WAGES SAG

Cost Of Living Up Despite Price Freeze

WASHINGTON (AP) - The government reported today that the cost of living rose twotenths of one per cent last month despite the price freeze, as a result of higher prices for 1972 automobiles, winter and fall clothing and shelter.

The increase was about half the average month-to-month increase that prevailed before the price freeze began Aug. 15. It compares with a three-tenths of one per cent increase in August and a two-tenths of one per cent increase in Sep-

The October increase puts the Bureau of Labor Statistics' Consumer Price Index 3.8 per cent above a year ago, the smallest 12-month change in more than 3½ years.

EARNINGS DIP

While prices crept upward despite the freeze, the Labor Department also said that average weekly earnings for private, nonfarm jobs declined two pennies to \$129.11.

The increase in prices for October was slightly more than usual for this time of year. After taking seasonal factors into account, the Bureau of Labor Statistics figured the price rise at an adjusted one-tenth of one per cent increase. It said this was the smallest seasonally adjusted rise since

The unadjusted figures showed that food prices declined in October by two-tenths of one per cent while cost of housing rose three-tenths of one per cent, apparel went up eight-tenths of one per cent and transportation rose seven-tenths of one

'GANG-RAPED AT LOADING DOCK'

WASHINGTON (AP) - While industry, unions and government pass the buck on how to curb organized crime's billion-dollar-a-year cargo thefts, a Texas congressman says, the consumer is being "gang-raped at the loading ramp."

Rep. J. J. Pickle, an Austin Democrat, said cargo theft may be a bigger problem than rumrunning was during Prohibition.

"The shame is that we permit it by timidity, economics and even protection in gangland fashion," Pickle told a New York Seminar On Cargo Security Thursday.

He said he gets many calls from transportation executives who claim their industry isn't as bad as the others on cargo thefts.

In other words, Pickle said, "If my suitcase gets stolen while I am here, it is not the airline's fault. Nor is it the fault of the truckers who drove me to the hotel. No railroads were involved, so they are clear and likewise for the shipping in-

Two Accused Killers Escape

HOUSTON (AP) - Authorities searched today for two men who escaped from the Harris County courthouse while awaiting trial on murder charges. Ronald W. Mitchell and Willie E. Ratliff, both 20, fled late Thursday after overpowering bailiff

Miller said the two men jumped him and beat him as he took them to a holdover jail cell at the end of a day of questioning prospective jurors. "I opened the door and got them on the inside (of the cell)," Miller said. "I don't know which

Wednesday night. The sister, 29, said the men drove them to the river and raped them repeatedly.

She managed to persuade two of the men to return her to town early Thursday, she said, and later went to the river with friends but could not find her sister. Some of the missing girl's clothing was

reported found at the scene. The woman told officers she heard her sister yelling, then heard nothing. She said her assailants told her to comply with their orders, or she would "wind up in the bottom of the river like your sister," deputies related.

Jackson's announcement had senator said President Nixon is been long expected. He has been traveling three and four days a week for the past nine months, visiting 32 states and 126 cities, many of them several times.

Jackson and his advisers, some of whom worked for former President Lyndon B. Johnson and the late Adlai E. Stevenson, decided about midsummer to go after the Democratic nomination.

"The No. 1 priority in this country must be to put people back to work," Jackson said in his prepared remarks today. "That will not happen until we put a man in the White House who is trusted-I emphasize trusted-by the worker, the farmer, the businessmen and women of America. Mr. Nixon is not that man."

FED UP However, Jackson, a former Snohomish County, Wash., prosecuting attorney who has been in Congress since 1941, said: "Most Americans are fed up with people who are fed up with America . . . This society is not a guilty, imperialist, oppressive society."

"A prison riot does not prove that something is wrong with America," Jackson said. "That kind of talk is part of the problem, not part of the cure." He apparently was referring to a statement by Sen. Edmund S. Muskie, D-Maine, following the Attica, N.Y., prison riot in Sep-

BOMBS NOT ANSWER

Jackson said wrongs will not be corrected by throwing bombs, stopping the government or attacking policemen. "Nor will these wrongs be corrected by politicians who apologize for the extremists."

Jackson's announcement makes him the third Democrat formally running for the opportunity to oppose Nixon in the President's almost certain bid for re-election next year.

Terrell Bank Is Guilty Of Sex Discrimination

DALLAS (AP) — A Terrell bank which refused to hire a woman because she had illegitimate children was guilty of sex discrimination, U.S. District Court Judge Sarah T. Hughes held Thursday.

She ruled also that the American National Bank exercised racial discrimination in the

Judge Hughes gave her decision in a suit by Phyllis A. Davis, 24, a Negro, ordering the bank to change its recruitment policy so that it does not discriminate against women or

Testimony showed Miss Davis, now married, is the mother of three illegitimate children but stated she was single and childless in a 1969 application for a job as a proof machine operator.

Bank officials told the court that they regarded any sexually immoral person as dishonest and therefore a poor risk as an

The bank's president, Rider C. Hulsey, testified he was satisfied with the qualifications of the job applicant but had no opening. He said he would have refused to hire anyone, man or woman, who was a parent of illegitimate

Judge Hughes ruled that such a policy discriminated against women because "it is common knowledge that it is easier to determine if a woman has illegitimate children than men,"

The jurist noted, in passing on racial discrimination, that the Terrell bank had 46 white and four Negro employes at the time, while 65.4 per cent of the county's population was white and 34.6 per cent Negro.

"It's so far forward in the future it tends to lose a bit of credibility," says Dr. Dennis E. Fielder, a member of the advanced planning team at the Manned Spacecraft Center.

Space experts have made a rough profile, based on current technology, of what a Mars mission would be like, but the schedule of such a voyage depends largely on the rate of funding for the space agency and the direction of the space program

CRASH PROGRAM

Under a crash program, "with unconstrained spending," said Fielder, an American could walk the surface of Mars as early as 1982 to 1985.

"It's a 'can-do' type of mission by then, but there would be a lot of hazard," he said.

A more conservative, but still rapid, approach would put men on Mars in the late 1980s, but this would still "penalize the other programs in the space agency," Fielder said.

More likely, he said, man will go to Mars in a stairstep fashion, climbing upward on the technology developed from less ambitious goals.

BIG AS BATTLESHIP

Current thoughts on a mission to Mars call for a spaceship the size of a battleshipabout 400 feet long-to be assembled in earth orbit. The main ship would include three nuclear engines that would drive the vessel away from the earth and set it streaking with steady pulsing thrusts toward

On board, a crew of 12 would live in a self-regenerating ecological system, They would process waste water for reuse. Their air would be cleansed and breathed again and again. Food might be grown on

supply oxygen for the crew. After a voyage of more than 200 days, the craft would orbit

Mars, and a landing craft would descend to the surface, Fielder said. MOTHER The landing crew would be

prepared to stay several weeks Using techniques from the

Apollo moon program, the landing crew would launch off Mars, rejoin the mother ship and rocket homeward. After another crossing of more than 200 days, the Mars

BODILY CHANGES Much more must be learned

also about how well men can live in space for many months. The human body undergoes rigorous changes when exposed for long periods to absence of gravity. Because of this, should a Mars spacecraft be designed to spin and thus create an artificial gravity? Or can man adjust to long-term weightlessness?

The next step toward answering these questions will be the Skylab program, now set for 1973. Astronauts in that program will spend up to 56 days in space and doctors will make studies of bodily minute changes.

But even before the final hardware can be designed for a manned Mars mission, much still must be learned about Mars from missions such as Mariner 9.

"I've always regarded all of the unmanned planetary explorations as precursors to manned exploration," says Fielder. "Every mission that flies contributes to an eventual manned

SOVIETS TO PROBE

Two unmanned Soviet probes, Mars 2 and 3, may attempt a landing on Mars this month, some experts have speculated. Both craft weigh more than five tons, compared to 2,220 pounds of Mariner 9. The rockets and propellants needed to land could account for the extra weight of the Russian craft. Dr. Carl Sagan, a Cornell University astronomer, said he was told by Soviet scientists that Mars 2 and 3 are entry probes which could possibly land on the planet.

No Place For Backwash

One of those regretable incidents which only can complicate the eventual solution of matters occurred Wednesday at Abilene High School where a group of students, principally blacks, went on a brief rampage. A number of whites were involved, though preliminary reports indicated most were the objects of spontaneous attacks, although there were those who said they fought back.

Presumably, this was the outgrowth of feelings from an incident not connected at all with the schools, namely the arrest and alleged abuse of a young black by a white policeman during the previous weekend. Orderly demonstrations followed. Then came a simple act in which a white boy was tripped by blacks in the school and the thing snowballed. Within 10 minutes order had

Leadership of the community, both white and black, stepped in with the result that tensions were greatly relieved. Unfortunately, the incident left its scar upon efforts toward good human relations and particularly upon the school, the innocent victim of it all. Unfortunately, too, the

problem is not an isolated episode, for there have been upheavals in schools at widely scattered points, almost always engendered from external events and triggered by some off-hand event.

And this is sad, not alone because bridges so painstakingly built are dealt severe damage, but because the deeper-seated infection erupts as a boil within the schools where great effort is being made to get at problems through education and understanding. Too many of society's problems are finding their way into schools, which have

all they can do in trying to develop and provide an educational program relevant today, let alone put out fires of strife.

This calls for a full measure of tolerance and sympathetic understanding, plus patience and restrained reaction. But it also calls for resolute action to pin down the sources of trouble and to apply discipline firmly and fairly, regardless of whom it may affect. People of genuine good will not only will agree to the justice of this; they will insist upon it.



Mr. Nixon assailed Washington, D. , where, as rightly said, the national administration bears prime responsibility for law enforcement. He cites as an example of the rapidly escalating crime rate the case of a 24-year-old nurse kidnapped, raped and robbed "within a few blocks of the White House.'

JUST THE other day two women were raped in office buildings one block from the White House. A government employe was stabbed to death in the lavatory of a government office building almost directly across from the White House. Crimes of violence in the capital set a record for the year with two months still to go.

In the text of the speech on crime in the capital, delivered at Chattanooga, Tenn., on Sept. 27, candidate Nixon called for steps to be "taken to restore freedom from fear in the capital of the world's greatest democracy." Saying he would implement these steps if elected, he recommended "a dramatic increase in the number and pay of the police in the city, a doubling if necessary of court and prosecution personnel."



With 2% homicides so far this year the slayer, according to one estimate, has a 7-to-10 chance of going free. The homicide rate is twice that of New York City. While President Nixon has indicated a friendly and cordial attitude toward the government of Mainland China and will soon announce the date of his visit there, Peking's chief delegate to the United Nations - Chiao Kuan-Hua - has just made a speech which opens up a new batch of worries for the United States in its relations with Communist

ALTHOUGH THE UNITED States endorsed the seating of the Peking regime in the Security Council, the deputy foreign minister of Red China, who heads its delegation, accused this country of "armed invasion of China's Taiwan and the Taiwan Straits." In his first speech to the U.N. General Assembly, he declared that "all the armed forces of the United States definitely should be withdrawn" and that "the Chinese people are determined to liberate Taiwan and no force on earth can stop us from doing so." He also asserted that the U.S. should "immediately and unconditionally" with draw its forces from Indo-China, and complained that "U.S. troops still remain in South Korea."

THE WHOLE tone of the address was plainly hostile to America and was something of a shock to those who had believed the Peking government, by its entry into the United Nations, was interested in promoting friendly relations among the major

Bush, American ambassador to the United Nations, told the press he was not surprised by Chiao's statements and said the "hard speech should make the American people realize that Communist China joined the United Nations to fight for its own causes. Just the same, many observers wondered at the tactics used by Peking in assailing the policies of the United States. It could be that the


WASHINGTON - Peking has given Red Chinese are out of touch with the non-communist world and still believe that the way to make progress is by continually disseminating propaganda pronouncements whether or not they are well founded.

> THE UNITED STATES unquestionably made a friendly gesture toward Mainland China not only by supporting its admission to the U.N. but by the President's decision to visit Peking and his willingness to try to 'normalize relations." This could mean, of course, the eventual restoration of diplomatic intercourse. Under these circumstances, it seems incredible that Red China would use the United Nations as a forum to accuse the United States of "aggression" in Indo-China and make other inaccurate charges which could hardly improve the standing of the Peking government throughout the

CERTAINLY IF the war in Indo-China is to be ended, Red China will have to abandon its policy of sending arms and supplies to North Vietnam.

The speech made at the U.N. is a discouraging one for American observers, and some members of Congress showed their resentment. It could have been just a blunder of inexperienced strategists who have been in the habit of denouncing the United States and who don't realize that the President's visit to Peking and the seating of Red China in the United Nations have brought about a change in the whole situation which requires a new appraoch.

THERE IS SOMETHING contradictory in the fact that the President of the United States is to be welcomed in Peking for a conference of world affairs but, before he even starts on his trip, the policies pursued by the United States are unjustly attacked by the representative of the Peking government.

"For a state which pioneered no-fault auto insurance, it is time to promote the concept that in most unsuccessful marriages, both parties have contributed to the breakdown and no one should be held at fault. "They should be able to dis-

solve their marriage." The report said undue emotional, psychological and financial hardship result from the present judicial process which finds one party at fault.


