Ninety-Two Seniors To Receive Degrees

ONE GOOD THING that has come out of the farm strike, or American Agriculture Movement is the new political awareness that has been generated by the movement.

"The farmers went to Washington in an attempt to save agriculture. They came home intent on saving their country," said candidate Jim Reese in a recent visit to the county.

Political observers cannot remember when as much interest has been expressed at the grassroots of the political organizations—the precinct and county conventions.

All across the county, the precinct conventions were packed, with people not only interested, but prepared to offer resolutions, and to argue in their behalf. The same was true of the Democratic and Republican county conventions this past week.

A longtime Democratic leader remarked that this was a big improvement from the days when you had to call around on the day of the convention, to make sure you had enough party faithful at the precinct convention to elect your slate of delegates to the upcoming county convention.

As was indicated in the above statement concerning the farmers, in getting familiar with the political processes, and finding out what was going on, a number of folks who previously had not been that interested in politics are suddenly becoming well versed on such subjects as gun control laws, foreign investors bidding to take over certain industries, the "one-world" movement promulgated by the Trilateral commission, along with several others.

Our nation was founded by basically a group of farmers, who carved from the wilderness the original farmsteads. It may be that our farmers have started the ball rolling toward getting our nation back under the control of its people, as it was originally established.

If this happens, then the farmers will have earned the most profitable return they could have ever achieved on their investment.

ON THE SUBJECT of farmers, we were given this bit of information, which they may wish to use to their benefit.

Next Wednesday, May 24, a special agricultural "Hot Line" will be operated, during which members of congress, particularly those interested in agriculture, will speak with callers on the subject "Agriculture today: What should the American people know about it?"

With all of the attention that has been focused on the farm situation in recent months, the Agriculture Council of America plans to communicate the facts about the current economic situation in agriculture.

Farmers, ranchers and ag-related businessmen nationwide are urged to express their views on the topic by calling ACA's toll-free number, 1-800-368-8050 on Wednesday, May 24, between 11 a.m. and 3 p.m.

Information gathered will be used in a new comprehensive effort to communicate the facts about agriculture.

Tom Foley (D-Wash.), chairman of the House agriculture committee, and Senator Carl Curtis (R-Neb.), member of the senate agriculture committee, will head up the panel of experts on the farm economy that will answer the phones and speak with callers. They will be joined by other members of Congress who deal directly with farm and food issues, and spokesmen for the White House and USDA.

Those unable to complete their calls will be asked to put their comments in writing and mail them in so they will become a part of this fact-gathering program.

Hearing Called On Water Problem

The Friona City Council, following a discussion precipitated by a petition bearing 139 names of residents in Western and Lakeview addition, called a public hearing for Wednesday, June 1, to discuss the need for water improvements, especially for the western portion of the city.

City manager Jake Outland displayed a map of the city showing the water mains, towers and pump stations, and pointed out that an additional tower would be the best solution to the low water pressure problem.

Outland said that a new tower would cost in the neighborhood of \$400,000 and would require a bond issue.

The problem of law enforcement procedures was taken up. Chief of Police Denney pointed out that he had lost another patrolman, and that it was impossible to give 24-hour police coverage with three persons. He also emphasized that it was hard to keep patrolmen at the salary currently being paid by the city.

A motion was passed that the police chief and city manager make certain pay adjustments, staying within the city's current budget, and that further salary increases be included for all city employees in the coming year's budget.

Bids were opened for excavation of approximately 5500 cubic yards of dirt for sanitary landfill use. Only two bids were received, with Lovvorn's Dirt Movers of Farwell the low bidder at 50 cents per cubic yard. Lovvorn was awarded the contract.

Bids were reviewed for furnishing the City of Friona bulk gasoline for the coming year. It was noted that one local bulk dealer had not had the opportunity of submitting a bid, so the matter was tabled, with bids to be considered again next month.

A brief report was made on the status of Prairie Acres Nursing Home, noting that the financial statements from the home have been in the black for the past two months. The average occupancy continues to increase.

Mailbox Week Set May 22-27

The Postal Service designates a week during May each year when customers on rural, city motorized, and contract delivery mail routes are encouraged to examine and improve, where necessary, the appearance of their mailboxes.

The week of May 22-27 has been selected this year. The purpose of Mailbox Improvement Week is to call attention to the need for providing mail receptacles which are designed to protect the mail from the weather and are neat in appearance, conveniently located, and safe to use. "Neat, attractive mailboxes make a significant contribution to the appearance of the countryside and the streets in suburban areas," said Postmaster Richard Wilson.

Where box numbers are assigned, rural route box numbers must be shown on the side of the box visible to the approaching carrier, or on the door where boxes are grouped. If the box is located on the street other than the one on which the customer resides, the street name and house number must be inscribed on the box.

In all instances, placing the owner's name on the box is optional. Generally, boxes should be installed with the bottom of the box between three and one-half and four feet from the roadway. However, due to varying road and curb conditions, and other factors, it is recommended that customers contact the postmaster or carrier prior to initially erecting or replacing their mailbox and support.

On city motorized routes with curbside delivery, it is recommended that the box be either the approved traditional rural type box or an approved suburban box of contemporary design. Boxes designed primarily for use by customers receiving door delivery are difficult to serve efficiently from a vehicle and their use is not encouraged.

However, any box that gives protection to the mail and allows safe, convenient delivery from the carrier's vehicle is acceptable. Boxes should be installed with bottom of the box between three and one-half and four feet from the roadway. Where boxes are not located directly in front of the customer's residence, the house number must be shown on the box.

When a mailbox is newly installed or an unsuitable receptacle is replaced on contract delivery routes, and approved box of either the traditional rural type or contemporary design must be installed.

Mailboxes on both rural and contract routes must be located on the right-hand side of the road in the direction traveled by the carrier. The box must be placed and served to comply with state laws and highway and postal regulations. The carrier must have access without having to leave the vehicle.

Supports for mailboxes should be of adequate strength and size to properly support the box. Reports have been received that some mailbox supports are so massive that they are damaging the vehicles and causing serious injuries to the people who accidentally strike them.

The use of heavy metal posts, concrete posts, and miscellaneous items of farm equipment, such as milk cans filled with concrete, should be avoided. The ideal support is an assembly which, if struck, will bend or fall away from the striking vehicle instead of severely damaging the vehicle and injuring its occupants.

Democrats Name State Delegates

Parmer County Democrats elected four delegates and three alternates to the state convention in a harmonious county convention at Friona last Saturday, May 13. The meeting was well-attended, with virtually all of the county's elected delegates at the meeting.

Delegates elected were Hollis Horton, Jerry Fancher, Ralph Roming and Jerry Don Glover. Alternates selected were Sue Fancher, Donna Roming and Donna Glover.

The state convention will be held in Austin in September.

Following the election of delegates the convention passed a total of nine resolutions, which will be forwarded to the state Democratic Convention which will be asked to consider the resolutions.

Resolutions included one supporting the state's right to work law; and a resolution calling for stricter guidelines for the Texas Education Agency, which was criticized for the types of programs and requirements it places upon local school districts.

Resolution number three objected to the establishing of government-regulated child care centers for pre-schoolers, which are supposed to make it easier for mothers to work, but could turn the youngsters into a

military-type program at an early age.

Two other resolutions objected to extending the time limit for states to approve the Equal Rights (ERA) amendment, and the use of tax funds for promoting the IWY (International Woman's Year.)

A sixth resolution was passed objecting to the use of tax dollars for abortions.

A pair of resolutions were passed which were sponsored by the American Agriculture Movement. One objected to foreign investors in the state, calling for such foreign investors to be subject to the same tax structure as American citizens. The article also asked that such foreign investors be given a time limit to sell their property, or see the property liquidated and confiscated.

The other proposal called for the support of the AAM's five-point program, which calls for 100 per cent of parity, creation of an entity composed of agricultural producers to devise and approve policies that affect agriculture.

The final resolution opposed the registration of firearms, calling for support of the right to bear arms. It denied the use of tax dollars to enforce the registering of firearms.

Parmer County's Republican party, in its county convention at Bovina last Saturday, passed a total of 12 resolutions to be forwarded to the state convention, and selected a slate of three delegates to the meeting.

Delegates elected were Ellen Estes of Bovina; Ron Awtrey of Friona and Jimmy Briggs of Lazbuddie.

Resolutions passed included favoring the five-point proposals by the American Agriculture Movement, calling for 100 per cent parity and more control by farmers over their commodities; opposition to the United Kingdom Treaty which exempts foreign investors from paying taxes required of American citizens; and opposing the Human Rights Covenants which denies rights of private property holdings.

Other resolutions urged repeal of the Supreme Court ruling that requires school children to be bussed away from the school in their neighborhood, called for the abolishment of Daylight Savings Time, and called for reforms in the Welfare program to eliminate fraud and abuse.

Another resolution asked for elected Republican officials to uphold the party platform; and another called for our nation's defense and military be kept sufficient to prevent an enemy attack.

Resolution number nine asked for an amendment to prohibit deficit spending except during national emergencies and limiting govern-

ment services, as a means of curbing inflation.

Resolution number ten called for the resignation of William F. Brock III from the Trilateral Commission and as chairman of the Republican party.

An 11th resolution passed asked the Texas Legislature to rescind its ratification of the E.R.A. amendment, and urged those states which have not yet acted on ratification to reject the amendment.

The final resolution passed urged that all attempts to extend the deadline for ratification of the E.R.A. be rejected.

Demos, GOP Ready For Runoff Voting

Texas Democrats found out this week what some had suspected ever since the May 6 primary--there will be a runoff for one of the statewide Democratic nominations.

The runoff will be in the race for Railroad Commissioner, unexpired term, between John Poerner and Jerry Sadler. Sadler is the former state official who alienated voters to the extent that they turned him out of office in 1974. They apparently forgot this on May 6, however, since he led the four-man field seeking the commissioner's spot.

In six of the eight Parmer County precincts, this will be the only issue on the June 3 runoff ballot for the Democrats. Voters in the Bovina and Rhea precincts have a commissioner's race to spark their turnout. Jack Patterson and Glenden Sudderth are the candidates.

Hollis Horton, County Democratic chairman, said that he had secured permission to consolidate some voting boxes for the Democratic runoff. Black, Lakeview and Friona precincts will all vote in Friona. The Oklahoma Lane precinct will vote at Farwell. Rhea and Bovina will remain as planned, because of the commissioner's race.

"This was done in order to save on election expenses, and due to the fact that in the majority of the precincts, where only the state race will be considered, the vote is expected to be light," Horton said.

Area Republicans have good reason to turn out for the runoff election, as candidates Jim Reese and George Bush, Jr. are meeting

for the GOP nomination for U.S. Congress to oppose Kent Hance.

Absentee voting for the runoffs will begin Wednesday, May 24 in the county clerk's office, and runs through May 30.

A special booth will be manned one day only at Friona for absentee voting on Friday, May 26 at the Friona Credit Union office. Voters in the Friona area who don't want to miss the runoff election are urged to take advantage of this special service and cast their ballots on that day if they think they might be gone on June 3.
