# Mississippi, Kentucky Voters Elect Governors

ers in Kentucky and Mississippi elected governors today, four states chose legislators and scores of cities selected mayors in a warmup to the political heat wave waiting around the turn of the calendar.

Such races as Kentucky's choice of a governor and New Jersey's taste in legislators were being watched as potential bellwethers of the electorate's mood on the eve of a presidential year.

But the best clue probably lay in key mayoral races from Philadelphia to San Francisco where issues have been developed akin to the national inter-

LAW AND ORDER In Philadelphia, former Po-

L.Rizzo, the Democratic nominee, has paced a law-and-order campaign which made him the favorite in today's voting over Republican Thacher Longstreth, who has picked up moderate and reform Democratic dis-

But, in Boston, Rep. Louise Day Hicks, who has campaigned for law and order and built a national reputation four years ago with an antibusing campaign, was an underdog to Mayor Kevin White. Both are Democrats.

FRISCO RACE

In San Francisco Mayor Joseph L. Alioto, under indictment in connection with an alleged fee-sharing arrangement, was fighting for a second

term and his political survival. Alioto was challenged by Board of Supervisors President Dianne Feinstein, who wants to make San Francisco the largest city in the country with a woman mayor; former San Francisco Chronicle executive editor Scott Mewhall; restaurant own-

Fred Selinger and six others. Carl B. Stokes, Cleveland's first black mayor, declined to run again, but he took a special interest in the bid of independent Arnold Pinkney, black president of the school board.

A Pinkney victory over Democratic nominee James Carney and Republican Ralph Perk Sr. would go far toward putting Stokes at the head of the nation's first urban-blackoriented political machine **BIG TOWNS** 

Indiana Democrats hoped to pick up a score of new mayors' posts. Forty-eight cities in New York elected mayors today, although Yonkers and Rochester were the only big towns involved. Most cities and towns in Massachusetts elected mayors as did Sacramento, Calif., Columbus, Toledo, Youngstown and Akron, Ohio, and New Haven, Hartford and Bridgeport, Conn.

The lone congressional race was in Pittsburgh where ketchup heir H. John Heinz III. Republican, was favored over Democrat John E. Connelly to get the 18th District House seat vacated by the death last April of Republican Rep. Robert J.

Sheriff W. R. Wood said Tuesday Harris has been allowed no visitors and had refused to make any statement since he was transferred to the jail here last week

Wood said Harris has not requested a lawyer and nobody has attempted to seek bond for him. The Quinlan man was arrested last week at his trailer home where he lived with his mother. He has been charged with murder in connection. with the slayings of Mr. and Mrs. Forrest Covey and Susan Shaw, 16.

## Peking's Delegation

Fake Atom Bomb UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) - Red China informed the United Nations today that Deputy Foreign Minister Chiao Kuan-hua will head Peking's delegation to the General Assembly.

The Peking government also named Huang Hua, its ambassador to Canada, as its permanent U.N. representative and delegate to the 15-nation Security Council.

The names were sent in two messages from Peking's acting foreign minister, Chi Peng-fei. He told Secretary-General U Thant: "I will inform you later of the date of departure of the delegation

U.N. diplomats earlier speculated that the Chinese Communists would arrive Thursday or Friday. The U.S. State Department announced Monday that no visas are required for their entry into the United States.

Chiao will bring his experience in dealing with one of the two superpowers. From 1969 onward, he has been the chief of Peking's negotiating team discussing Red China's border disagreements with

#### Rogers Hails Foreign Aid

WASHINGTON (AP) -Secretary of State William P. Rogers declared today that defeat of the foreign aid bill was a damaging blow to President Nixon's foreign policy and weakens his powers in negotiating, and the secretary called on Congress to move "quickly to repair the damage that has been done."

After meeting for an hour with the President at the White House, Rogers added his voice to the growing administration efforts to reverse the Senate vote that shelved the foreign aid measure last Friday.

Rogers said he favors passage now of a continuing resolution to extend the present aid program to permit the President to carry on what he called a "very successful foreign pol-

Rogers said the administration will make "a very stern and strong appeal to members of Congress to correct this damage that has been done.'

## Parliament Gets **Tighter Security**

LONDON (AP) - Four thousand extra police were called to duty in the heart of London today, doubling the usual force, for a massive security operation to protect Queen Elizabeth II in the wake of two ter-

rorist bombings. More than 500 Scotland Yard agents and police were assigned to watch over the sovereign during her coach ride with Prince Philip and Prince Charles to open the new session of Parliament.

Three helicopters patrolled the royal route, and police launches with frogmen guarded the Thames river approaches to the Houses of Parliament. Four times on Monday police combed the labyrinth of cellars beneath Parliament where on Nov. 5, 1605, Guy Fawkes was nabbed as he was about to set off barrels of gunpowder underneath the queen's predecessor, King James I.

Two bomb blasts shook London Saturday and Sunday nights. The first damaged the 620-foot Post Office tower, the second ripped into an army barracks in Westminster District.

An anonymous caller warned after the Post Office explosion that the next target would be the Queen Victoria tower at the Houses of Parliament, a few yards from where the monarch was 'to step down from her coach. conviction The court noted that a three-judge federal court in Dallas had held the state's abortion law unconstitutional June 18, 1970. An appeal to the Supreme Court is pending. U.S. Dist. Judge Sarah Hughes refused to issue an injunction against

enforcement of the law. Douglas' opinion said the abortion law was "designed to protect fetal life . . . and this justifies prohibiting termination of the life of the fetus or embryo except for the purpose of saving the

life of the mother.' He said that "at least the present stage of medical science is of no real help in determining clearly when human life begins.

Texas' homicide laws show the legislature's "intent to protect that human life in existence by actual birth . . . This is an implicit recognition of human life not in existence by actual birth. The state attempts to protect that human life not in existence by actual birth through its abortion statutes and defines this as the 'life of the fetus or embryo.' " Douglas said.

#### Peru-China 'Deal' Made

TOKYO (AP) - Communist China announced today it has established diplomatic relations with Peru, and declared it recognizes the South American nation's sovereignty over waters within 200 nautical miles of its coast A communique broadcast by the official New

China News Agency said Peru took note of Communist China's claim that Taiwan is an inalienable part of Communist Chinese territory, A number of nations have adopted this formula

for dealing with the issue of Taiwan without explicitly backing Peking's avowed intention to 'liberate' the island base for the rival Nationalist Chinese government. The communique said the two governments

have agreed in an exchange of notes in Canada to exchange ambassadors "within a short time." It said Peru recognizes the Peking government as the sole legal government of China.

#### Murder Trial Of WT Youth

SAN ANTONIO (AP) - Jury selection continued today in the murder trial of a West Texas youth, with astrology apparently playing a role in defense lawyers' questioning of prospective

On trial is John Russell Kincaid, 22, of Fort Stockton, a former Texas Christian University student charged with the slayings of his mother and stepfather.

Defense lawyer Warren Burnett said he had asked Dr. William Bryan Jr. of Los Angeles, identified as chief of staff of the American Institute

of Hypnosis, to help him in the jury selection. At Bryan's direction, Burnett asked prospective jurors such questions as what astrological sign they were born under, their birthdates, hobbies, whether they had brothers and sisters, and whether they were born during the first or last half of

Kincaid is charged with the shooting deaths of his mother, Ann Russell Kincaid, 38, and stepfather, Bert Kincaid Jr., 51, whose bodies were found by a maid on Jan. 21, 1970.

## Where Do You Stash Trash Downtown Big Spring?

By BRIAN PEAY You may not realize the lack of regular-size trash cans in the downtown area until you get a handful of trash. Then it is too late, because you have a threeto-four block walk from certain sections of downtown to the nearest litter barrel.

Currently there are only three litter barrels in the downtown area, one in front of the First National Bank, one in front of the Greyhound Bus Station, and one on Third Street between Main and Nolan.

Since the downtown area is well patronized and is readily available to out-of-town visitors, it stands in contrast to the College Park Shopping Center with three litter barrels and Highland Shopping Center's 10 litter canisters.

Ironically what was meant to beautify the center of town the big planters - is being used for the opposite purpose.

Adopted in approximately 1967, the Operation Sprakle for Big Spring provided for the planters to be positioned at strategic points in the downtown area, according to Johnnie Johansen, city parks superin-

However, presently those planters are not only supporting pretty trees, but also heaps of trash put in them because the citizens have no other place to stash the trash.

There are numerous commercial trash bins provided by the city for downtown merchants. But it is rather inconvenient to hunt an alley with a trash bin. Moreover, it may be too full for even a little bit

"The city provided litter barrels for the downtown area approximately a year ago," Dick Nichols, assistant sanitation superintendent, commented, "but most of them were picked up and taken to the city barns for repairs."

Nichols pointed out that there was considerable damage done

to the barrels to the point that the lids could not be opened.

One other reason for the lack of trash barrels downtown is that it is hard for city sanitation trucks to maneuver in the traffic, while picking up the cans to be emptied, he explained.

Previously downtown cans were put on a regular truck route, however, the cans filled up so quickly each day that they had to be emptied more than once. With that amount of trash going into barrels then where is it going now.

Although the problem is the responsibility of the city, service clubs in other communities have rallied to the aid of their local city governments by assisting with the purchase and up-keep of trash containers.

At any rate, the street sweeper has more to work with now, Hopefully producers of car litter bags are probably doing booming business with Big Spring customers.

#### Tennis, Anyone?

#### Around The Rim

in tennis in the United States is not too surprising, considering that tennis has more participants the world over than any other ball game.

The game knows no boundaries no barriers of language or custom and everywhere, tennis players (like bridge enthusiasts) are always looking for a game.

How much do you know about the history of tennis? The Athletic Insti-tute, with tennis coach Harry "Cap" Leighton as consultant, tells us all

The game of tennis, often called the "king of sports," was once, many years ago, called "the sport of kings." That was in fourteenth century France, when a wandering minstrel introduced the original tennis game to the noblemen and ladies of the

They had no rackets; just batted a ball back and forth over a rope with the open hand. The ball was a cloth bag stuffed with hair, and many's the time this frail equipment would not withstand even the gentle pitter-patter of the game.

But the real merit of the game; good fun, sports, exercise, was discovered by the common people of France. When King Louis X heard about it, he banned the game for everybody saying, "The very idea of commoners playing a game intended only for results!"

only for royalty!"
But, despite the ban, his noblemen and their ladies continued to play and developed the first racket, just a flat oval or parchment with a heavy handle, as well as a more durable

The remarkable revival of interest ball. The next racket was lighter, rounder and the handle was longer. Still the sport of kings, "for the classes and not the masses," the game spread to England.

Around the beginning of the 17th century there was another improvement; a new racket looking very much like the modern snow shoe and using gut stringing instead of parch-ment. Then came another innovation. Beneath the net in the royal games, there appeared a golden vessel into which spectators threw money . . . as they placed bets on the royal contestants. Learning of the gambling in his court, the king published an edict, and tennis became an outlaw again . . . to be played under cover for three centuries.


The game was brought back into the open less than 100 years ago by an Englishmen, Maj. Walter Wingfield, and was seen by an American girl, Mary Outerbridge, during a vacation in Bermuda.

She brought rackets and net to America in 1876, but had trouble getting them past a New York customs inspector who had never before seen such equipment. Yet, tennis caught on quickly and developed steadily until around 1900, then Maurice McLaughlin introduced the exciting possibilities of the fast, smashing, driving game as we know

Immediately, tennis became a game of real skill, coordination and superlative speed. Since then, the American style of tennis has spread throughout the world.
