The White House, using figures from an official log, said 'Johnson "drove at a moderate speed' on his way to church along a fog-bound highway Sun-

But a newsman and two photographers driving separate cars said they couldn't keep up with the President despite traveling 80 to 85 miles an hour, and faster in some spurts.

Johnson's accelerator foot stirred stories of high-speed driving in March 1964 but Secret Service cars screened newsmen enough to keep them from

tinental from the LBJ Ranch to church at Fredericksburg Sunday, accompanied by Mrs. Johnson and Bess Abell White House social secretary.

REPORTERS COULDN'T CATCH UP AT 85 MILES PER HOUR

Within hours of reports from the three men who couldn't keep up with Johnson, the White House issued its speeding deni-

Harold C. Pachios, aide to Bill D. Moyers, press secretary, said the Secret Service log showed an elapsed time of 25 minutes for the 17.4-mile trip.

"This indicates the President drove at a moderate speed," said Pachios. His figures showed an average speed of 42 miles an hour, including driving time on the ranch road leading

to US Highway 290 and several blocks of driving within Fredericksburg.

The fog limited visibility to about 100 yards and was heavy enough to necessitate some use of lights and windshield wipers, the newsmen said.

The front car hit 100 miles an hour several times but could get in sight only of the Secret Service car trailing Johnson and did not see the President's car. The second car, moving at speeds up to 90 never caught the first. The third car's driver said he never could catch up with the second



"I prefer not to name names,

he said. Can the conflicting Republican views of Reagan on the right, and Romney and the governors Rockefeller (Nelson and Winthrop) on the left and middle, be reconciled for the sake of unity?

"It is a question not necessarily of reconciliation of the views of the acknowledged party front runners," Tower responded, "but essentially what needs to be done is for the Republican Party to come up with a candidate who reflects the party consensus.

GRASS ROOTS PEOPLE "In other words, we need not please the most publicized figures in the party, but we must please the great number of grass roots people in the Republican Party over the country who produce the effort, manpower and money that win elections. "You recognize that the Re-

publican Party is the 'right of center' party, and that is not to imply any extreme dogmatic or doctrinaire positions. "I think," Tower continued,

"that our objective should be to reflect the party consensus to the extent it exists." "I think it should be noted that too often the mass media

put emphasis on those matters on which the Republicans disagree, when actually there are many things on which the vast majority of Republicans are in agreement.

FISCAL SOUNDNESS
"As an example, it would be rare to find a Republican who is opposed to fiscal soundness in government. This is a basic Republican position," Tower declared.

The sweeping Republican election gains in November puts the party in a much stronger position to contest the Demo-crats in 1968 than in 1964, Tower acknowledges with pleasure. But he hedged his comments on how the 1968 presidential

race might turn. "So much depends on the political climate of 1968," Tower observed. "If the present climate prevails in 1968, I would read that as a bad omen for the administration. I think a great deal in 1968 depends on the state of our economy, and the state of the war in Viet

How the war will bear on the campaign "again depends on the state of the war, not necessarily whether it is still going on," Tower thinks. THE WAR

"If we appear to have the upper hand, and the war appears to be coming to an end, that is one thing. If it appears we are in a war of an attrition and it is unlikely to be settled, that would be an unfavorable climate for the administra-

Texas feed lots fattened and sent to market more than one 'natural" for the state.

The basic ingredients for feed lot operations are lots of cattle and lots of grain.

Texas is abundant in both.

The record 1,079,000 head fattened in the state's 245 lots in 1965 is expected to double to over two million by 1980, says Dr. O. D. Butler, head of the Animal Science Department at Texas A&M University.

Since only 1955, the number of Texas lots and the number of cattle processed have both quad-

FIRST IN CATTLE

While Texas has long been first in cattle production, it has lagged in cattle feeding. Now it has risen to seventh among the

"We have the animals, the grain and the climate," said Butler in an interview. "The only possible limiting factors we face are capital, know-how and slaughter facilities."

Since it takes seven pounds of grain for one pound of weight gained for beef on the hoof, economics dictates this law: It's cheaper to ship the cattle

to the feed than to ship the feed to the cattle. "What this means," Butler

said, "is that feed lots must be near adequate grain supplies.

RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

"Large-scale grain production is a relatively recent development in Texas, and that's why Texas cattle were shipped out of state for so long.

"Where's the big grain bowl of the nation? The Midwest, the Corn Belt. And that's where most of the cattle were fattened in the past."

Now that Texas has finally become a major grain-producing state, its feed lot industry is growing in kind.

Not surprisingly, the greatest growth is occurring where the The High Plains of West Tex-

Rapid development also is taking place in the Corpus Christi area, in South Texas and the Lower Rio Grande Valley, in the Trans-Pecos area and in parts of Central Texas.

Irrigation provided the key for the massive production of grain sorghum on the High Plains. The area is now the world's leading producer of the crop, and millions of bushels are exported annually, as well as consumed domestically.

Butler said sorghum was now 95 per cent as good a feed for cattle as corn, the old staple. He added that new strains and improved mixing will almost surely make it corn's equal in quality in the near future.

\$700 MILLION CROP

The Texas beef cattle indus try is now a cash crop worth \$700 million a year, rivaling cotton for the state's top agriculture product.

Butler said that of this figure some \$220 million currently comes from the marketing of cattle fattened in Texas lots. And the value is rising.

But despite the growing feed lot industry in the state, Texas still exports far more cattle than it imports. Butler said last year's figures were: 1,990,345 shipped out, 717,421 shipped in. The Texas cattle population is about 10 million head now, and





What Do Tourists Prefer?

Texas state and local governments and private enterprise are currently engaged in an unprecedented effort to improve recreational facilities and attractions both for residents and for the highly valued tourist trade.

For Jesus' sake. Amen.

In a recent address to a Texas Tourist Conference, Gov. John Connally stressed the point that advertising to attract tourists must be matched by providing attractions that will keep visitors here longer. The longer the visits, the greater the income from tourist trade, and the larger the number of repeat visits for even higher

To this end, Texas is improving its state parks, bidding for more national parks, expanding its highway system, emphasizing the importance of recreation facilities related to reservoirs developed under its long-range water plan, giving increasing attention to preservation and publicizing of historic sites, encouraging new museums, undertaking control of water and air pollution, urging individual initiative in promoting private-enterprise recreation, and including recreation as an important aspect of state, regional and local planning. But are we giving people, our own and visitors, what they really want? Professor Ivan Schmedemann of

the Texas A&M University's Agricultural Economics and Sociology Department raised that provocative and important question in a talk on "Water Based Recreation Research" at the Water Resources Institute at College Station recently. He suggested that the state undertake extensive research in depth on popular recreation needs and preferences.

He definitely has a point. Texas and its political subdivisions will in the near future spend many millions on recreation facilities for residents and tourists. It makes sense to devote a fraction of that expenditure to market or consumers' research to improve the probability that what is provided is what the people really want and what will attract tourists to stay longer and come again. And, as funds for recreation facilities are unfortunately severely limited, such research should be helpful in fixing priorities in the development of recreational resources statewide, as well as in avoiding waste in providing facilities that will not be used enough to justify their

Curb On The 'Great Society'

In a series of interviews currently appearing in The Herald, John Tower, who was returned to the U.S. Senate by a sound majority in the recent election, makes some cogent

First, he is of the opinion that the next Congress will be considerably more "conservative" in outlook, which means, in simplest terms, that it will keep a tighter rein on spending for various governmental domestic programs.

This is not a new analysis of the Congress makeup, in view of Republican victories, but obviously this slowdown approach is what the people

Secondly, Senator Tower believes that Republicans, in order to win in 1968, must muster a much stronger cohesion than has been exhibited since 1964. And he's right about that, too. While President Johnson's "Great Society" very likely moved too fast and too far (as regards the strain on the U.S. Treasury), the fact remains that most of these programs are now solidified and will continue to be with us. If improvements are to be made, it will be in the realm of re-shaping, toning down, perhaps, and most importantly by seeing that the money s spent for the objectives set up by Congress.

It will not be enough for Republicans merely to put on all brakes. They must, through party cooperation, labor to see that the best of the domestic programs are handled efficiently. This is a challenge for Senator Tower and all members of the Congress.

Holmes Alexander GOP Has The Field Position

WASHINGTON - Members of Congress using the pre-Christmastime period to catch up on work bring recondite interpretations of the November election to Washington.

One generally - held opinion among politicians is that the Democrats have boxed themselves into a corner with little chance to maneuver, whereas the Republicans are at mid-field with more opportunity to swing round the ends or to plunge down the middle than they've had in a decade.

PRESIDENT JOHNSON, with two let-slip opportunities to sense the desire of the people for rest and recuperation, is given little chance of trimming governmental costs, calming the summer season street riots or the school-session demonstrations of the campus. He might have established—as some of us predicted—an era of good feeling if he had set out to do so after winning his own term in 1964 or after getting nearly all that he demanded from the first session of the 89th Congress.

BUT THE PRESIDENT ignored the advice of his Senate Leader, Mike Mansfield, and did not make 1966 a time for re-examining and refining all the hasty lawmaking of '65. It is too

Bob Kennedy, who has rushed to the far-out Left, so that he advocates still bigger spending, still greater license for trouble-makers, an assortment of accommodation with the Viet Cong and the Red Chinese.

WHAT FUTURE has such a party in the sentiments that the electorate expressed at the November polls? But behold the GOP!

At the very worst, it has a vacuity in Gov. George Romney that hasn't been matched for non-commitalism since Coolidge or for good looks since Harding. If the country should gravitate toward neo-Goldwaterism in the next two years, there is Ronald Reagan, who showed that neither experience nor demagoguery was required to win big in a big state.

IF A MODISH progressive Republican comes into vogue, the three-term Gov. Nelson Rockefeller has only to do what has been done before and recant his vows of non-participation. If dark horses are called for, it will be easy to harness up Gov. James Rhodes or Sen. Chuck Percy, and there are off-beat running mates in the stable, such as Sens. Edward Brooke and Jacob Javits. Finally, the old party favorite. Dick Nixon, could be paraded to the track under the combined colors of every segment of

The real mystery is why there has been so much suspicion engendered that someone contrived with Oswald as an accomplice to commit the crime. For there is clear evidence of the grudge of one individual. It is surprising that this has not been given more attention.

THE RECORDS of the Warren Commission, for instance, show that Lee Harvey Oswald was transferred from active duty in the Marine Corps in 1959 under honorable conditions, but later, when it was learned that he had defected to Russia, he was given an "undesirable" discharge from the Marine Corps Reserves. He was still proud of his service in the Marine Corps and attempted to have the taint removed from his discharge papers. He wrote to the then Secretary of the Navy, John B. Connally, on Jan. 30, 1962, a letter in which he said: "I shall employ all means to ght this gross mistake or injustice

MR. CONNALLY, who had already resigned to run for governor of Texas, wrote back to Oswald that he had forwarded the letter to his successor in the Navy Department. But Oswald continued to nurture his grievance and, when he heard that the Texas governor was going to be in Dallas, may well have made up his mind to get revenge. Gov. Connally told the Commission in his testimony: "I am not at all sure he was shooting at me. I think I could with some ogic argue either way."

BUT THE FACT remains that Oswald was deeply affected by the "undesirable" discharge and sought redress. He owned a rifle and apparently had no hesitancy in using it. The Warren Commission said in its

"Even though Oswald apparently did not express any hostility against the President or Gov. Connally, he continued to be concerned about his undesirable discharge. It is clear that he thought he had been unjustly treated. . . . He continued his efforts to reverse the discharge by petitioning the Navy discharge review board, which finally declined to modify the discharge and so advised him in a letter dated July 25, 1963."

"IT SHOULD be noted that Marina cause Oswald might have had other she thought her husband 'was shooting at Connally rather than President . . At the time Oswald fired the shots at the presidential limousine, the governor occupied the seat in front of the President, and it would have been almost impossible for Oswald to have hit the governor without hitting the President

IT HAS BEEN inferred that, because Oswald might have had other and more favorable opportunities to strike at the governor, he would not have taken the risk of shooting Connally when he was riding with President Kennedy. But all this ignores the age-old fact that murderers often are governed not by logic but by strange impulses and even may choose a dramatic situation in order to gain public notice. Also, while some plan their crimes a long time in advance, others act on the spur of the moment.

The net result of all the evidence is that Lee Harvey Oswald was bitter and vengeful, not merely against Gov. Connally but against the government of the United States as a whole because he felt he had been unjustly treated. The idea that someone else was involved has nothing tangible to support it. 


