



The Johnson administration is now going into the hard-working stage of budget-making for the next fiscal year. It will have to take into account the probability that the more conservative 90th Congress just elected may favor a hold-down on domestic expenditures to a tax increase, if there is a practical choice.

A major economic decision that is , would, of course, immediately ease escalation of the war would make a tax increase an urgent necessity.

The third, and related, imponderable is the barometer of inflation. Generally it is still rising, but there are slackening factors. An acceleration of inflation would make a tax increase inevitable: a leveling off would make a tax increase perhaps avoidable.

Thus, the time between new and January will be one of uncertainty and anxious waiting. No one, of course, wants a tax increase, but by January it should become evident whether one must be imposed or can be avoided. Meanwhile, all is specula-

victory but why it happened hardly a Republican can tell in the cold light of day with the battle flags coming down. That is the puzzle the party must solve if 1966 is to be the beginning of a march to a real victory

The realists who do not delude themselves with easy rhetoric know that series of happenstances. It followed the landslide of 1964 sweeping in Democrats in so many normally Republican districts. To a greater extent than almost anyone had anticipated Americans voted their accumulated

This is a large order, for it was abundantly plain in the campaign mercifully ending on Nov. 8 that they had failed to mount a national attack. While it may have been inevitable in an off-year election no national voice spoke the aims and aspirations of one of the two great poli-

tical parties. THE PARTY suffers from a kind of war - lordism. As in pre-Mao China there are reigning lords exercising their authority over limited territories and prescribing their own individual ideologies. To date they have shown no signs of composing their differences. What the country will want to know is whether one commanding figure can give a uni-

fied lead. There are candidates for that role.

> It is too early for that and much must be done to insure proper timing and the proper setting. But Romney cannot wait too long. For the conservative war lords in his own state as well as around the country are lining up their forces to block the man who successfully evaded the Goldwater curse two years ago to

win his second term as governor. Shrewd tactics dictate that they move quickly to offset Romney's candidacy. They could do this in Romnev's own state by declaring for either Nixon or Reagan. And this would play directly into Nixon's hands. Since Barry Goldwater has at least twice declared Nixon acceptable as the '68 candidate he already has a

AGAIN AND again in the past two and a half years the moderate - progressives in the party have appeared

hesitant and uncertain. They have a chance to prove what they can do. An early opportunity will be the conference of Republican governors in Colorado Springs on Dec. 9.
