# Air Pirates Forced Men To Remove Their Pants

ended, passengers aboard a hijacked jetliner have returned from Cuba with bizarre tales of three "deranged" sky pirates.

They also had words of praise for the Southern Airways at a Miami hospital, recalling crew which landed the crippled DC9 on a foam-covered Havana

Another Southern DC9 returned the 27 passengers and four crewmen to Miami and finally to their original destinations Sunday after an attempt by FBI sharpshooters to halt the hijacking failed Saturday night and forced the emergency landing in Cuba.

The hijackers, reportedly armed with guns and grenades, had demanded a \$10-million ransom for the plane and its passengers. An undisclosed amount of money was given to the sky pirates during a stop in Chattanooga, Tenn., Saturday. Southern refused to say how much money had been given to

Police and family members identified the hijackers as Melvin Charles Cale, 21, of Oak Ridge, Tenn.; his half-brother, Lewis K. Moore, 27, of Detroit, and Henry D. Jackson, 25, also of Detroit.

The FBI here said the U.S. attorney's office in Birmingham, Ala., had been authorized file air-piracy against the three.

Cale was described as an escapee from the Nashville Community Work Release Center. Jackson and Moore were described as close friends who became embittered after losing a \$4-million lawsuit in which they

accused Detroit police of brutality. They were freed on \$500 bond in a rape case last month. PILOT COURAGEOUS Buchanan said it was the hijacker called "Henry" who shot Johnson after FBI agents

## **Urge Wage Raises** For State Workers

Legislative Budget Board today recommended 3.4 per cent state employe pay raises for each of the next two fiscal years, plus extra funds for merit increases.

Cost of the raises would be \$56.5 million from the general revenue fund, the only state treasury account over which the legislature has significant control

Another \$35.4 million would come from other funds. "For all practical purposes, this is just a cost of living increase?" asked Sen. Tom

Creighton, Mineral Wells. "That's right," answered the board's staff director, Tom Keel. Keel had just explained that the national consumer price index-the measure of inflation-had risen 3.16 per cent from September 1971 to Sep-

The pay raises will be included in the state budget that the board will recommend to the legislature, which meets Jan. 9. The pay recommendations could be changed before the board makes its final budget

The board consists of Lt. Gov. Ben Barnes, Speaker Rayford Price and eight House members and senators appointed by them. Lt. Gov.-elect Bill Hobby attended today's meet-

While recommending merit increases for rank and file employes, the board voted to eliminate 1.7 per cent merit raises for upper echelon employes—including the governor.

DALLAS (AP) - Danny McCrary, 19, youngest member of an itinerant family arrested in California and suspected of murders across the Southwest since 1971, was expected to be taken to state district court today for appointment of

McCrary was returned to Dallas from Santa Barbara, Calif., Saturday for questioning in the robbery and murder of a young Mesquite, Tex., couple.

He was arraigned upon his arrival here for probation violation and for investigation or robbery and murder in connection with the slayings of Forrest Cevey, 22, and his wife, Jena, 19, in Oc-

The couple disappeared from a Mesquite food store on Oct. 17, 1971. Their bullet-riddled bodies were found in an old barn in Hunt County a week

The suspects remained in Dallas County Jail Sunday in lieu of \$50,000 bond in the murder investigation and \$10,000 in the robbery investigation. The allgeged parole violation is related to an unspecified felony committed in Dallas. Officials said the McCrary family has been

questioned about at least 11 slayings across the Southwest and may be quizzed in connection with as many as 22 unsolved murders in six states. McCrary's parents, Sherman McCary, 47, and his wife Carolyn, 45, reportedly lived at one

time in Athens, Tex., in Henderson County. The other family members involved in the case are McCary's sister, Ginger Taylor, 22, and her husband, Carl Raymond Taylor. The older men are currently in prison in

WASHINGTON (AP) - A Republican committee that channeled \$100,000 into President Nixon's re-election campaign says it does not have to make known the sources of its funds despite a new federal law requiring disclosure of all over-\$100 contributors.

Auditors for the General Accounting Office say the position of the Executive Club of the Republican party of New Jersey, if upheld in the courts, could open a major loophole in the elections law which took effect last April 7.

The club contends its money came from dues and that dues are not contributions. GAO auditors say there could be a proliferation of such clubs to evade the full disclosure provisions of the new law. NO RECORD

The auditors say they will press the club for disclosure, possibly launching a field audit

in the next few weeks and then turning their findings over to the Justice Department if the club remains adamant.

The name of the Executive Club first emerged in October in reports by national and state-level Finance Committees to Re-elect the President. In all, the club reported contributing \$3,000 to each of 33 Nixon committees and \$1,000 to a 34th.

Newsmen seeking identi-

fication of the individual contributors could find no record of the club having registered with the GAO nor of its having filed any reports of expenditures or contributions.

The new law requires that any committee which anticipates collecting or spending more than \$1,000 for a national candidate in any calendar year must register with the GAO. It also must file periodic reports of all contributions and expenditures of more than \$100 and must show how much cash was on hand at the time of each filing. 'ON A LOCAL BASIS'

After news stories appeared about the committee, its chairman, William B. Colsey III, a Mount Holly, N.J., attorney, filed a registration statement and reports for Sept. 10 and for the 15th and 5th days before the Nov. 7 election, the deadlines set by the law. But Colsey, in a separate let-

ter to the GAO and in comments affixed to each report, said the club was formed "on a local basis."

The club's 15th day pre-election report—dated Nov. 7, the day of the election—listed all the \$3,000 contributions to Nixon committees, but it omitted the names of individuals who

Colsey, who could not be reached for comment, told the GAO that the club's funds came from \$1,000 dues charged each member. He said dues do not fall within the law's definition of contributions.

### Secrecy Suit **Lost By IRS**

SEATTLE (AP) - The federal government says it has given up its efforts to preserve the classified status of manuals and handbooks used by the Internal Revenue Service in auditing income tax returns.

U.S. Atty. Stan Pitkin said he would not appeal a ruling by U.S. District Court Judge William Beeks opening the manuals and handbooks for inspection by Susan and Philip Long of Bellevue, Wash.

A freedom of information suit seeking access to the classified material was filed by the Longs after the IRS called for an audit of Long's corporate and personal income tax returns for 1966 through 1968.

In his ruling in the case handed down earlier this year, Beeks declared "There is the propensity of governmental agencies to shield their activities and procedures from public scrutiny...

The IRS still has a claim pending against Long. It says Long owes \$42,000—an amount real estate developer chalked up to business expenses—including a subscrip-tion to the Wall Street Journal.

Woodrow Wilson had won his first election in 1912 rather easily because the Republicn party was split, with William Howard Taft taking one section on the Republican vote and Theodore Roosevelt the other.

The 1916 election was the first time so many Western states had gone Democratic, and the real reason was that an anti-war sentiment had influenced the voters. At the De mocratic convention which renominated President Wilson in 1916, the chant of the delegates was, "he kept us out of war, he kept us out war." This cry was popular because the President had avoided entering the war when the 'Luisitania.' a British passenger ship, was sunk by a German submarine in 1915 and more than 100 Americans as well as European passengers were lost. But a pledge had been given by the German government that there would be no attacks thereafter on merchant

Unfortunately, early in 1917, just a few weeks before Mr. Wilson's inauguration for a second term, the Germans abandoned their pledge and r e sum e d unrestricted submarine warfare. President Wilson was left no choice except to ask Congress to pass a declaration of war.

HIGHER EDUCATION in the United States is in a bad way and is getting worse. Parkinson's law, no doubt, applies here: The more money pumped into an institution, the worse it becomes.

What makes people think that simply by raising the pay scale of the so-called educator they have automatically improved the caliber of learning. Some instructors I have known, who weren't qualified in the first place, sign in their students and then retire to the golf course for the day. And many others are preaching revolution, egging on their disciples

to destroy the very system that supports them in style.

SOME COLLEGES and universities have become diploma factories, where only the size of classes and of

classrooms is a status symbol. Lamentally, most college students are required to spend four years in college when no more than two should be required to earn a bachelor's degree. The depressing thing about many professional students is that they have no appetite for work. And the more people who hit the streets with Ph.Ds and Master degrees, the more inclined industry is to flee overseas so that people with ordinary skills and ordinary appetites can be hired to do the job.

THERE IS something to be said for longevity, too, in fact much to be said. Why do the captains of industry roll out the red carpet for individuals who bring attachecases full of credentials along with them in job interviews, who in-variably lie about their accomplishments in commerce, then flee the scene before they learn anything about the job? Yet management puts no premium on the employe who has mastered his job and feels a sense of loyalty - expressed in long service - toward it.

"FOR SOME reason, which we still have not been able to determine, the American wife prefers to start all fights with her husband at bedtime. These fights, which last on the average of two or three hours, prevent the man from getting any sleep. The next day he is completely useless at his job, causing accidents, grave errors in bookkeeping and making horrible decisions in a groggy state of mind."

"That's serious," I admitted.

"We suspected it all along," Applebaum said. "But now we have the data to back it up. This is a case history of a typical American couple in Detroit whom we followed through from dinnertime one evening to lunch the next day:

"SAXBY CAME home at 6 p.m., had a dry martini, watched the evening news and then shared a delicious dinner with his wife and three children. After dinner he took a bath, read the evening paper and watched the Dean Martin Show. The wife did the dishes, called her mother, took her bath and read a chapter of 'The Godfather.'

"Mr. Saxby said, 'Good night, dear. I have an early meeting tomorrow with some subcontractors to discuss a very important matter.'

"MRS. SAXBY said, 'Good night,

NO ONE could figure out exactly why the mirrow had fallen. Nevertheless the diner, -painfully injured, filed a lawsuit for damages against the hotel.

"He has no case," the management argued in court. "He cannot point to any specific thing we did wrong." But the court upheld the man's

"Mirrors do not ordinarily, fall off walls," reasoned the court. "unless someone is negligent."

THE COURT was invoking a famous legal doctrine known as res ipsa loquitur - "the thing speaks for itself." This doctrine is widely used when there is no direct, eye-witness evidence of an act of negligence. Weighing the odds, the law decides that an act of negligence - even though unseen - probably did occur.

Using res ipsa loquitur, a court found negligence when a car, parked on a steep slope, started to roll downhill. Chances were good, said the court, that the driver had neglected

At 7:13 p.m., in the main dining to set his brakes and cramp his front wheel against the curb Also using res ipsa loquitur, another

court found negligence when a housewife encountered a piece of glass in a newly opened can of spinach. Chances were good, said the court, that someone in the canning factory had been careless.

BUT THE mere fact that an accident has happened does n o t necessarily justify the use of the doctrine. Consider this situation:

A woman climbing down from a trolley lost her footing and fell to the pavement. Demanding damages later from the trolley company, she said the car had probably moved just as she was getting off.

BUT THE court said there was an equal probability that she herself had simply failed to watch her step. With no odds in her favor, said the court, she could not use res ipsa loquitur to win her case.






