### Three Customs Agents Shot

BROWNSVILLE, Tex. (AP) - Three U.S. customs agents were wounded by gunfire while trying to make a narcotics arrest at a Brownsville

U.S. Asst. Atty. Paul A. Gonzalez said two men have been arrested and charged before U.S. Magistrate William Mallett.

They were identified as Antonio Cavazoz, 35, and Felipe Barriento's Medina, 42.

Both were charged with possessing and distributing six ounces of heroin and conspiring with others unknown to distribute a quantity of heroin. Lopez was also charged with assaulting the customs agents with a semi-automatic .38 pistol.

Two of the customs agents - Renault Bayhi and Gary Oswell - were taken to Mercy Hospital with unspecified but serious injuries. The third, Larry Chambers, received a flesh wound.

The nominee said O'Brien will be given a role concerned with unifying the support of Democrats and other "concerned Americans."

McGovern said O'Brien will be his "national campaign chairman" and in that role "will be a foremost consultant on the over-riding goal which will be to unify the support of key Democrats across the coun-

In a brief interview, just before publicly accepting McGovern's offer, O'Brien emphasized that while he will hold the title of national campaign chairman his role will be essentially separate from the existing McGovern political organ-

McGovern's announcement on appointment of O'Brien came as he prepared to hold a news conference. In advance of that session, there has no immediate word on the role to be played by Gary Hart who has been serving as McGovern's

campaign manager. The senator said O'Brien will be his liaison with Democrats in Congress, Democratic governors, mayors, and state legislative leaders.

He said O'Brien will also be his chief contact with officials of the Democratic Party and organized labor.

## Units Advance Close To Citadel

SAIGON (AP) - South Vietnamese forces battled a North Vietnamese battalion of 200 to 300 troops today that outflanked the forces closing in on Quang

The fighting was just south of the My Chanh defense line, about 10 miles south of Quang Tri and 20 miles above Hue. The attack threatened Highway 1, less than a mile to the west.

The South Vietnamese turned their tank guns on the North Vietnamese force, and U.S. F4 Phantoms swooped down with bombs. The North Vietnamese slammed mortars into the South Vietnamese infantrymen.

The fighting was continuing at midday, and no firm casualty figures were available

Col. Le Ba Khien, a South Vietnamese regimental commander, said he believed an entire North Vietnamese regiment numbering up to 1,000 troops had moved south below My Chanh in an attempt to cut the north-south Highway behind the task force at Quang Tri.

In Quang Tri, meanwhile, South Vietnamese paratroopers advanced to within 50 yards of the Citadel despite a counterattack by North Vietnamese infantry and tanks. But informants said there would be no attempt to storm the walled fortress until more government troops reach forward positions and more North Vietnamese tanks are knocked out

In a delayed report, the U.S. Command disclosed that an explosion, apparently of a bomb that detonated prematurely in the air, knocked two U.S. Navy A7 bombers and an Air Force F4 fighter-bomber out of the skies on the northern front

### House Kills \$5 Billion Jobs Measure

WASHINGTON (AP) - The unexpected defeat of a \$5 billion emergency job-making bill may be seized by House Democrats as a campaign issue.

The bill, rushed to a vote by Democratic House leaders confident of victory, was killed Wednesday by a roll-call vote

It would have made available \$5 billion in grants to states, communities and rural areas for public works projects, mainly water and sewage plants. Its sponsors said it would have created 500,000 construction jobs, many within 90 days of enactment.

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate today rejected 47 to 46 President Nixon's proposal that the \$1.60 an hour minimum wage be raised to \$2 rather than the \$2.20 supported by

The defeated Republican substitute for the Democratic bill also would have eliminated provisions extending coverage of the wages and hours law to 8.4 million new workers.

#### Cattle Breeding New Texas Brag

WASHINGTON (AP) -Texas continues to lead in the number of cattle being fattened or slaughter, according to July inventories by the Agriculture Department.

Texas feedlots held 2.119.000 nead July 1, up 25 per cent from a year earlier, followed by Iowa at 1,699,000 head for a four per cent gain. Over-all, the nation's 23 major beef states had more than 12.4 million cattle on feed as of July 1, up 14 per cent from a year earlier.

Texas also led in the feedlot count in June. Last year Texas took over the feed cattle lead from Iowa for the first time in history, but the Corn Belt state later regained the top spot before slipping to second place in

the declarer at three no trump, deprived him of the opportunity to execute the winning line of play and he suffered an unnecessary setback on the deal. West opened the six of hearts, East covered dummy's ten with the king, and South won the trick with the ace. Declarer surveyed his

combined assets and it appeared that he would experience little difficulty in taking nine tricks-six clubs, two diamonds, and one heart if the distribution responded according to expectation. The queen of clubs was

cashed at trick two and another club led to North's king. When West showed out, it came as a rude jolt to the declarer. He tried to get back to his hand in spades to try the diamond finesse. but East rose promptly with the ace of spades and returned the eight of hearts. South covered with the jack. which lost to West's queen. The latter's nine picked up

the remaining cards in that suit and he proceeded to cash three more heart tricks to set his opponent down by

Instead of committing himself specifically to the club suit declarer was in position to retain the opportunity to test diamonds as well, if the clubs did not respond favorably. All that was required was a slight variation in timing. It is suggested that he lead a club to North's king first and then return to the queen in his hand. If the clubs are divided three-two, he can cross back to the king of diamonds in dummy to run the clubs. When West shows out on

the second club, South must give up on that suit because it is too dangerous to let East in to come thru declarer's heart holding. Instead, South shifts to a small diamond at trick four and when West follows with the deuce the jack is finessed. When this play succeeds, the king is cashed next, followed by the ace of clubs, and the closed hand reentered with the ace of diamonds-dropping West's queen. Two more diamond tricks swell declarer's trick total to nine -five diamonds, three clubs, and the ace of hearts.

By playing clubs first, South deprived himself of the opportunity to run the entire diamond suit. When he is in the dummy at trick three, if he returns to his hand with the ace of diamonds to try the finesse of the jack, North's king will drop the queen on the third round, but now South lacks a quick entry to his hand to cash cut his long diamonds and he is unable to prevent East from getting in to make the fatal heart return.





## Jury Acquits Texas Regent

Bell County Court at Law jury found Frank C. Erwin Jr. of Austin not guilty of driving while intoxicated after deliberating about 30 minutes Wednesday afternoon.

Erwin sat at the defense table for a moment, then rushed to the other side of the courtroom to shake hands with the three-man, three-woman panel.

Then, smiling broadly, the University of Texas regent sought defense attorneys, prosecutors and Judge Stan Pemberton to shake their hands.

The three-day trial went to the jury at 4:25 p.m. The panel sent word/that they had a verdict shortly before 5 p.m.

The defense had ended testimony by bringing seven character witnesses to the stand after Erwin testified in his own

behalf Wednesday morning. All seven witnesses said they would not hesitate to believe Erwin, either under oath or not under oath.







a stable, not overheated, economy while approaching full employment. Nor do administration policies show much signs of producing that goal; indeed, administration spokesmen have lowered their official aim to something in the neighborhood of 5-per-cent unemployed - which means accepting

no comprehensive plans to combat the unemployment pressures sure to be generated when the Vietnam war is finally concluded.

Koreans of all persuasions saw President Nixon's visit to Peking and Moscow as an unmistakable signal. It is this: North Korea can no longer expect the unqualified support of Russia and China, and South Korea can no longer depend on unquestioned support by the United States.

#### Training Whales

Around The Rim

Over the weekend, I learned how to train porpoises and whales, or more accurately, how whales and porpoises are trained.

THERE ARE NOT many perpoises and whales lurking in Big Spring, so I had to seek them out in Seven Seas and Six Flags amusement parks. I found that amusement parks are places one goes to get blisters on both feet and to get stickied by

someone else's gooey ice cream.

The first thing I learned from the animal trainers was that performing porpoises and whales are not taught "tricks," but are taught "behaviors."

I soon began to feel I was back in one of my old college psychology classes.

BEHAVIORS, according to the trainers, are taught to porpoises and whales by rewarding them as soon as they did anything remotely resembling what the trainers desired. The rewards are for correct performances given and withheld for mistakes until the animals can perform the behaviors on command.

The "singing" that whales and porpoises do to the delight of audiences turned out not to be as simple as it first appeared. A young woman trainer pointed out that although the animals "sing" with their mouths open, the sound really is emitted through their blow-holes or spouts on the backs of their heads.

SHE ADDED that the animals normal sound is too high-pitched for the human ear to detect, and that the animals must strain themselves to keep their "singing" in frequencies their audiences can hear.

Both whales and porpoises are

taught similar acts. The animals I saw had been taught to beach themselves on ramps at the side of the pools, posing with raised heads and tails for the audience. To hoist themselves out of the water and pose momentarily on dry land is contrary to the behaviors designed by nature for the animals.

PUNISHMENT for a bad performance, according to one trainer, is practically impossible. The trainer's only recourse is to withhold rewards and to call the animal to the side of the pool, command it to stay there in position for a performance, and

then ignore it, the trainer said

Now his performer was a 16-footlong female killer whale whose weight was measured in tons. I could well see why he wouldn't feel adequate to go into the pool to teach the lady her manners.

AT ONE POINT, the whale became disenchanted with stardom and balked at the routine which called for one of the trainers to stick his head deep inside her toothy smile. She backed off from her trainers stand, dove to the bottom of the pool, and dealt the water's surface a whack with her tail and drenched both trainers.

The trainer who was to do the headin-mouth bit waited until the lady had worked off her temper, and they then performed the act correctly. The trainer liberally rewarded the whale for not literally snapping off his head, and she peacefully finished her performance.

THIS IMPLIES that Sen. McGovern as president would put no conditions on the North Vietnamese and that would not matter what happened to the South Vietnamese. Also, there would be no means of checking on whether all the prisoners had been returned or whether some were being kept as hostages. In 90 days, whatever negotiations were necessary to obtain the release of the prisoners would have to be completed.

THE ANNOUNCEMENT in advance, however, that the United States woull withdraw all its forces in any event by the end of 90 days after next January 20 is a notification to the other side that it can have its way. Indeed, there may already be some officials in the Hanoi government who will advise waiting until

November before making any commitments in the current negotiations at Paris. It will be argued that, because of the possibility the Democratic party nominee might win the election, North Vietnam should wait, since it might have a triumph and could dictate the terms of any arrangement for the return of American prisoners. Mr. McGovern gives no hint that he will insist upon a settlement which would preserve for South Vietnam the independence for which the people have fought their war - to gain the right of self-deter-

A GOOD DEAL of speculation is heard from different capitals as to what Mr. McGovern's speech might mean if actually applied in the event that he is successful. An uneasiness prevails about the November election. There is not only uncertainty about what will be done about Vietnam but

a fear that economic conditions in the United States may take an unfavorable turn, particularly in the next six months, if there is to be a change in government.

AN AMERICAN presidential election is, of course, of primary concern to the American people. The 1972 contest, however, will be observed throughout the world, and there is beginning to be a nervousness as the party platform and the speeches of the Democratic nominees are read. There are indications in these that the tendency is toward isolationism in this country — toward a formula that would break off the long period of co-operation with foreign governments which has characterized the trend of American policy now for several decades.

The charges of collusion were made by Favor against Bossier Parish officials and Floyd Cumbey, a man who testified in the

Cumbey had pleaded guilty to manslaughter, was sentenced to 42 years in prison, but was released on Dec. 12, 1967, just a few days after sentencing. The grand jury probe is expected to inquire into the re-
