Durbin Wins Texas' High **Court Fight**

AUSTIN (AP) — The Texas Supreme Court first denied and then 10 minutes late granted Clyde Durbin Jr., accused in the slayings of two University of Texas students, the right to seek a writ forcing the trial to proceed here June 2.

The court will hear oral arguments at 9 a.m. Wednesday on Durbin's petition for a writ of

Judge Sears McGee told The Associated Press that the first vote was 4-4, with one judge registering present but not voting. Five votes are needed to grant an application for a writ of mandamus petition. The judge not voting the first time then decided to vote, McGee said, making it 5-4 in Burbin's favor.

Durbin seeks to force Dist, Judge Tom Blackwell to try him next week, as previously scheduled. Blackwell granted a state motion earlier this month to postpone the Austin trial until Oct. 27. In his answer to the application, Blackwell had said Durbin "demands a speedy trial only in Travis

Durbin, 21, of Dallas, is charged in the slaying of John Albert White, 21, of Corpus Christi in Austin. He is charged in the slaying of Miss Keitha Morris, 19, of White Deer in Burnet County, 55 miles northwest of Austin.

Police Station Raked

Fire Chief Lewis Edwards, who was in the station; suffered minor cuts from flying glass.

Most of the officers on duty were out on patrol when the shooting occurred. Authorities said the fire was not returned by police.

Additional state police were brought into Cairo following the outbreak.

Police said they had numerous reports of cars being shot at during the night. One officer said he was fired upon.

Astros Return From Moon

ABOARD USS PRINCETON July. They rehearsed all phases discovery, the Apollo 10 moon actual touchdown. explorers came safely home from the heavens Monday, blazing back through earth's atmosphere to a bull's eye landing in the South Pacific within sight of the recovery ship Princeton.

They were quickly hoisted aboard the ship. America's newest space

heroes ended man's greatest and most dangerous space adventure when their sturdy sixton spaceship parachuted into gently rolling seas about three miles from the Princeton.

Air Force Col. Thomas P. Stafford and Navy Cmdrs. John W. Young and Eugene A. Cernan landed at 12:52 p.m., ENT The touchdown was about 400 miles east of Pago Pago, just at dawn in this part of the world. As the craft descended, its tracking lights blinked in the

semidarkness. The pinpoint landing was a fitting climax to the near-flawless eight-day flight, a final dress rehearsal which cleared the way for two astronauts to walk on the moon in less than two months.

"We are in great shape," Stafford radioed.

"We should be right on top of you if you're down there," Stafford radioed minutes before

Television pictures, relayed through a communications satellite, enabled millions of Americans to share the triumphal return of the three astronauts. Viewers had a ringside seat

as cameras focused on Apollo 10 floating down from space, dangling under three orange and white parachutes. Hundreds of sailors wearing

dress white lined the deck of the Princeton and cheered as they watched the stirring sight. Helicopters spotted the astronauts several minutes before

the splashdown and were hovering overhead within minutes. Within minutes, Navy frogmen leaped from a helicopter. They attached a flotation collar and plugged in a telephone to

talk with the astronauts. Stafford, Young and Cernan traveled 76 hours outward to the moon, circled it 31 times in 611/2 hours and raced home along a 54-hour corridor. The flight last-

ed eight days, three minutes. They logged about 700,000 miles and Stafford and Cernan made man's closest approach to another celestial body, riding a lunar landing vehicle to within 9.4 miles of the moon to scout a landing site for Apollo 11 in

Five hours before homecoming, they beamed a final telecast, showing the fast-approaching earth in brilliant color and transmitting their thoughts on their magnificent Odyssey, Stafford summed up the feelings

this way: "I think the future of manned space flight from now and many generations to come is going to uncover many, many other challenges and experiences that we are really incapable of even conceiving at this time."

To reach the Pacific, the astronauts survived man's fastest re-entry through the atmos-

Apollo 10 slammed into the outer limits of the atmosphere 400,000 feet high at 24,694 miles arr hour, was punished by forces nearly seven times the pull of gravity and was blistered by heat of more than 5 000 degrees. The crew traveled 64 mph. faster than the Apollo 8 pilots on their return from the moon in December.

The craft's heat shield protected the craft from burning up and the temperature inside the cabin remained a comfortable 70 degrees

Before hitting the atmosphere, Stafford, Young and Cernan jettisoned a service module attached to the command ship. The shedding of this equipment bay reduced Apollo 10's weight from 31,500 to about 12,000 pounds.

During the hottest, fastest nications from the speeding vehicle were blacked out for about three minutes.

Right after blackout ended. two recovery force planes and the Princeton reported radar contact with the spaceship

Minutes later, the ship, dan gling under its parachutes, came within view of the ship. The thickening atmosphere

braked the speed, making it possible for three small parachutes to pop out and stabilize the spacecraft. Ships and planes quickly picked up the descending ship on radar.

At 10,000 feet, the three main 83.5-foot chutes blossomed majestically and Apollo 10 floated gently downward into the Pacific at a comparative snail's pace of 22 m.p.h

Three hours before re-entry the astronauts fired thrusters for 6.6 seconds to make a slight course adjustment that zeroed them in on the landing site.

Witness Stand Appearance By Ray In Memphis Looms

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) -James Earl Ray, admitted assassin of civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., was denied a new trial today.

Judge Arthur C. Faquin Jr. held that the evidence. showed Ray had voluntarily and in good faith entered a guilty plea to the slaving. Under Tennessee law, the judge held, such a plea precludes a motion for a new trial, for postconviction remedies or an appeal.

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) -James Earl Ray went back into court today and asked a full trial on a charge of murdering Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.-a crime he admitted with a guilty plea 11 weeks ago.

Ray, constantly shifting in his seat behind his attorneys, heard a criminal court clerk testify that Ray gave no answer when his trial judge asked him whether he had been promised anything except a 99-year term in return for pleading guilty.

"There is no answer," said clerk J. A. Backwell as Ray's attorney J. B. Stoner cross-examined him on court minutes and records the state had read into evidence at the new trial hear-

Blackwell read the record of Ray's trial March 10, when the late Criminal Court Judge W. Preston Battle accepted the guilty plea. Battle questioned Ray at length at the time, pointing out repeatedly that a guilty plea would waive his right to an appeal in the death of King. Ray, serving 99 years in the

Nashville state prison, was

brought to Memphis Thursday and had since been held under heavy security precautions in the county jail.

A witness stand appearance by the 41-year-old prisoner would have interesting possibilities. At the time of his guilty plea his then lawyer, Percy Foreman, expressed in court a personal conviction that there was no conspiracy in the April, 1968. King assassination. Ray said "I don't agree," but did not

elaborate. Ray is asking a new deal in court on the grounds that his former attorneys did not provide him with adequate counsel and pressured him into a guilty plea. He also contends the subsequent death of Judge W. Preston Battle, who accepted the plea, guarantees him a new trial. The presiding judge for today's hearing. Arthur Faquin, will decide whether the case should be reopened and whether

But battlefield reports gave a ratio Saturday and Sunday of 24 to one, with 436 Viet Cong and North Vietnamese, 12 Americans and six South Vietnamese killed. Another 105 Americans and 16 South







The sense of urgency about ending the war in Vietnam is heightened every day as both the fighting and the peace talks continue. The Paris negotiations have been in progress for a full year now, with little ac-complished. During that year there have been at least 175,000 battle casualties, according to official Washington figures, including 11,700 Americans killed in action.

This is the stark backdrop against which the drama of efforts to achieve a settlement is being played. The great hope is that President Nixon's proposals, despite the early negative reaction from both the Viet Cong and Hanoi, will step up the sluggish pace of this drama and bring us with reasonable speed to the last act.

It is not mere optimism to entertain such hope. For though the negotiators in Paris often seem locked in a tableau, lately there have been signs of movement. President Nixon's proposals were broached less than a week after the 10-point plan of the National Liberation Front had been put forward. A wide divergence persists, but the important thing is that both sides have taken initiatives which give the negotiators specific items to discuss.

The Communists predictably seized upon this part of Nixon's plan, insisting again on a unilateral pullout by U.S. forces. THE PRESIDENT had one pur pose: de facto peace. He has given up, so far as Hanot will permit him "honorably" to do so, any idea of a military solution. He hopes that his speech will stimulate some offers in Paris, and he will not be very choosy about them. He did not say "peace at any price." but there are Democrats and Republicans in Congress who give the President's words that wishful translation.

Candidate Kennedy Is Speaking Out

WASHINGTON - Sen. Edward M. Kennedy has already begun his campaign to win the Democratic presidential nomination in 1972. Many Democrats as well as Republicans. however, think he is making mistake some of the criticism he is direction against the Nixon administration.

Within the last few days, the Massachusetts senator has openly questioned the tactics of the American military chiefs in the midst of a war He spoke, for instance, of the "madness" of the full-scale offensive on "hamburger hill" near the Laotian border, and challenged President Nixon to issue new orders to his field commanders to cut back offensives of that kind. He said that such operations are menaingless and that it is "senseless and irresponsible" to continue them.

THE COMMANDERS in Saigon are amazed at this. One of them said: "If we had wanted to let the enemy stay on the hill, then we would have had to call off the entire operation. And that would have invited the enemy to stockpile supplies for new offensives. In the long run, this would have cost more American lives than we lost on the hill.

"HAMBURGER HILL" got its nickname, as officers said, because "it chews people up like meat." It has been a vital target for assault and is not the only position in mountainous areas which has been attacked by American forces. The paratroops who took the hill found communication wires and other evidence that it was a major headquarters for the North Vietnamese and was linked to Laos and to communist positions in South Vietnam

Undoubtedly Mr. Kennedy is well aware that the comments he has made are bound to be popular with antiwar segments of the electorate and that he might thereby attract votes from both parties. But history reveals that this type of campaign can backfire.

POLITICALLY SPEAKING. anybody who starts out early in a contest for the presidential nomina-

tion runs the risk of antagonizing other members of his own party, some of whom at present are in favor of Sen. McCarthy or Sen. Muskie or former Vice President Humphrey, Inthe presidential primaries that preceded the last election, there were plenty of Democrats who did not vote for Sen. Robert F. Kennedy of New York because of his delay in entering the race. It seems plausible that his brother, the Massachusetts senator, has taken into account the necessity for getting a start ahead of all other possible nominees

THE KENNEDY FAMILY, ... of course, has ample financial resources for political campaigns and has been successful in gaining the support of many local organizations, primarily in the cities throughout the country where the Democrats are in control. 'IN ORDER FOR Sen. Kennedy to

get the presidential nomination, there would have to be a feeling among the delegates that he had a good chance or winning the presidency, and he would have to count on a united party after he was nominated. So what the Massachusetts senator does between now and 1972 and the strategy he himself employs in his speeches will have a bearing on whether his popularity will be such as to enable him to win the nomination when the next Democratic national convention is held. Some politicians feel that there are plenty of domestic issues on which Edward Kennedy could seek voter support without becoming involved in international controversies, especially during war time.
