## Smith Goes To Bat For Drouth-Stricken Farmers

Preston Smith called again Wednesday for full federal drouth disaster assistance, but Secretary of Agriculture Clifford Hardin said it already has been granted, "in effect."

Hardin said he will make no recommendation for a presidential disaster declaration for Texas because the Agriculture Department already is taking steps to assist drouth-stricken farmers and ranchers.

One item 'scheduled for "ac-

tive consideration" is the problem of credit throughout the drouth area, he said.

"We are going to do everything we can to create a maximum of flexibility in credit, particularly for farm operations," Hardin said. He said this would be in addition to \$10 million in emergency credit released by President Nixon Tuesday.

Hardin visited here briefly Wednesday to confer with Gov. 4 Smith and other Texas officials, and to take a 30-minute helicopter tour of the dusty, dry area south of here.

Smith told Hardin the state is thankful for measures already set in motion. "We in Texas are not, however, satisfied that the federal government has done enough," Smith said.

Presidential disaster designation will not be recommended, Hardin said, because it involves broader programs such as unemployment compensation that are more applicable to disasters like earthquakes and tornadoes.

that adequate steps already are being taken by his department. "In effect, we have declared a major agricultural disaster here (in Texas) and in western Oklahoma," he said.

Earlier Wednesday in Amarillo, Hardin said 39 Texas counties will become eligible for drouth relief in the form of feed grain at reduced prices, or subsidized transportation assistance for hay brought in from

The counties stretch from the San Angelo area south to San Antonio and the Lower Rio Grande Valley, he said.

He also said that in various counties designated for disaster relief, the department is waiving fees for the use of acreage previously taken out of produc-

Smith told Hardin and others in his Washington delegation that he believes Texas "is deserving of full disaster assist-

ance from our federal government."

He noted the state asked March 31 that President Nixon officially issue a drouth disaster declaration. "We regret very much that this was not done . . . and we continue to hope that it will be done," Smith said.

## Suit To 'Tap' H. L. Hunt For Million

DALLAS (AP)-A \$1.5 milion suit has been filed against multimillionaire oilman H. L. Hunt, it was learned Wednesday, by a woman who claims Hunt and his associates wiretapped her home telephone.

The suit was filed by Joyce Rothermel, wife of a security chief once employed by Hunt. She also named as defendants one of Hunt's sons, Hunt Oil Co., three Houston private detectives and a telephone company man she claimed installed the tap.

One of the private investigators, Jon J. Kelley, was arrested in January, 1970, on charges of tapping the telephone of Paul and Joyce Rothermel. Richardson, Tex., police found the radio receiver and tape recorder connected with the telephone and turned the evidence over to the FBI. The case never reached federal court, however.

## **Boot Manson After Howls**

LOS ANGELES (AP) - Convicted killer Charles Manson was evicted from another courtroom after he screamed on being told he can't represent himself in a second murder case.

Manson, 36, was ejected from the courtroom Wednesday after Suprior Court Judge Raymond Choate ruled he isn't competent to handle his own defense.

At that Manson howled about five seconds and declared: "I have a voice. I can speak. I really can."

The judge told him to be quiet or he would be removed. "Would you please," Manson replied. "It's hard for me to sit

Manson was taken to a nearby holding cell for the remainder of the hearing which involved pre-trial defense motions in the Gary Hinman "Shorty" Shea murder case. Choate continued the hearing to Monday.

## SON TO RULE Death Takes 'Papa Doc' In Haiti

PORT AU PRINCE, Haiti (AP) - Dictator Francois "Papa Doc" Duvalier is dead at 64. His 19-year-old son Jeane Claude was announced today as the new president of Haiti.

An announcement from the presidential palace said: "President Duvalier is dead after a three month illness. He passed away last night." The death apparently occurred about 8 p.m., but it was not disclosed until 12 hours later.

Haitian radio stations began playing funeral music. Some women were seen weeping at street corners. Others stood aimlessly along roads, listening to the distant strains of a palace guard band, playing somberly.

Jeane Claude, who will be 20 in May, was designated months ago by his father as the heir to the presidency. He was cheered by a throng when he appeared in the garden in front of the palace. Officials said he already had been sworn into office - apparently during the night.

The official radio announced a new cabinet with only two holdovers.

The elderly Duvalier, a little doctor who built a political machine out of a mixture of Voodoo, pressure and popular appeal, had run the country with an iron hand for nearly 14 years.

## 'Swingers' Get And Give

(Fifth of Seven columns) Our 2,500,000 cases of venereal disease a year average out, on the basis of total population, to roughly one case per 100 population. (If one in a hundred got, say, pneumonia every year, what an uproar there'd be.)

But this one-in-a-hundred is somewhat misleading. Most of these cases are in the age. bracket of 15 to 30 years.

Let's not blink at the facts. That means that among young people of "VD age," about one in 25 contracts VD each year.

However, it is less prevalent in many rural states, much more prevalent in the big, crowded cities, and it is calculated that in some of the densest metropolitan areas, the frequency of VD is as high as one young person out of four. SEX PLAY

I don't think there's much doubt that "sexual freedom" and "liberation" and such catchwords

have a lot to do with it. Perhaps later age for marriage has something to do with it, too - but I can't see how this explains the rise of venereal disease among the kids aged 13, 14 and 15. Do you?

No. "Permissiveness" has gone too far. Maybe just saying "don't" to the younger generation no longer cuts any ice, but isn't it time that the young (or even older) "swingers" begin to learn they can't play around, switching partners with impunity?

In a word, it's the promiscuous ones who get and give — venereal diseases.

"Sexual liberation," like everything else, it has its price - risk of pregnancy, guilt feelings, upset emotions, and so o

What I am saying is that, if young folks (and older ones, too) are going to insist on sex when they want it, they should at least heed the consequences. Sex is one thing; indiscriminate sex - switching from partner to partner is another. For with every new partner there is a risk of finding VD in anywhere from one in 50 to one

Part of the picture is the availability of "the pill," the "loops" and "spirals," and other forms of contraception.

Girls no longer fear pregnancy as they used to (but I note that illegitimacy has not dis-

Yet none of these new contraceptive methods offers one particle of protection against VD. Can it be that that simple fact just hasn't been em-

'WASH AWAY'

Years ago the condom ("rubber" or "safe") was about the only contraceptive available. I can remember snorts of derision among my contemporaries when they read the legend on the package, "For prevention of disease only." The condoms were used to prevent pregnancy! The legend was printed to comply with laws against birth control

Yet here's the wry turn of facts. The condom DOES prevent disease by avoiding that vital "skinto-skin" contact which lets VD germs pass from person to person. A check of druggists shows that some folks now are realizing it. - and in enough numbers to result in an increase in sales of the simple condom.

In passing, the advice has been given that if the male, after sexual contact, urinates immediately, he can "wash away" some of the germs, but some authorities on the subject tell me that, in plain words, it often doesn't do much good. Don't rely on it! (More on this in my booklet; "Venereal Disease: How to Avoid It; How to Cure It." - Send 35 cents)

The same applies to women using a douche is highly unreliable as a means of preventing pregnancy — but as to preventing venereal disease experts state positively that it doesn't work, any more than washing your face can keep you from getting pneumonia or the flu.

But don't waste time on worthless methods that may give you a false sense of security. (Tomorrow - "Breaking the Vicious Chain")



The federal conference, at a place and time yet to be an-nounced, was called last week by the Environmental Protection Agency in an effort to halt pollution of Galveston Bay.

"I just think the State of Texas is capable of handling this,' Clark said. "And I think this conference is just another intentional federal encroachment on state and local authority.

## Selective Enforcement

Gov. Preston Smith may be correct in his charge that political considerations motivated the prosecution of banks which made political cam-paign loans to candidates. He was singled out under peculiarly suspicious circimstances, and since then it has been developed that many others,

irrespective of party, have done likewise Perhaps it is well to concede this point, and then start from there.

For after all, the matter of politics (except for calculated embarrassment) is irrelevant. The law forbidding such loans surely must

be one of the most obscure laws supposedly governing political campaigning. Almost no one seemed to know of its existence. But, it is a settled rule of law that ignorance of a law is no excuse, nor is ignorance of the law a defense against

If we demand law and order, we must demand the strict enforcement of all laws. If, in practice, we find some laws oppressive, we should move promptly to repeal them, instead of deciding to



> In England, the drink was popularized by the Druids, those old political machine bosses and medicine men who tootled about sellling mistletoe and burning people alive in wicker cages.

> OUR BRITISH cousins are sending over six varieties of mead. There is the common, or garden, variety which tastes like hock or Moselle. Sack mead is the dessert type, reminiscent of today. Sack Metheglin is the vermouth of mead; it's flavored with herbs. Then there is cyser, a mead made with apple juice instead of water, which tastes a little like sherry. Pyment is a light red wine made from grape juice and honey. The all-purpose mead is called melomel, and is not bad when mixed with gin, provided everything in the room is too heavy for throwing

THE BRITISH consider it romantic that the art of mead making has been revived, but they affect a wistfulness over the fact that most of the drink will be shipped to fat-cat America. Hopefully, he is wrong. For reasons of domestic tranquillity, Americans

## Nixon And Calley

WASHINGTON - T h e widest the authority which I had in such publicity was given to the allegation of Capt. Aubrey M. Daniel III, prosecutor in the Calley Case, that President Nixon, by injecting himself into the review process, had undermined the morale of the armed services. Unfortunately, many people have not learned the President's answer to this charge, which was given succinctly

in his radio interview on April 16. THE FACT that the President allowed Lieutenant Calley to be confined to his quarters rather than be sent to prison and decided, as commander in chief, to exercise final review of the case was immediately regarded by some people to indicate that the President is partial to Calley and believes he should have been acquitted. No inference of that kind is justified. Mr. Nixon praised the military records of the six members of the jury and stressed that he respects those who served on it. The President explained his participation as follows:

"I ACTED as I did because one of my capacities is commander in chief of the armed forces. There was enormous interest in this case, concern expressed throughout the nation with regard to that decision, going far beyond the innocence or guilt of Lieutenant Calley with regard to the charges. I felt under the circumstances I should take two steps that I think are completely consistent with upholding the judicial process

of the armed forces. "One, it seemed to me that if in civilian cases where an individual is charged with a crime, he cannot get out on bail - it seemed to me that the least that could be done would be to say that Lieutenant Calley, pending the time that an appeal made his sentence final, should not be sent to Leavenworth Prison, but should be confined to his quarters. I think that was the right decision to make about that man at that time.

THE SECOND point had to do with my decision that I announced when I said that I, as President and as commander in chief, would exercise cases to review the case, that I would not pass the buck to a commission, I would not pass it to the secretary of the Army. But in this case, because of the great public interest in the case and because it went beyond simply the innocence or guilt of this one man, that I would review the case personally before final sentence was passed. .

"IT SEEMED to me under the circumstances that a presidential statement at the highest level should be made once this case is completed, should be made setting the whole thing into perspective and without upon his rights, a decisio that would let the American people know and the world know why such a prosecution did take place and why it was upheld or why it was not upheld. I, of course, will not prejudge it at this time before it goes through the judicial process.'

THERE IS not the slightest reason for jumping to the conclusion that the President has already made up his mind what he will do about the verdict and the sentence in the Calley case. What he desires is to examine all the different episodes dealing with the same type of incident during war. This is why no basis exists for concluding that the President has prejudged Lieutenant Calley in any






