Traffic Toll Slowly Inches **Ahead Today**

The nation's traffic toll climbed slowly in the early hours of the New Year's holiday.

The count reached 73 early today. The 30-hour. holiday period which began at 6 p.m. Tuesday

ends at midnight tonight. The National Safety Council has estimated that 200 to 260 persons may die in highway accidents during the holiday

The safety council said about 95 persons normally are killed in traffic in an average nonholiday period of this length at this time of year. But t added that a higher concentration of traffic is more likely during a one-day holiday than during any other similar driving period.

Zero cold discouraged travel, and sometimes prevented it, in a large part of the midcontinent Added to this were hazards of rain and snow in the Northwest and rain, fog and snow in the

Jordan Reports New Air Action

A flareup of Israeli air action was reported by Jordan today on the heels of the U.N. Security Council's condemnation of Israel for its attack on Beirut International Airport.

NEAR AQABA

A Jordanian army spokesman in Amman said two Israeli helicopters escorted by a jet fighter machine-gunned Jordanian forces in the Gharandal area north of the port of Agaba this morning

He added that two other Israeli jets flew over the southern Jordanian city of Maan but were driven off by antiaircraft

There was no confirmation of the action from the Israelis But an Israeli army spokes-

vat Shomneh near the Lebanese border. The spokesman said the rockets were believed to have been fired from Lebanon.

Israel's response to its third Security Council condemnation in 10 months was a denunctation of the council itself.

The 15 nation Security Council voted unanimously for the condemnation and declared Lebanon was entitled to compensation for 13 civilian aircraft worth more than \$40 million which were destroyed by Israeli commandos in a daring raid on Beirut airport Saturday

In addition to the rocket attack on Kiryat Shmonen, shellings were reported at Kfar Yuval and Margaliot, but an army spokesman said there were no casualties in the two frontier settlements.





A hint of future trouble came when Gov.-elect Preston Smith named Vernon A. McGee, as one of his top assistants. McGee will head a new office charged with program development, including intergovernmental and community relations and evaluation of state programs. The budget director, who normally reports directly to the governor, will henceforth go through McGee.

What titillates observers is the fact that House Speaker, now Lt Gov elect Ben Barnes, engineered the firing of McGee as director of the Legislative Budget Board in 1966;

Barnes charged that McGee worked too closely with the Senate, giving senators an advantage over House members in conference committees which prepare the state's budget. At the time Smith stoutly opposed the removal of McGee who had been the director of the budget board since

it was established in 1950. The relations between Smith and Barnes have been a bit distant Barnes did his best to reform the Zrules of the House, but when he asked for similar reforms in Senate rules Smith would have none of it.

The essential business of the state probably will not be affected should a governor and a lieutenant governor work to some extent at cropurposes. We trust that this will not become a reality and an impediment

DALLAS (AP) - Dallas has the nation's most impressive figures on the low rate of joblessness. How did this come about?

The reasons are complex but seems that jobs generate jobs, say the work force observers.

At the same time, some persons question the official unemployment figures but there is no indication that Dallas' jobless percentage is affected by anything to which other cities are in Dallas.



Last Friday he said his last "good morning, breakfast clubbers," carried on the program much as he had for the past 351/2 years. When he signed off, it was for keeps. With the Breakfast Club went the last major radio network program originating in Chicago, once, the nerve center for much of the nation's broadcasting.






