers and materials if given proper management. For instance, our own community has negotiated for years on some sort of garment or needlework factory, but the prohibitive demands of financing (without local control or appreciable hope of reward) have consistently blocked it. Yet this is something a core of experienced management, sales and technical personnel could direct successfully for a locality.

### No Answer To Inflation

WASHINGTON-Is inflation out of control, and will the present trend continue as the efforts to apply "restraints" turn out to be more theoretical than real?

Neither Congress nor the administration seems to be providing the answer. About all that can be perceived here is a state of disorder in which the leadership of the President is not being asserted and the Democratic party, which has a two-thirds majority in both the Senate and the House, appears to have lost control of itself. Almost everything that is controversial has had to get Republican support to secure passage.

WITHIN THE LAST 15 days, some significant declarations have been made to congressional committees in testimony by Secretary of Com-merce Connor, Secretary of the Treasury Fowler, and the director of the budget, Charles Schultze. Secretary Connor said, for instance, to the House Ways and Means Committee:

"The economy is still showing signs of imbalance and strain, and these could intensify if new fiscal measures are not taken. The purchasing power of the consumer's dollar has been declining at an annual rate of 3.5 per cent since the beginning of the year. At the same time, wholesale prices rose at an annual rate of 3.8 per cent.

"INFLATION on this scale undermines the stability of unit labor costs and, if permitted to continue, would create a vicious wage-price spiral. It imposes severe hardships on the many people who live on fixed incomes, particularly those older people who live on pensions. It jeopardizes our international competitive position and intensifies the difficulty of bringing

I read of the population explosion. In your estimation, is this one of the world's major problems? People have always had families. Why is this a greater problem now than in past history'

It took from the Garden of Eden until 1830 for the world's population to reach the billion mark. But the next billion came in just 100 years. The third billion took just 30 years, and by the end of this century the world population will be twice what it is now. When we project these figures into the next 100 years they become astronomical. Half the world's population is already undernourished and about a half billion exist at starvation level. But poverty and hunger are only two of the problems. How to educate, provide employment, and to give these unborn billions a working way of life, staggers the imagination of our greatest minds.

More critical still is the problem the church faces in evangelizing these billions of people who will inhabit the world of the future. Even now, the church is not keeping pace with the birth rate in the world. To even make a dent in the coming world population will require the recruitment of every Christian in evangelism. If we continue to follow the line of "comfortable Christianity," the world of tomorrow, (if indeed the world continues to be) will be pagan.

I WOULDN'T WANT to swear that Zack Stewart's professional ideas on beauty in industrial America could save the country, but they might. At the very least, they would be a salubrious antidote to the Great Society pitch which actually puts the stress on ugliness. The social engineers of the Great Society are dedicated to faultfinding in our American civilization. In order to evangelize for perfectability, they must accentuate the negative in all things. They must find sickness where the general picture is one of health, poverty where the land rejoices in prosperity, and unsightliness where almost every prospect pleases the eye and only a certain kind of man-the product of too much political meddling-is vile.

The splendid statue by Richard Lippold in the new Pan Am Building in New York City is entirely made of copper wire—no different from the wire used by utili-

Not to belabor junkyards, billboards, freeways, power lines, filling jects, it is not the shapes or colors or masses that they place before the public eye which have become hateful. In every instant they are those of private enterprise. It is private enterprise, the profits motive, which the American people are being tutored to dislike by the social engineers.

NOW THAT we've got Medicare, Ju-dicare, the Office of Economic Opportunity, the Civil Rights Commission and other brother's keepers, Zack Stewart says we might as well have a public advocate on industrial beauty. The advocate would argue in public places that we should glorify-should celebrate-the marvels of American production.

None of the foregoing is extraneous to the California gubernatorial campaign. The Democratic candidate favors greater and continued meddling with people's lives and pursuits, whereas the Republican candidate is for less of the same.

### Uncle Tom's Dilemma

WASHINGTON-It is incumbent for every white man in these enlightened times to have a Negro friend, but it is very dangerous for a Negro to have a white friend.

Take my friend, Belsky, if you will. Belsky is in all sorts of trouble, none of it of his own doing. Belsky compalined to me the other

day, "You are looking at a man without a country. I am in hot water up to my ears, and I don't know what to do about it.' "How so, Belsky?" I inquired

"WELL, I did everything they told me to do. They said, 'Belsky, get an education and you'll be able to throw off the chains of slavery and injustice that your people have suffered for nigh on 300 years.' So I went out

and got a college education.
"Then they said, 'Belsky, move out of the ghetto into a decent neighborhood so your kids can breathe good air and grow straight and tall.' I moved out of the ghetto and found a nice home in a middle-class neighborhood, and everyone seemed happy that I had made it.

THE BLACK people said, 'Look at old Belsky. He broke out of the neighborhood. If he can do it, we can, too.' And the white neighbors, after they got over the shock of it, said, 'You know, once you get to know Belsky he's just like us.' I almost got the feeling they were proud to have me in the neighborhood.

"For three years everything was gong along fine, and then one day a black relative said, 'Belsky's an Uncle Tom.' And another black friend said, 'Of course, he's an Uncle Tom. If he wasn't he'd be living in the ghetto

"ANOTHER ONE said, 'Belsky has white friends. Anyone who has white friends must be Uncle Tomming it all the time.' And still another one said, 'His kids go to a good school. You know he's sold out to Whitey. And so, back in my old neighborhood everyone was saying, 'Burn, Belsky, "You're in a tough spot," I had to

"Well, that's just the half of it. I thought about it for some time and decided there was no sense moving back to the old neighborhood, and if the

price of giving my kids a decent break was being called an Uncle Tom I could live with it. "BUT I HADN'T reckoned with the effect the black power scare would have on the white people. Lately my neighbors have become very nervous. You want to burn down my house, don't you, Belsky?' one of them said. I denied it. 'Well, your people want to burn my house.' I denied my peo-ple wanted to burn down his house.

'Well,' he said angrily, 'someone wants to burn down my house.' "Then you're considered an Uncle Tom by the Negroes and a black pow-er advocate by the white people?" I

"EXACTLY. Nobody's very happy with me, and everyone wants me

'Well, I want you to know, Belsky," I assured him, "you're still my friend, and if you want to you can burn down my house any time.

"Thanks," he said gratefully. There aren't many people left like you any more."


