Former Webb Pilot Lost


Word has been received here that Capt. Allen Trent, 31, has been missing in Cambodia for about six weeks and is presumed dead.

Capt. Trent took his pilot training at Webb AFB, graduating in September, 1965, and later he returned here as an instructor. He was later elevated to academics instruction. Friends here said Capt. Trent

was in the lead plane during an assault in support of Cambodian ground forces and that his plane crashed into a ridge and exploded. Ground crews have not been able to go into this area, but no communication wth the aircraft has been made since the crash.

While in Big Spring Capt. Trent taught a Sunday School class for high school and college-age students at First United Methodist Church and was in charge of the Webb AFB chapel choir. He participated each year in special Christmas and Easter music programs.

He left Big Spring last spring for special training in Montgomery, Ala., and Florida before leaving for Vietnam. He arrived in Vietnam in December, 1969.

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Supreme Court, taking the advice of the Justice Department, deferred consideration today of a major school desegregation case from Charlotte, N.C.

Also, on this last day of the current term, the court declined for technical reasons to decide whether young men who profess moral objections to one single war, the war in Vietnam, may qualify for draft exemptions.

However, the court at the same time agreed to hear two cases next term beginning in October, that will confront the justices with the issue.

FIRE BASE 11-BRAVO, Viet-Last week the Justice Department told the court it would have to eventually resolve the "appropriate remedial standard" for Charlotte and other large urban districts, north and south. But the department also suggested the court await the filing of new desegregation plans for the Charlotte-Mecklenburg County District.

Without stating its reasons. the court decided 8 to 1 to technically assume jurisdiction of the dispute but to leave matters at this point with the federal court in Charlotte.

DISTURBING Jusice Hugo L. Black dissented, saying the court should "set the case for hearing at the

earliest possible date. The Supreme Court by 8 to 0 today dismissed, for lack of jurisdiction, a Texas appeal from a three-judge federal court's opinion that the state's disturbing the peace law is constitutionally invalid.

The Supreme Court noted that the federal court in Austin, Tex., in ruling on a case stemming from a 1967 antiwar demonstration, made "no order of any kind either granting or denying an injunction-interlocutory or permanent."

The lower court concluded the state law was "impermissibly and unconstitutionally broad." But it held up its mandate and gave the state legislature time to enact new legislation that would meet constitutional stand-

U.S. WITHDRAWAL ONE DAY AHEAD OF SCHEDULE

Cambodia Peril Still Serious

American combat troops in Cambodia pulled back into South Vietnam this afternoon, in effect completing the U.S. withdrawal one day ahead of President Nixon's deadline.

Still in Cambodia but scheduled to leave by midnight Tuesday were a handful of American advisors to some of the 39,000 South Vietnamese troops also still there. Although these Americans also are being pulled out, the South Vietnamese will keep forces beyond the border for an indefinite period to bolster the shaky government of

SAIGON (AP) - The last 1,800 men of the 1st Air Cavalry Division walked or flew across the border north of Saigon, closing out the 60-day drive into enemy munitions and supply dumps that Nixon has called the "most successful" operation of the Vietnam war.

> Meanwhile, Premier Lon Nol of Cambodia said in Phnom Penh that he hoped Nixon would send U.S. troops back into his country if his government's military situation deteriorated further.

Talk Of A Value-Added Tax

It's not the first time that President Nixon has thrown up a trial balloon on a system of money-getting called the value-added tax.

He had mentioned this sort of levy system before, and just in the last few days there have emerged new rumors that Mr. Nixon would propose for next year this value-added tax.

This is a form of sales tax, with a good many more steps to it. It levies on each stage of the process by which raw materials become finished consumer goods. The tax, as a natural course, becomes part of the price the ultimate consumer pays. Some European governments use this system, and there are economists who advocate it.

But before one anticipates that

there will be an added-value tax, it might be well to consider some factors: One, labor and liberal groups, including their own economists, would be sure to attack this as a regressive tax, one that does not, like the income tax, temper its impact on smaller incomes, and on families that spend most of their earnings on necessities.

Two (and significant) is that Chairman Wilbur Mills of the House Ways and Means Committee, a powerful man in the say-so in fiscal affairs, has given no indication that he would support an across the board levy like the value-added tax.

It's a fair guess that this method has a long way to go, even though it is presented as an alternative to such things as a surtax or the increasing of specific excise taxes.



NOWADAYS, for example, when a quasi-recession is supposed to be in progress, tax receipts may turn out to be surprisingly lower than they have been in other years. Budget estimates which have been based upon the idea that tax collections would not be seriously affected may possibly have to be reduced in a number of categories. Certainly by the end of 1970 the administration will have to review its expenditures in the light of reduced income from taxes and may have to cut expenses far more than it has done this year in order to maintain somewhere near a balanced budget.

WASHINGTON — Not surprisingly, President Nixon has concluded he has a good thing going for him in the public utterances of Vice President Agnew, and has told Agnew, in effect, to "go get 'em."

Statements from the White House press office that Nixon has no power to shut Agnew up are so much poppycock. The fact is Nixon has told Agnew to go ahead and do his thing, subject to change without notice.

AND, OF COURSE, in sounding off the Vice President will speak as a member of the administration. The fact of his office makes that unarguable. Indeed, Richard Nixon continues to find Agnew's public statements pleasant listening.

Significantly, the President gave Agnew the green light two days before release of the most recent Gallup Poll, which showed that a gaggle of interviewees came out 5 to in favor of the Vice President's point of view. It continues to be White House scripture that Agnew is saying a lot of things about unruly students, violence and the "liberal" establishment that populous Middle America

THIS IS THE finding that is causing concern to National Democratic Chairman Lawrence F. O'Brien and the national committee. Secret Service Operations

WASHINGTON — In the early part of the war between the states counterfeiting was virtually limitless. There were estimates that as much as onehalf of the currency in circulation was counterfeit. At that time there were about 1,600

State banks throughout the nation, printing currency with each designating its notes differently. To add to the confusion, each bill denomination carried a different design making it difficult to detect one of the 4,000 varieties of illegal notes from the 7,000 legal bills.

IN 1863 a national currency was

Department as the first general federal law enforcement agency. In the following ten years, counterfeiting was greatly reduced and crime brought under control.

THEREAFTER the Secret Service had its jurisdiction increased as an investigative agency and handled such matters as the Teapot Dome Oil Scandal, the Ku Klux Klan, government mail frauds and even espionage activities during the Spanish-American War and World War I.

President McKinley was assas sinated in 1901. The Secret Service was thereafter designated to protect the President, Theodore Roosevelt being the first. In 1906, Congress passed an act authorizing the Secret Service to guard the President and in 1907 the authorization was extended to include the President and Vice President-elect, the President's immediate family and former Presidents, their wives, widows and minor children.

THE SECRET SERVICE also protects irreplaceable historical documents of the United States and other valuables ordinarily known as personal property but owned by the Government.

Measures for protecting the President of the United States are intricate and detailed. The Secret Service has this res ponsibility and can even override the President's wishes, to insure, as far as humanly possible, his safety.
