Dimmitt High School student body. At Texas Tech University, where he received his BBA degree in 1965, he served as vice president of the student body and president of his fraternity. Later, in the U. T. School of Law, he was elected president of his class, president of the Studen
Bar Association and received the Counsel Award for outstanding Bar Associdens.

As a professor in the College of Business Administration at Texas
Tech, a post which he resigned in 1973, Hance was selected as one of five outstanding professors. ive outstanding professors.
Hance also held many state and local positions during that period.
He served as a member of the board of regents of West Texas State He served as a member of the board of regents of West Texas State University from 1972 to 1974. In addition, he was on the Texas Citi-
zens Advisory Council, a study group for the purpose of solving state water problems.
Currently he is a member of the Lubbock, Texas and American Bar associations, Southwest Rotary Club, Lubbock Lions, Water Inc., the
Chamber of Commerce, and the Texas Tech Century Ciub. Chamber of Commerce, and the Texas Tech Century Ciub. In community service, Hance was one of the original incorporators of texas Boys Ranch in Lubbock, served as associate state chair-
man of the March of Dimes in 1972-73 and has taught in the college de partment of the First Baptist Church in Lubbock, where he is a member.
Hance and the former Carol Hays, also of Dimmitt, were married in 1964. They have two children, Ron, 13 and Susan, 9.

## Republican Foe Draws Verbal Barrage

Democrat Kent Hance levelled a barrage of charges at his Republican opponent in the Nov. 7 race for U. S. Congress, 19 . C District, during a face-to-face confrontation in Lubbock recently. Seated only inches away from George Bush during a joint
appearance before the Greater Lubbock Press Club, Hance claimed appear
that:
-Bush was "trying to buy the election"
He was deceiving voters in television advertising; and,
He was not making it clear which George Bush is running for office. Hance's blast on the campaign expenses followed a report published
in The Lubbock Avalanche-Journal indicating that Bush is running a well-financed campaign backed by a list of supporters resembling a Noting that much of the contributions came from out of the district, Hance said, "There's no doubt...it would seem he's trying to buy the election."

candidates. During the period from July 1 to Sept. 30, the reports indicated tha Bush raised approximately $\$ 27,650$ while spending $\$ 3$,
on the other hand, raised $\$ 7,822$ and spent $\$ 36,100$.
Bush's thick report listed 2,060 contributors, including such
notables as Mrs. Douglas McArthur, former ambassador, Anne

Armstrong, former Secretary of Defense Donald Rumsfeld, baseball commissioner Bowie Kuhn, and Peter OMalley, owner of the Los Angeles Dodgers. Many oil interests also were listed.
Hance particularly blasted Bush for compiling such a bloc of sup port from out of the district. He said it now "Is an issue and I think e people of the district need to be made aware of it." misleading in that they portray George as having lived in West Texas orever.

The Texas senator also charged that "There's somewhat of a

C., Houston, Dallas and Midland and his father-a former C1A director and Republican also is being mentioned as a possible presidential candidate in 1980 Bush, a New Haven, Conn., native who attended elementary and junior high schools in Midiand before moving to Houston with his business.
