APPROVE WELFARE, AID TO SURVIVORS, STUDENT LOAN AMENDMENTS

Inquest Set In Kenncdy Accident

BOSTON (AP) - Dist. Atty. Edmund Dinis said today that an inquest will be held into Sen. Edward M. Kennedy's July 18 auto accident on Chappaquiddick Island and that "all witnesses" who have anything to contribute will be called.

Dinis did not say specifically however, whether Kennedy himself would be asked to testify. But Kennedy has said that he would do every-

thing possible to cooperate with an inquest. Dinis commented after Edgartown District Court Judge James A. Boyle declined to take any immediate action on a written request from Dinis for the inquest.

But Dinis said he was going ahead with the inquest anyway, moving under provisions of the state's inquest statute. That statue reads in part:

"The attorney general or the district attorney may . . . require an inquest to be held in the case of any death supposed to have been caused by external means.'

The accident claimed the life of a young secretary from Washington, D.C., Miss Mary Jo She was a passenger in Kennedy's car. It

plunged over the side of a narrow, rickety bridge on Chappaquiddick Island, off the Massachusetts coast, and landed upside down in a tidal pond. Kennedy escaped without serious injury, but Miss

Kopechne was trapped. A medical examiner attributed her death to accidental drowning.

Short Wins House Seat

LUBBOCK, Tex. (AP) - Voters in the 73rd District elected farmer-businessman E. L. Short, Tahoka, to the legislature Tuesday. He beat Andrews attorney Jim Clack handily in the runoff, winning all six counties in the district except Clack's home county.

Short got 3,699 votes, or 62.4 per cent of the 5,927 votes cast. Clack polled 2,085.

The seat at stake belonged to State Rep. Randy Pendleton of Andrews, named by Gov. Preston Smith to head a federal-state relations office in

Short led Clack in an indecisive, nine-candidate election earlier this year after Smith called a special election

Clack won Andrews County 994-272, but Short won his own home county, Lynn, 1,001-208. Short's margin in the other counties: Dawson 1.043-277: Gaines 657-363; Martin 245-61; and Yoakum 408-155. Short farms and ranches 4,500 acres and runs a firm processing cottonseed for planting.

Decatur Sales Tax

DECATUR, Tex. (AP) - Voters in this North Central Texas town Tuesday approved a one per cent city sales tax by a margin of six to one. The vote was 336 to 56.

City officials said the tax, effective Jan. 1, will bring in \$20,000 to \$30,000 a year.

Missing Persons

SAIGON (AP) - U.S. officials expressed new concern today for about 40 American civilians missing in South Vietnam. The concern was prompted by the finding of the body of a U.S. agricultural specialist in a shallow grave near the Laotian border.

Announcement was made Tuesday in Washington of the finding of the remains of Thomas W. Ragsdale of Shelbina, Mo., who had been taken prisoner by the Viet Cong during the Tet offensive

in February, 1968. An official announcement in Saigon said: "M. Ragsdale's tragic death while a prisoner of Communist forces in South Vietnam adds to our great concern over the fate and welfare of other U.S. civilians illegally detained."

About 30 of the missing civilians are believed to be prisoners of the Viet Cong. In Today's HERALD

Strongly For

Howard Countians gave an impressive 4-1 margin of approval to the Texas Water Plan in voting on state constitutional amendments Tuesday, and turned down by a 3-1 margin a proposal to raise legislators'

Total vote was shown as 2,161, somewhat larger than most observers had forecast, although the figure was less than 20 per cent of the county's voting strength. Strong campaigning in behalf of the water amendment was credited with stimulating voter interest.

Of nine propositions on the ballot, the local vote was against four, while five were

The county gave about two-toone approval of an increase in state welfare payments, which proposition was carrying handily over the state.

In addition to voting against legislative pay increases, Howard voters turned down the idea of one-year sessions of the legislature, the raising of ceiling on interest rates for state bonds, and the granting of ad valorem tax exemption to nonprofit water supply cor-

Mutscher and Lt. Gov. Ben Barnes had planned to push again for a one-year budget and minimal tax bill if the voters had approved a constitutional amendment Tuesday requiring annual legislative sessions to pass taxes and appropriations. But the amendment was turned down, and Mutscher made public his tax plans bright and early, and the committee approved them with only one dissenting voice.

The committee was about 20 minutes late in meeting because of a session first in Mutscher's office. A source denied any pressure for unanimity was applied, but there was far less contention than was expected. ADDED REVENUE

Residents in places with 1 per cent city sales taxes would pay 41/2 per cent both on currently taxable items and on services the measure would bring under the sales tax.

But the percentage the state comptroller rakes off for collecting the city sales tax would be rigged to keep the cities from getting any added revenue from expanding the tax base to include services. Rep. R. H. Cory of Victoria, one of the bill writers, said the

formula might have to be adjusted later if the tax on services turns out to be more or less lucrative than expected. By withholding from the cit ies the added sales tax income

resulting from taxation of services, \$23 million extra would be gained by the state. "Municipal authorities saw no need for extra money for municipal governments at this

time," Mutscher asserted. He added that the cities might later be allowed to keep the sales tax revenue from services if they need the income. \$40 MILLION The speaker said the state

would be giving up \$40 million by making the tax bill effective Jan. 1 instead of the normal date of Oct. 1.

"Maybe this will give the people an opportunity to do their Christmas shopping without new taxes," Mutscher said. He said consumers would be

paying 47.8 per cent of the total tax bill, with 28.8 per cent of it on what he termed "luxuries" and 23.4 per cent paid by busi-

Rep. Will Smith of Beaumont was the only committee member to request that he be shown voting against the bill, which came out of committee on a voice vote.

STACK OF PETITIONS He referred to a stack of petitions on the committee table, and read from one of them that expressed strong opposition to any tax on laundry of household linens and diapers.

"This is not for me, Mr. Chairman," he said. Smith declared he would not ask for a record vote and "embarass anybody any more than they are embarassed already by

sitting at this table." He asked if repeal of the chain store tax over the next six years were "absolutely necessary . . . I understand it is the purpose of

the tax bill to raise money." Rep. Ben Atwell of Dallas, the committee chairman, said the tax is inequitable and a relic of the days when Texas was trying to keep interstate chain stores out and to encourage state-owned businesses.

Legislators Lose Bid For Pay Raise

The Texas Water Plan went down to defeat in Tuesday's constitutional amendment voting while Texans gave an okay to higher welfare payments.

The Texas Election Bureau, unofficial vote counter for the state, said the latest figures show the water plan trailing by 5,545 votes with only 2,700 to 2,800 votes left to be totaled.

But taxpayers, faced with human suffering, opened their pocketbooks.

They balloted for a \$20 million raise in welfare ceilingsmostly to help needy childrenby a massive margin of almost two-to-one. And they approved aid to survivors of state workers killed on hazardous duty by a better than 3-2 edge.

Voters turned down a pay raise for state legislators, exemptions from property taxes for non-profit water corporations, and annual legislative ses-

Also defeated was removal of the interest ceiling on state bonds. The present 4 and 5 per cent ceiling makes them hard

Approved were an increase in the revolving fund for student loans and a cleanup of obsolete sections of the Texas Constitu-

The water plan was only a beginning of the vast project which is designed to bring water from other states and possibly Canada to South Texas, North Central Texas, the Panhandle, the High Plains and on to El Paso via canals.

The state would issue \$ lion in bonds as needed, causing some state outlay until water users began repaying the costs. The federal government would spend \$5.5 billion under the

TO VOTE AGAIN

Sponsors of the water project say it can be submitted to voters again, and the history of bond issues in Texas is that it sometimes takes two or even three votes for passage.

But the huge opposition Tuesday would be embarrassing to negotiators when and if they finally start negotiating with other states for their water. Opposition already has arisen in Louisiana.

The pattern of the water vote showed that the greater number of counties against it was in South and Central Texas and areas along the Red River and near the Louisiana border. One huge canal would go along some

A stretch of about two counties below the Red River in North Central and Northeast Terra voted for the water project.

The Panhandle, South Pla and far South Texas also favored the plan except, notably, Cameron and Aransas counties

All the Lower Rio Grande Valley counties favored the project except Cameron. The Valley, water experts say, will be the first region to feel a creeping shortage of water.

The 10 largest cities, which can dominate any election, had such an erratic response that no pattern could be discerned on the basis of the "big city vote." Harris County struck the project a hard blow with a margin of 67,719 against and 13,431 for.

Conservationists, notably the Sierra Club, may have just provided the margin to provide the somewhat unexpectedly high vote against the water program.

The conservationists first talked about the plan destroying the habitat of game, even destroying species.

But then they got down to the citizens' purse, and talked about the cost. Even the sponsors admitted that interest would double the \$3.5 billion to \$7 billion. And the plan was on the basis of 1967 costs of material, labor, land and interest.

Only nine months ago, voters soundly defeated a proposal to raise the welfare ceiling in the Constitution to \$75 million from the present \$60 million.

PRETTY TOUGH Then two court cases caused checks for needy children to be cut, some poverty mothers in Dallas held a sit-in, and Public Welfare Commissioner Burton Hackney campaigned throughout Texas and suddenly the voters were convinced of the need for more money for the 400,000 on welfare.

After all, said Hackney, it is pretty difficult to raise a child on \$12.50 a month, And he pointed out that all but five per cent of needy mothers workbut some work for 50 cents an hour.

The second time around did not work as well for legislators as it did for the needy. They lost an attempt at a raise nine months ago-they haven't had one since 1960. This time they tried to take their pay out of the Constitution and peg it to that of district judges— but not at once. They wanted to climb from \$4,800 annually to \$6,800not to the \$18,000 judges now re-

BOND INTEREST

The legislators also wanted legislative sessions, some saying it was illogical to budget the state for two years. They tried three years ago and were turned down and lost again Tuesday.

The constitutional deletions took 52 sections-such things as authority to build the Capitol, dedicated in 1888-from the Constitution. Some persons wanted to keep these sections for their

Safeguard Supporters Increasingly Confident

ICC Needs Reform

Every modern American president, not long after taking office, has recognized the need for improvements in the independent regulatory agencies. Despite their broad powers and great impact on the American economy and social order, these semiautonomous agencies have proved highly resistant to reform.

President Nixon has now called for a limited revision of the oldest of the agencies, the Interstate Commerce Commission established in 1887. At first mainly a railroadregulating agency created under the pressure of the Populist party, the ICC has come to exercise most of the supervisory powers over transportation delegated from Congress' constitutional authority to regulate interstate commerce.

It has regulatory authority, most importantly over rates, covering railroads, trucks and buses, inland and coastal waterways, express com-panies and freight forwarders. It has been at odds at times with the Justice Department over mergers, with the Securities Exchange Commission over securities issuances, and with the Maritime Administration over jurisdiction. The strongest criticism

has been, however, that it has been laggard in working for a wellcoordinated nationwide transportation system, and particularly for not doing more to prevent the decline of rail passenger service for which a comeback may now be foreseen.

President Nixon's initial proposal is logical enough. He would have the President appoint the ICC chairman - as he now does all other regulatory agency commission heads - rather than have the chairmanship rotate annually among the commission's 11 members. And he would give the chairman more administrative authority for better management and continuity of policy

President Nixon says he will meanwhile explore other ways to make the commission structure more effective. This, too, would appear to be in order, especially since the creation by the Johnson administration in 1966 of the Department of Transportation, which is primarily charged with developing a coordinated nationwide transportation system taking full advantage of technological advances. The division of responsibility between that new department and the ICC requires clarification.

Consumers Should Speak

House tax writers appear to be abandoning the 50-50 approach of Gov. Preston Smith in dividing the new tax load between business and individual consumers.

Of course, it may be argued that the poor consumer pays, that no matter how or where you put a levy, it trickles down. In a large sense, this is true, but if no tax is ever put elsewhere, the consumer ends up with the total tax load, swift and

Somehow, even though business will

pass along a tax charge as part of the cost of doing business, a certain amount of it will be absorbed by the business and never trickles all the

House members should know that the natives are getting restless and that while they expect to bear their fair share of the load, they will not countenance being saddled with the total load. It would be well if individual taxpayers let their legislators hear from them on this point.

Laos Crisis

Brought To Head By Military Conflict

VIENTIANE, Laos (AP) - When Prince Souvanna Phouma returned from his annual vacation in France the diplomatic corps turned out to meet him. The Russian ambassador immediately aligned himself with the American ambassador and the two fell into animated conversation.

The Chinese charge d'affaires stood apart across the room.

These alignments are perhaps prophetic of political evolution in this Southeast Asian kingdom, A political crisis has been brought to a head by military conflict and it will almost certainly require outside influence to

Some people say that the early Christians practiced communism. Does the Bible support this view?

Probably those who advocate this base their argument on two Scriptures in Acts: "And all that believed were together, and had all things common; and sold their possessions and goods, and parted them to all men as every man had need." and, "And the multitude of them that believed were of one heart and soul: neither said any of them that ought of the things which he possessed was his own, but they had all things common." (Acts 2:44-45, and Acts 432.)

The above Scriptures indicate that the early Christians engaged in communal living temporarily in most unusual circumstances. But that is a great deal different than modern communism. The Christians of the Book of Acts acted in love; the Communists do not. The Christians prayed; the Communists confess that they do not. The Christians believed The Communists believe in no God. or, so they say. The Christians were filled with the Holy Spirit; the Communists do not even understand the person of the Holy Spirit. The Christians gave to every man as he had need. The Communists do not.

So, in the light of these Scriptures there is no similarity between the Christian communal living in the Book of Acts and modern com-

are currently looking hopefully to the Kremlin to make the next move. They see, however, a distinctly different situation from 1962 when, before the accords had ben signed, pro-Communist Pathet Lao forces captured two-thirds of the country.

PRESIDENT JOHN F. Kennedy then put muscle into his negotiations with Nikita Khrushchev by landing Marines in Thailand Shortly afterward, Khrushchev announced the Soviet Union "continued" to support a neutralist Laos. The pressure eased. The political-military abilities of the United States in Laos have been drastically altered by the Vietnam war. With strong opposition at home to further military involvement, the United States seems in no position to undertake intervention.

Peking, Moscow and Hanoi are certainly aware of this. Thus, with little fear of U.S. intervention, they can continue to support the present offensive. Barring a political settlement, it is likely to put the Communist-backed forces back in control of two-thirds of the kingdom within another year.

WHAT, THEN, might the Soviet Union have to gain or lose by the establishment of a "pro-Communist neutralist" Laos as opposed to the present "pro-Western neutralist"

The answer may depend on what political sway the Soviets expect to maintain among the Pathet Lao forces. That influence would have to be filtered through Hanoi, which has an estimated 48,000 troops now fighting in Laos.

The answer also would have to consider the Chinese influence among the Pathet Lao and in Hanoi. While this influence is not apparently strong in the Pathet Lao, the proximity of China is always to be considered.

Russia also has growing economic interests in Southeast Asia and maintains good relations with neighboring

THE SOVIET Union's current conflict with China is another factor. Should the Pathet Lao retake their old holdings down to the Lek River, Peking's interests would expand correspondingly

Against these negative aspects would be the prospect of greater Soviet political sway if the Kremlin supported Hanoi fully in expansionist plans for Indochina.

The Kremlin also could conceivably agree to letting the Pathet Lao regain its 1962 position and put in its own "neutralists" if they agreed not to attack the rightist forces but instead sought a new political settlement.

The balance indicates Russia would have more to gain, both politically and economically, by moving again to reduce the conflict and helping to restore a neutralist Laos.

IN THE space of half a century, it (I was never certain about the gender) has yielded its place of prominence and disappeared almost totally from the scene. I don't know that statistics are avaliable on the number, but I would make a wild guess that there were at least 2,000 of them in Howard County back around the early 1920's. Perhaps that sounds inflated, but then there were round a thousand farms, and there were precious few who had less than a span of mules - and most had several of these stalwart brutes.

DETRACTORS DELIGHTED in comparison which likened an individual to the mule - "no pride of ancestory and no hope of posterity." This was an unkind referance to the mule's status as a hybrid, which, only in the rarest of instances, was capable of producing an offspring.

THE MULE was an ungainly, awkward and ugly creature, and yet it was handsome and awe-inspiring in its own way. Many of them were huge animals, strength written all over them and particularly those great shoulders. They were placid, always seeingly half asleep. Those long ears, like a fugitive from a jackrabbit, wiggled rhythmically, lazily, sometimes in unison, sometimes at a total disregard for one another. And when they laid back like the swept wings of today's latest airplanes, it constituted a storm warn-

Power Of Regulatory Agencies WASHINGTON - President Nixon's "public interest."

proposal to reorganize the Interstate Commerce Commission so as to modernize its administrative operations - a revision which hasn't been undertaken for many years - brings up the question also of what might be done to improve the workings of other commissions in the federal government

Thus, the Federal Trade Commission has broad powers dealing with "unfair methods of competition" and unfair or deceptive acts or practices" in trade. The Federal Communications Commission was set up to regulate interstate and foreign communications by wire or radio. The Federal Power Commission deals with interstate aspects of the electricpower and natural-gas industries, though much of the regulation of the public utilities comes under state authority.

WHAT HAS happened in the last several decades is not merely an expansion of regulatory power by administrative agencies, but assumption of legislative authority as well. Many of the questions handled by federal commissions frequently bring challenges in the courts, which then endeavor to interpret the rulings in accordance with congressional statutes. But because so many new problems have arisen in recent years. it is apparent that federal agencies actually have undertaken legislative tasks and have, in effect, made laws on their own initiative.

IT IS TIME, therefore, for Congress to examine the scope of each agency and define more explicitly its regulatory powers. Also, there might well be better coordination by the agencies with the executive departments of the government so that cabinet officers would have an opportunity to give their views as to what is in the

THE FEDERAL Communications Commission is an example of how the authority of a federal gency can be interpreted to include powers that were never delegated to it by Congress. The law which created the commission states that licenses are to be issued on the basis of "public interest, convenience and necessity.' This means that reputable companies have to demonstrate their financial capacity to operate radio and television stations and provide service to the community. Also, licenses have to be issued in a manner that will prevent mechanical conflicts in the assignment of frequencies.

THERE IS NOTHING in the law which says that the FCC may censor programs, either news or advertising. But the Federal Communications Commission lately has been threatening to regulate the content of programs that deal with both news and advertising. A station might have its license withdrawn or its application for renewal denied if it does not obey the edicts of a federal agency.

THE FEDERAL Communications Commission currently is seeking to ban the advertising of cigarettes on radio or television on the grounds that smoking constitutes a hazard to health. It is the function of Congress, however, to protect the American people in such situations. If cigarettes are dangerous, then Congress should take steps to prohibit their manufacture and sale altogether. This could, of course, not be done without a constitutional amendment.

The attempt to ban cigarette advertising is only one of the many examples of usurpation by federal commissions of powers that belong to Congress and the people. (Copyright, 1969, Publishers - Half Syndicate)

nine-member Democratic Policy committee has instructed Majority Leader Mansfield to let the tax bill die unless it is accompanied by legislation to close the loopholes. A loophole is like a telescope in that you get a different distortion depending on which end you look through.
A Democrat like Long of Louisiana
sees large national benefits from the special tax privileges granted to the oil producers of his State. A Democrat like Proxmire abhors tax deductions allowed to petroleum (his State of Wisconsin has no oil), but sees lots of good in the protections given to dairy products (in which his State abounds). One man's loophole is another man's Christmas tree, and the tax bll languishes while inflation eats like acid into the economy.

A RATHOLE is not like a telescope, but is more like a tunnel. If it's your kind of rathole, you can see light at the other end. If it's the other fellow's tunnel, you're sure it's deadended. For example, some Senators aren't going to give Mr. Nixon his tax bill until he stops sending nevercome-back dollars into the poverty programs. They say the money is reaching whole colonies of bureaucrats and social planners and is turning the poverty-population into street rioters and revolutionaries.

OTHER SENATORS won't give Mr. Nixon his tax bill until he stops shoving dollars down the drain of military and super-Space programs.

WASHINGTON - You could call These Senators want the Vietnam War called off like a rained-out ballgame, the arms race cancelled and the Space race called quits at the Moon. One man's rathole is another man's rainbow. Some see the end of Poverty and warfare, while others see an ever-normal Prosperity, depending on what conditions are attached to the tax bill.

> THESE VARYING viewpoints on loopholes and ratholes are making discontent in the Senate and could make for a stalemate. The Democratic Policy committee is a good example of how men with different viewpoints agree to do nothing about the much-needed tax bill. Byrd of West Virginia doesn't want the extra money wasted on the Poverty War, and Hart of Michigan doesn't want it wasted on military weapons. Fulbright of Arkansas, Symington of Missouri and Kennedy of Massachusetts, along with Mansfield and Hart, are against the Vietnam war and against deployment of ABM. The President wants the tax in order to fight inflation, but the Senators of the Policy committee don't want him to use it for fighting something else. They are inclined to block the bill indefinitely. The Senate is living a summer of




