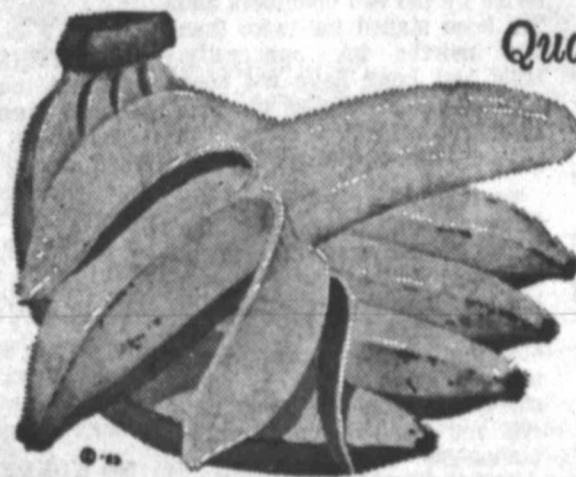

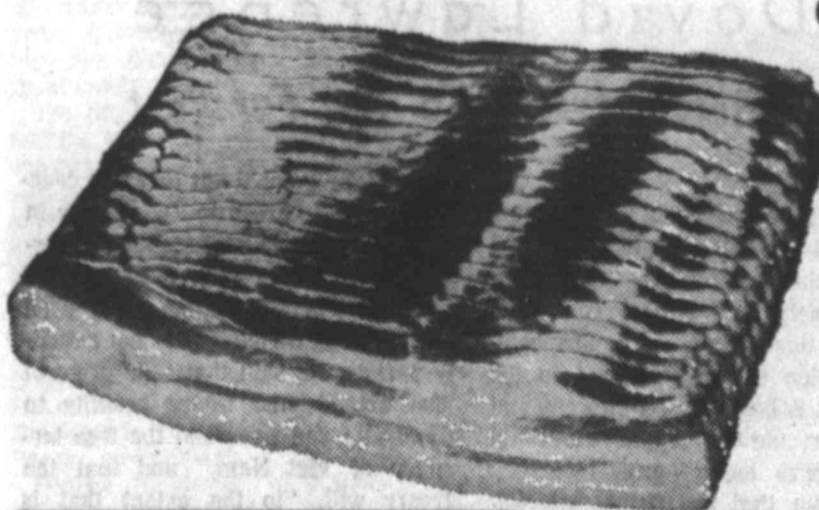

Wallace Opposes Nixon As Well As Johnson

MONTGOMERY, Ala. (AP) — "I'm not only against Lyndon B. Johnson," says Alabama's Gov. George C. Wallace, "I'm against Richard Milhous Nixon also."

Thus Wallace, campaigning for his wife to succeed him, has set the stage for another presidential election. And he has answered Republican critics who have sought to him, through party identification, to President Johnson's administration.

Johnson's demonstrated unpopularity in Alabama has become a major issue in a race which will give the state its first woman governor in history or almost a century.

Wallace's wife, Lurleen —

running as a stand-in for her husband because he is prohibited by law from succeeding himself — is a heavy favorite to defeat her GOP opponent, Congressman James D. Martin, and an Independent, Dr. Carl Robinson, in the Nov. 8 election.

Martin says his own polls show Mrs. Wallace's margin is narrowing.

Wallace, a symbol of segregationist resistance in the Deep South, is counting heavily on the defiance of federal desegregation orders to put his wife into office. Again and again, as he speaks in her behalf, he has promised an unending struggle for "the right to run our own affairs."

He has never said unequivocally that he will run for president in 1968, as he did in 1964. But he has told campaign crowds that he "just might" be a candidate "unless the major parties give us someone (a conservative) we can vote for."

And then he systematically rules out every Democrat or Republican thus far mentioned as a nominee, including former Vice President Nixon, who is Rep. Martin's choice.

Wallace says Nixon was partly responsible for the use of troops to integrate Central High School at Little Rock, Ark., in 1957 and that Nixon supported civil rights bills.

Cool Front Moving In

A dry cool front moved into East Texas today while the threat from hurricane Inez eased on the Gulf Coast.

The storm plodded onto the Mexican Coast between Tampico and Brownsville, Tex., during the night and the Weather Bureau said it appeared no hurricane-force winds would hit the state.

Skies were mostly clear behind the cold front and partly cloudy ahead of it.

A few light showers fell south of Fort Worth as the front moved through, but no other rain was reported in Texas. Patches of fog hovered over the Gulf Coast region in the early morning.

Low temperatures Monday ranged from the 40s in parts of the Panhandle to the 70s across South Texas.

Violence Takes Only 15 Texans In Weekend

Violent deaths totaled only 15 in Texas this weekend, one of the lowest levels in recent years.

An Associated Press tabulation which began at 6 p.m. Friday and continued through midnight Sunday showed six persons were killed in traffic accidents.

Eight persons were shot or beaten to death and one man was found dead in an underground oil tank, apparently the victim of a slaying.

The following may be added: Miss Lucy Garcia, 23, LaPorte, was killed Sunday when the car in which she was riding went into a ditch and overturned near LaPorte.

James Tuiel, 29, Houston, was shot to death in a Houston lounge Sunday. Strauther C.

shot in an apartment at Lubbock Sunday. Two men were charged with murder.

Wayne Williams, 51, of Riverside, Calif., died Saturday while hitchhiking 20 miles northwest of Littlefield in West Texas when a car in which he rode hit a construction barricade.

Obie Byrd Shepard, 46, of Kermit was found dead Saturday in an underground oil tank at Kermit, and police said he apparently was the victim of a slaying.

Police said two white officers, W.L. Howell and G.R. Stroud, were surrounded Sunday by about 300 Negroes who took their guns, nightsticks and portable two-way radio.

Reinforcements dispersed the mob. Stroud was treated for head injuries at a hospital and released.

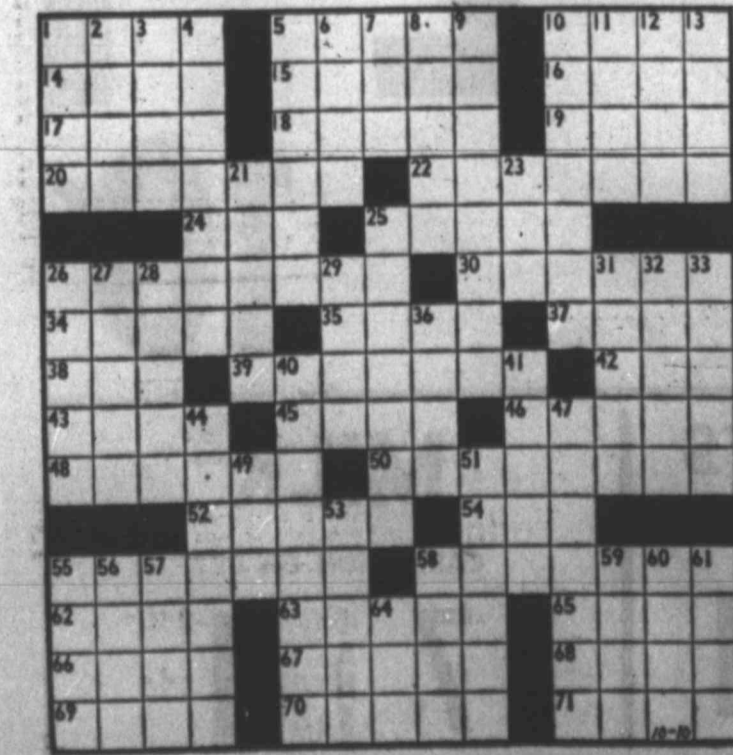

Hurricanes Are Not New To Brownsville

BROWNSVILLE, Tex. (AP)—A hurricane is no novelty to this city of nearly 53,000 persons in the Lower Rio Grande Valley. But it has been more than three decades since it experienced one.

Weather Bureau records list three hurricanes having hit Brownsville: Sept. 23, 1886, Sept. 21, 1887 and Sept. 4, 1933.

Records contain nothing on the two 19th Century storms, but the 1933 one killed 24 persons and did an estimated \$16.9 million in damage.

The 1933 hurricane had winds of 106 miles per hour, records show, as compared to the 135-mile-an-hour winds in hurricane Inez now in the Gulf of Mexico and threatening this area.

Ernest Rice, Weather Bureau meteorologist here, said today the records indicate that Brownsville residents had only a 24-hour warning before the 1933 storm.

Waves 10 to 12 feet above normal lashed the coast near Port Isabel, he said. Total rainfall during the storm was 10.38 inches, with 5.80 inches falling during the first 24 hours.

Two of the worst hurricanes in recorded Texas history occurred in 1900 at Galveston and in 1961 when Carla struck in the Corpus Christi vicinity.

The great Galveston storm happened Sept. 8-9 with a loss of life estimated at 8,000 to 10,000. Galveston Island was inundated by tides that reached 15 feet or more. Not a single structure escaped damage.

Carla, with winds estimated at 175 miles an hour, lasted from Sept. 8th to the 14th, killed 34 persons and caused property and crop damage estimated at \$300 million.

The most recent hurricane to reach Texas was Cindy in September 1963. It lashed the Port Arthur area with rains of more than 23 inches and brought damage in excess of \$11 million.

Doubts Bread Price Drop

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. George McGovern says he doubts whether bread prices will drop despite a 30-cent a bushel decrease in the price of wheat in recent weeks.

The South Dakota Democrat said the baking industry used an earlier rise in wheat prices as an excuse for boosting retail prices for a loaf of bread two cents or more.

"But I have not heard of bread prices falling even one-tenth of the amount they rose when wheat went up," McGovern said in a speech prepared for the Senate but released Sunday night.

The senator challenged fellow senators to stop at their grocery stores and compare the price of a loaf of bread to that of several months ago when wheat sold for higher prices.

Catches Cold

MOSCOW (AP) — Soviet President Nikolai Podgorny had to postpone his visit to Vienna, Austria, "because he caught a cold," a Moscow government spokesman said today.

Some Of The Army Are Resisting Lin's Orders

TOKYO (AP) — Red China indicated today that some of its army is still resisting Defense Minister Lin Piao's leadership, and a Hong Kong newspaper reported some of the Red Guards have criticized Lin.

Lin, boss of the Red Guards and No. 2 man to Chairman Mao Tse-tung, has issued new orders to the army to follow Mao's teachings, Peking's New China News Agency reported.

The instructions seemed to indicate that the army has not knuckled under to the Mao-Lin leadership and that Lin's position next to Mao has been questioned.

In Hong Kong, a pro-Nationalist Chinese newspaper reported that some of the young Red Guards put up posters in Peking accusing Lin of "stealing things to eat" when he was a child.

"How could a thief lead a country?" The posters asked, according to the report in the Kung Sheung Daily News.

Lecture First, Then The Fire

ZILLAH, Wash. (AP) — Chief Elmer Schultz of the Zillah rural fire department visited Zillah elementary school last Thursday to lecture on fire prevention.

Sunday, the first day of Fire Prevention Week, he was back again — to fight a fire.

The blaze destroyed 10 of the school's 13 classrooms, a library and an office despite efforts of three fire departments. Damage was estimated at \$200,000.

GOREN ON BRIDGE

ANSWERS TO BRIDGE QUIZ
Q. 1—With both sides vulnerable, your right hand opponent opens with one diamond and you hold:
♠A J 10 5 3 2 ♥6 3 2 ♦7 ♣K 2
What action do you take?
A.—One spade. While this hand is slightly better than a normal opening bid, we nevertheless prefer a simple overcall to the take-out double. It is our belief on this hand that, unless partner is able to take voluntary action, there will be no game.

Q. 2—Both vulnerable, and as South you hold:
♠Q 5 2 ♥A 9 8 6 2 ♦K Q 10 ♣J 6
The bidding has proceeded:
North East South West
1 ♣ Pass 1 ♥ Pass
2 ♣ Pass ?
What do you bid now?
A.—Three no trump. A mere bid of two no trump by you at this point would be regarded as a bid made under some pressure. The jump is therefore recommended to describe to you that you have an above average hand.

Q. 3—You are South, vulnerable, and hold:
♠K J 5 ♥A K J 9 3 ♦K 10 6 ♣K 4
The bidding has proceeded:
East South West North
1 ♣ Dble. Pass 3 NT
Pass ?
What do you bid now?
A.—It is quite clear that East has thrown a red herring across your trail. Your partner's hand is equal to a very good opening bid. Remember that he could have shown a strong hand by jumping to two no trump. His jump to three, therefore, shows a hand of great value. We would be inclined to take our chances on a direct slam bid, but surely we would bid at least five no trump.

Q. 4—Both vulnerable, and as South you hold:
♠A 10 5 ♥Q J 6 ♦Q J 3 ♣Q J 9 5
The bidding has proceeded:
West North East South
1 ♦ Dble. 1 NT ?
What do you bid?
A.—Double. By proceeding along the lines of simple arithmetic we reach the conclusion that East will be unable to fulfill a contract of one no trump. Your hand contains 11 points in high cards, and partner's hand is presumably worth at least 13. Your side, therefore, has at least 24 points to 16 for the adversaries.

Q. 5—As South, vulnerable, you hold:
♠A K 9 3 ♦A Q 6 4 2 ♣A 10 6 2
The bidding has proceeded:
South West North East
1 ♦ Pass 1 NT Pass
? ?
What do you bid now?
A.—Two spades. This is a close choice between a jump shift to three clubs and the reverse bid of two spades with our preference leaning toward the latter call. Altho partner's no trump response over a diamond would make it appear likely that he fits one of the minors, he could conceivably have some four card spades holding not worth showing. We can always bid clubs subsequently should it prove expedient.

Q. 6—Neither vulnerable, as South you hold:
♠8 4 ♥K 9 6 3 ♦K Q J 9 ♣K 6 5
The bidding has proceeded:
North East South
1 ♣ 1 ♦ ?
What do you bid?
A.—Double. Your hand figures to produce about five tricks and your trumps are good enough to draw some of East's. If you miss a game by the double, the compensation should prove more than adequate.

Q. 7—Neither vulnerable, as South you hold:
♠J 10 5 ♥A Q 10 ♦K 10 6 2 ♣Q 10 4
The bidding has proceeded:
North East South West
Pass Pass 1 ♦ Pass
2 ♣ Pass ?
What do you bid now?
A.—Two no trump. Even the partner passed originally, his jump shift is forcing for one round. With the jack of spades promoted your hand is the equivalent of a sound opening bid. However, three no trump appears to be the most promising contract, as you want your hand led up to.

Q. 8—Neither vulnerable, as South you hold:
♠J 10 6 ♥Q 7 2 ♦Q J 10 9 3 2 ♣K 9
The bidding has proceeded:
North East South
1 ♣ Pass ?
What do you bid?
A.—One no trump. This hand does not quite measure up to the requirements, but it does have a partial spade fit plus two tens. An effort should be extended to keep the bidding open and the alternative of an immediate spade raise would be too drastic.

Threat Of Insolvency

WASHINGTON (AP) — Jacques Rueff, a French fiscal expert, says failure of the United States to solve its balance-of-payments problem is threatening it with insolvency.

Rueff, monetary adviser to French President Charles de Gaulle, said "nothing is wrong with the American economy."

But he said there is cause for alarm because of the steady rise in foreign claims in dollars — against a decreasing amount of gold.

In a copyrighted interview in this week's "U.S. News & World Report," Rueff said "this situation — diminution of assets and increases of liabilities — can only result at some point, in inability to pay, in insolvency."

Rueff, interviewed at Paris, said that to finance growing world trade and payments, the value of gold should be doubled in value simultaneously by all countries.

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
