





Orchard Reminders

It is time to prune orchard trees. Most sections have had killing frost and pruning can be done after this happens. The pruning job needs to be done before Christmas if possible.

It is also time to look for the San Jose scale on the limbs and trunk of your fruit trees. This two is an ashy gray scale and limbs severely infested should be removed and burned immediately after pruning. If San Jose scale is present you should spray with a 3% oil emulsion.

New Sweet Potato Available

Anyone wishing to get some of the new Murff Bush Porto Rican Sweet potatoes to slip for next years crop should contact the County Agent immediately. The Murff grows upright like a peanut plant. Its vine is only a foot long while of the ordinary sweet potatoes is much longer. This means that the Murff can be cultivated right up to the day of harvest, long after vine types are being choked with grass and weeds

Last year at the Texas A&M Experiment Station at Gilmer, the Murff produced a yield of slightly over 300 bushels per acre, almost a 100 bushels more than the next best variety, the Improved Porto Rican, when grown under the same conditions and fertilizer rates.

The Murff Bush Porta Rican graded 49.7 percent U.S. No. 1 as compared with 23.9 percent for the Improved Porto Rican the tree, they should be picked and produced very few strings and jumbos




