

### 'Gold Coast' Is Whacked By Hurricane

MIAMI, Fla. (AP) — Hurri-cane Inez, still a killer after nine wild days over tropic seas, roared today up an Atlantic Ocean alley between the famed resort cities of Miami and Nassau.

Dead ahead of the storm lay Great Abaco Island, "the land that time forgot," and other Bahamian isles which often have heard the howl of the hurricane.

Inez had slowed to a crawl, a development that often portends a change in direction. But forecasters predicted she would continue on to north-northeast, toward islands in which many graveyards hold victims of other tropic storms.

DIRECT HIT Lashing out to east and west, Inez jabbed at the south Flor-"Gold Coast" with gusty winds and squalls and sent a tornado spiraling into Nassau that killed a 16-months-old native child.

Great Abaco, second largest of the Bahama Islands and the home of 6,500 persons, was scheduled for a direct hit. Although Great Abaco is largely populated by natives of African descent, it contains several white communities-settled by loyalist refugees of the American Revolutionary Warwhere customs have changed

### BATTERY BREAKTHROUGH REVEALED

## Electric 'City Car' Way Paved?

DETROIT (AP) - Ford Motor Co. reported today it has achieved a major breakthrough by developing a new type bat-tery which could pave the way for return of the electric-pow-ered auto to U.S. highways.

Michael Ference Jr., Ford vice president for scientific research, said the new battery could store up to 15 times as much energy as present leadacid storage batteries.

The firm disclosed Sept. 15 that it was working on the electric car project.

Ference said in a prepared statement that Ford Motor Co. and Ford of England have joined forces to build two proto-type models of the proposed electric car.

LOW COST The two companies described the new product, the first exper-imental model of which is being built in England now, as "a lowcost, subcompact limited performance 'city car' to carry two adults and two passengers.'

The first two cars, one designed for testing in England and the other in metropolitan suburban areas of the United States, will be powered initially by lead-acid batteries, such as those now used in cars.

Ference said Ford has developed a new type sodium-sulfur battery, which is still in its early stages.

He added, "It promises to meet the over-all needs of an efficient, low-cost, compact, urban-suburban electric vehicle requiring only overnight recharging.

Ference estimated that the electric car, powered by the new battery, would have a range of 150 miles at 40-miles-an-hour An artist's sketch of the pro-posed car looks like an abridged version of Ford's Econo-van. The battery and the motor were installed under the floor on the driver's side of the vehicle.

TWO STARTERS Ford's first experimental cerr

was to have an over-all length of about six feet and two starter motors for propulsion.

Designers of earlier electric cars have been stymied by the need to have several batteries in the car and winding up even then with a very short cruising

Ference said the proposed new car would have greater acceleration and range than cur-rent batteries would provide.



KENILWORTH, III. (AP) On the chilly morning of Sept. 18, the stillness that surrounded the mansion where Valerie Percy, 21, lay murdered was disturbed by the movements of

They carried cameras, finger printing equipment and a vacuum cleaner. They moved quickly from the bedroom where the daughter of Charles H. Percy was beaten and stabbed, to the patio where her killer entered the home. They lifted fingerprints from every surface, they photographed footprints on a nearby beach.



### Powell Can't Laugh It Off

Rep. Adam Clayton Powell is making quite a production of trying to laugh off what fellow members of the House Education and Labor Committee did to his powers as chairman. The congressman from Harlem, also to be seen from time to time in his other roles as minister, professional Negro and wide-ranging playboy, is busy trying to give the impression that he was not stripped of his powers but actually achieved a triumph by pushing through a reform of committee procedures.

This is nonsense. The truth is that, though the politically powerful and re-silent Powell may indeed manage to turn this defeat into a triumph, for the time being his ability to freewheel as committee chairman has

been curbed.

Powell has chosen to deny this—to

insist that it all went according to his plan, to hint broadly that when it comes to a showdown ol' Adam will still be in charge. Perhaps so, but even the ebullient Powell may in his private moments discern a bit of

handwriting on the wall.

### What And When Is Inflation?

WASHINGTON -- Who speaks for whom in Washington? Is the Secretary of Labor a spokesman for the administration or a partisan of union

These questions are prompted by a reading of the speech just made by Secretary of Labor Willard Wirtz to the 800 delegates at a convention of the AFL-CIO's Committee on Political Education. He told them, in effect, that there really isn't any flation" today. He said inflation is "possible" but isn't here yet and that using the word is comparable to what happened in the days of the New Deal when the legislative programs were sometimes called

MR. WIRTZ may have had in mind as "possible inflation" what is commonly called "runaway inflation." Obviously in the United States today inflation isn't as bad as it is in Brazil, where the monetary unit has shrunk to almost nothing.

But if it is wrong to speak of inflation, why is President Johnson talking about a tax increase, and why did he recently ask Congress to suspend the investment credit for business and certain depreciation allowances in corporate taxes?

THE SECRETARY of Labor gives the impression that people who talk of inflation as being here already are merely trying to cut down government spending for necessary programs of social welfare. He admits, of

I heard one of your sermons in which you defended the Biblical concept of morality. I, like others, realize that there is something wrong with the morals of us moderns, but aren't we living in a different day than Moses and Aa-ron? Shouldn't the rules be changed to fit the times? A.F.W.

This is exactly what we are trying to do: to amend the moral law of God to fit our times and our whims. But it won't work. Actually, we can't break the moral laws of the universe - we simply break ourselves upon them. That is what we are doing. Children would like a home without rules. In their immaturity they would like a situation where there was no discipline, but life just isn't like that; unless you live in some kind of a jungle. Our contention for a world without moral law is juvenile. It is childish. The only happy life is an ordered life, and the discipline of living a clean life, a decent life, is not as difficult and boring as some think. A neat, clean, well - ordered house is to be preferred to confu-sion and bedlam. The same is true in the realm of the spirit. The restrained, controlled, purposeful man-ner of living is far and away more enjoyable than one that is cluttered and untidy. The unwed mother can tell you that she would feel better inside if she had listened to the Biblical admonition, "Flee youthful lusts." When you fall off a cliff, the sign which read "danger" makes a lot more sense from the bottom than it does from the top. If we're wise we'll make our manner of living fit the rules God has given, rather than trying to change them.

course, that there has been some increase in the cost of living and that inflation could come someday, but he apparently feels that it hasn't done any harm so far.

Yet on Capitol Hill the leaders of both the Democratic and Republican party have used the argument that certain measures must be passed right away "to curb inflation."

LOOKING AT THE official figures, the last Treasury surplus was in fiscal year 1960, when receipts were \$1.2 billion in excess of spending. In the subsequent six fiscal years, the cumulative budget deficit has amounted to \$30.4 billion. In those same six ears, while revenues went up by \$26.8 billion, or 34.4 per cent, the expenditures rose by \$30.4 billion, or 39.7 per cent. This is the inflation about which several economists in both parties have become alarmed.

PRESIDENT JOHNSON has estimated that the budget for fiscal year 1967 would show a spending of \$112.8 billion and a deficit of \$1.8 billion. But a more realistic appraisal made by disinterested experts is that the spending will reach a figure nearer \$120 billion and bring a deficit that may run from \$5 billion to \$9 billion

Much of the extra expense is, of course, due to the war in Viet Nam, but the comparative figures are nonetheless significant. The cost-of-living index is 3.5 per cent above a year ago -a sharp rise, though it isn't runaway inflation. A faster price rise hasn't occurred since the three years after World War II and one year of the Ko-

CURRENTLY the purchasing power of the dollar is undeniably diminishing. The dollar today, compared with ten years ago, is worth 82 cents. If the present rate of decline continues. the dollar will be worth 69 cents five years from now. This is what is

meant by inflated prices. The President himself will be announcing shortly after the election, if not before, his recommendation to Congress for a tax increase and other measures to meet the growing eco-nomic crisis. All this wouldn't be nec-essary if "inflation," as Secretary Wirtz says, is just a "loaded word."

SPOKANE, Washington - "Thank would afflict the President before the you, Mr. President," was both a hailand-farewell salutation some 20 nonths ago when the 89th Congress reported for work. Newsmen used the amiliar words, of course, to end White House conferences, and the 76 Democratic Congressional freshmen were under general instruction by the party leaders to express gratitude for Lyndon Johnson's coattails in the 1964

IT WAS ALL part of a well-planned ritual. The arriving freshman was ushered in to meet Mr. President and as soon as the thank-you line was spoken, the President let the freshman know what was expected: loyalty. In 1965, Mr. Johnson had a huge, controversial program up his sleeve—civil rights, anti-poverty war, Section 14-B repealer, the new HUD department, additional education, medicare and much else that President Kennedy hadn't been able to obtain. LBJ, the "Can Do" man, wanted to shine, and shine he did that first session while the freshmen Democrats of the House lock-stepped in his support.

AMONG THOSE who lock-stepped for Lyndon in those days was Rep. Tom Foley of the Fifth District of Washington State, where this being written. To Foley and his classmates of the '64 election, support of the President seemed the formula for a long and pleasant life in Congress. Who dared predict that Congress and country soon would falter in sheer exhaustion from the Johnson Treatment? That political revolt, fiscal inflation, racial turmoil and sinking popularity

next election season?

TOM FOLEY, along with many of his classmates, now likes to change the subject when anybody mentions the early support of LBJ. The bright, attractive, promising 38-year-old legis-lator much prefers to talk of his 1966 voting record, which is a good many points below that of 1965 in support of the President.

If Foley is typical of his classmates, as I believe, in trying to minimize and apologize for his membership in the Great Society, we are getting a temperature reading of some importance. There is little more fascinating in human relations than to watch a warm friendship cooling-and when the friendship is political, we are studying a bit of history in the cruci-

THERE IS SOMETHING else to note about Foley. He is one of a sizable group of young Representatives and Senators who are not considered Johnson Democrats at all. Their gravitation is toward the Kennedy camp, which stands quite apart from the tents of the tall Texan. Two eventualities are suggested here. One is that Foley and some other Democratic freshmen may come through this election on coattails that are not so publicly visible as the President's were two years ago-for the Kennedy pulling power is a far more subtle thing. In addition, if Foley and other freshmen are beaten, the Johnson prestige goes down but the Kennedy prestige

### **Business Raps Tax Credit Loss**

NEW YORK (AP) - An emotion molded of bitterness, concern and doubt has enveloped many business-

men as they see the tax credits that. had spurred their spending withdrawn like a sweet from a child. For a while it sounded as if business had given much more support than it has to the President's antiinflation plans. Much of the apparent

support was anything but that. Few industrialists or corporations gave broad endorsements, as did Henry Ford II, chairman of Ford Motor Co., and William Murphy, president of Campbell Soup Co.

SOME OF the endorsements were like skim milk masquerading as

The Chamber of Commerce of the United States proclaimed the "Chamber welcomes LBJ's moves to curb spending," but it shouted as loudly that suspension of the investment tax credit would be ineffective or damaging.

The chairman of American Telephone & Telegraph Co., Frederic R. Kappel, endorsed the proposal to suspend the investment tax credit and fast tax writeoffs. As a utility, AT&T received a credit of only 3 per cent, not 7 per cent, as did manufactur-

STUART SAUNDERS, chairman of the Pennsylvania Railroad, endorsed the proposals but suggested that rail-roads and other industries be considered candidates for exemption.

2. Another group believes the remedy would be relatively ineffective. A study by the National Industrial Conference Board, a private organization, found that most businessmen

3. Still another group feels the suspension of tax credits might be damaging, that it might produce its biggest impact when the economy needs spur-not a restrainer.

TAXES ARE controversial. They are rigid. It takes time and trouble to get them enacted and later retracted. They can become effective after the inflationary damage is done, and then do more damage-like a fire after a tornado.

Johnson's entire anti-inflation record this year has been a flexible one: speed up corporate tax payments, cut spending, encourage restraint. When forced to handle taxes he chose a flexible fringe—a tax credit. And he didn't ask that it be eliminated: only suspended.

Will it be enough? The post-election measures could be creative and surprising and flexible.

### Civilian To Head Yemen's Air Unit

SANAA, Yemen (AP)-A civilian has been appointed commander of Ye-men's fledgling air force, according to a decree issued by Prime Minister Hassan Army.

The civilian is Aly el Kobatty, 35, the most experienced Yemeni pilot in the country, and until recently the only one in Yemen.

Kobatty will command 31 Yemeni pilots and air technicians who recenty returned from training in the Soviet Union. These fliers now serve as copilots on Egyptian warplanes operating in Yemen.

Kobatty has been chief pilot of Yemen Airlines for the past seven years, flying antiquated twin-engine trans-ports. The airline also employs foreign pilots\_
