## Cook, Blackwell Head 1980 UF Campaign

John R. Cook and John Blackwell have been named co-chairmen of the Friona Area United Way campaign for 1980, it was announced this week.

The 1980 drive will be kicked off on Monday, November 10 with a breakfast at the Girl Scout House beginning at 6:30 a.m.

Cook and Blackwell announced that the goal for 1980 will be \$11,488.00. This is an increase of about eight per cent over the 1979 United Way budget of \$10,590.00.

One new agency to participate in the 1980 fund drive will be Brownies, who will receive \$500 from the drive. Otherwise, the increase is mainly due to inflation, the drive chairmen say.

A speaker for the UF kickoff breakfast will be named soon, according to Cook and Blackwell. "We hope that if you are contacted to assist with the drive, that you will be willing to give of your time and efforts, so we may achieve our goal in a short time," they say.

Agencies included in the 1980 drive include: Boy Scouts, \$2500; Girl Scouts, \$2500; Red Cross, \$1200; Salvation Army, \$900; Cerebral Palsy, \$760; Emergency Fund, \$600; Friona 4-H Club, \$200; U.S.O., \$100; Texas Mental Health, \$153; United Way of Texas, \$50; Little League, \$1200; Cub Scouts, \$800; Brownies, \$500, and Autistic Children, \$25.00; for a total of \$11,488.00.

## Race Develops In Contest

Heading into its sixth week, races are beginning to develop in the Friona Star's football contest.

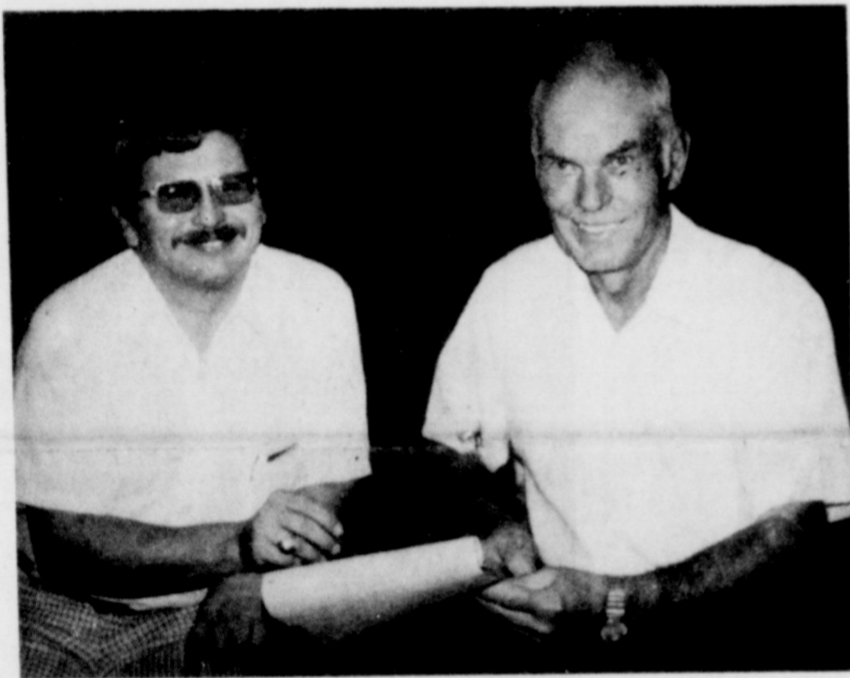

## Area Hit By Wind

The Friona area was buffeted by gale-force winds for a short time last Sunday evening. The winds lasted only briefly, but did considerable damage while they lasted.

The weather front also brought an electrical storm, and a small twister which blew a truck off the road on the eastern edge of Friona. Numerous reports were heard as to broken windows, damaged yard fences, and trees which lost limbs, etc. Several residents said the blast caused their houses to shake.

Some damage also was reported to the area's corn crop, the harvest of which was interrupted again. The system left .51 inch of rain in Friona, but some reports of up to two inches were received in the area.

**THE TERMINATION** of the Bookmobile program, which has operated in Parmer County for the past 18 years, is a very regrettable situation.

The termination of the program is not due to lack of support of the program in terms of usage by the Parmer County people nor is it due to lack of support by the Parmer County Commissioner's Court.

Yearly statistics have shown that the Bookmobile has had wide-spread use throughout the years.

Its Summer Reading Program has benefitted hundreds of youngsters in a four-county area who might not have otherwise been exposed to books during the summer season.

The program had a great selling point and appeal--that of getting library facilities to the rural areas, which are far from city libraries.

It has been possible to order, through the Bookmobile, books, films, or other materials through the Texas State Library. This service has also been widely used by Parmer County residents.

Youngsters in Bovina, for example, needing material for a special school project, could order it through the Bookmobile, and the material could be delivered in a subsequent Bookmobile stop.

Even the newest novel or biography could be checked out from the Bookmobile, by adults or young readers.

The Bookmobile program has been funded through the county governments of four counties--Bailey, Cochran, Parmer and Lamb.

It has been one of those programs that none of the participating counties could have afforded by themselves, but through cooperation was able to make available to their residents.

Everyone is aware of how budgets have been strained in recent years. The Bookmobile was recently advised that Lamb County would not include its share of the Bookmobile program in its 1981 budget.

The cooperative venture has been funded on a pro-rata basis, based on population, as luck would have it, Lamb County is the most populous county of the four, and paid the most into the program.

Thus when Lamb County pulled out of the program it virtually doomed the Bookmobile, which has announced intentions of terminating its scheduled runs at the end of the year.

This was a program which benefitted people from all walks of life--rich or poor, White or Black.

We hate to see such a vital program terminated, but there is apparently no alternative. It was just the latest victim of inflation.

**IST THE CAR;** 2nd the door--Henry Ford built his first successful motor car in a brick storage building at the rear of the rented house in which he resided. On the day he was to take it out for its trial run, he discovered that the car was too big to fit through the door. He broke away a part of the wall, intending to have it repaired when he returned.

Unfortunately, his landlord happened by during his absence and saw the damage. He was waiting with blood in his eye when Ford came back. The latter apologized for what he had done and offered to call the bricklayers over at once. He explained that he had been out for a spin in his car.

"You mean, that thing actually ran?" said the landlord, his anger changing to wonder.

Ford nodded.

"If that is the case," suggested the landlord, "don't brick up the wall. Put in a swinging door so the car can get in and out."

And thus it was that the garage door made its debut.

# FRIONA FLASHBACKS

....from the files of The Friona Star

**50 YEARS AGO--SEPT. 12, 1930**

On the first day of school Monday, Coach Mims' call for football was answered by 26 eager men, this being a more enthusiastic turnout than has been the case for several seasons. Three lettermen reported, Glenn Reeve, tackle, John Luther Furlong, end, and Clifton Boatman, guard. Reeve was unanimously elected captain to pilot the Chiefs in their encounters.

**45 YEARS AGO--SEPT. 13, 1935**

Enrollment in Friona schools has reached 453 students. There are 165 students in high school, which compares favorably with the enrollment of last year, and there are 288 enrolled in grade school. Enrollment in high school is composed of 49 freshmen, 34 sophomores, 44 juniors, 24 seniors, and 17 post-graduates.

**35 YEARS AGO--SEPT. 7, 1945**

At a called meeting of the Friona School Board Thursday night, August 30, O.B. Ginn, superintendent of schools, resigned his post and C.D. Holmes, a former grade school principal, has taken over as superintendent. Mr. Ginn has served the school for five years, two as grade school principal and three as superintendent.

**30 YEARS AGO--SEPT. 7, 1950**

The Friona area will have a re-activated Chamber of Commerce and Agriculture. This was the decision reached at the public meeting held Tuesday evening and attended by some 30 Friona businessmen and farmers. W.O. Green, Clovis businessman and president of their Chamber of Commerce, spoke to the group and emphasized the need of a central organization in a community.

**25 YEARS AGO--SEPT. 9, 1955**

Formal ground-breaking ceremony for the building of the new Parmer County Community Hospital will be held Saturday afternoon, immediately following the Fair Parade, at the building site north of the present hospital. Everyone is invited to attend the ceremony according to Jimmie Baxter, hospital administrator. J.B. McFarland, an ardent supporter of the hospital development, will break the first dirt in the ceremony.

**20 YEARS AGO--SEPT. 8, 1960**

A meeting of all interested parties who would like to become members of a proposed Friona Country Club are asked to attend an organizational meeting at the Production Credit Association office Monday night at 8 p.m. The meeting will be for the purpose of electing a board of

directors. It is proposed to construct a nine-hole golf course on the Ed Massey property which adjoins Friona on the southwest along Highway 60.

**15 YEARS AGO--SEPT. 9, 1965**

Bringing the first load of maize to a Friona elevator at noon on Wednesday were Leland Gustin and Houston Bartlett, who farm several miles northwest of Friona. The grain was marketed at West Friona Grain, tested 58 pounds to the bushel and 14.47 per cent moisture.

**10 YEARS AGO--SEPT. 10, 1970**

Ann Hurst, 16-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Andy Hurst and junior at Friona High School, was crowned Maize Queen to reign over the city's 14th annual celebration, a day-long contest. First runnerup in the contest was Esther Smith, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Smith. Vicki Mingus, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Glen Mingus, was second runnerup in the contest.

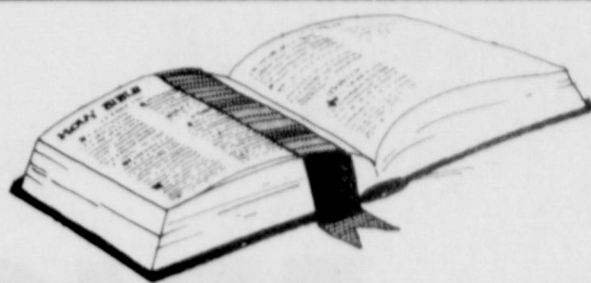
**5 YEARS AGO--SEPT. 14, 1975**

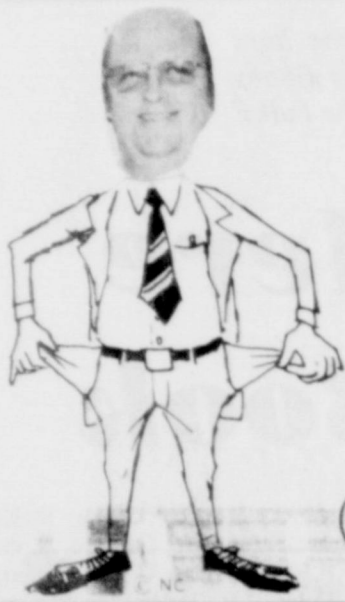
His greatest promise to you is righteousness, reconciliation to God the Father.

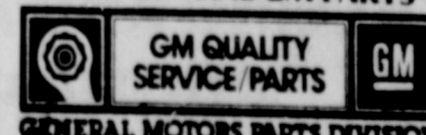

# Vega Impressive In 31-0 Victory

The Chieftains dropped their fifth game of the season last Friday at Vega, as the hometown Longhorns rolled to a 31-0 win.

Vega rolled up 481 yards total offense, and held the Chieftains to only 72 net yards and five first downs during the game.

"We had some breaks but couldn't capitalize on them. This was our worst beating of the year," said Coach Pete Hubbard.

Adding to the team's woes was an injury to defensive end Michael Deaton, who suffered a broken foot and will be out for the balance of the season.

The Longhorns were ranked 13th in the state. It was the second time in three weeks for the Chieftains to face a rated team and take their lumps as a result.

"The kids continue to show spirit. They never give up. Sometimes in the fourth quarter, they are still fighting as hard as they were at the start," Hubbard said.

Vega scored early in the first quarter, following a recovery of a Friona fumble. Rick Jones ran six yards for the TD, and Fred Fangman's kick gave the 'Horns a 7-0 lead.

The hosts picked up two touchdowns in the second quarter. Scotty Cook ran nine yards for a score, and then duplicated it a little later in the period. The PAT kick try failed after Cook's first TD, and a run was stopped after the second one, as Vega enjoyed a 19-0 halftime lead.

The Chieftains fought Vega on even terms in the third quarter, with neither team able to cross the goal line.

But Vega got back in the scoring column in the fourth period, when Brad Cannon took a 26-yard pass from Cook to make the score 25-0.

Fangman, who was Vega's leading ground-gainer with 195 yards, got his only touchdown of the game in the final quarter on an 18-yard run. The

running try for points failed, and the 31-0 score was the game's final count. So well in command was the Vega team that they never were forced to punt during the entire game.

"If these kids can continue to give it their best, there are some good things in their future," Hubbard said.

## M. C. Osborn Elected To District Board

McFarland C. Osborn of Friona was recently re-elected to the Parmer County Soil and Water Conservation District board of directors on October 7. Osborn represents Zone 2 of the district.

The purpose of the Parmer S.W.C.D., with headquarters in Friona is to promote sound soil and water conservation programs on farm and ranch lands within the district and to serve as a voice for farmers and ranchers on conservation matters and other issues affecting private property rights of landowners.

The board of directors coordinates the conservation efforts of various local, state and federal agencies and other organizations and has authority to enter into working agreements with these governmental agencies and private concerns to carry out its purposes.

As one of five individuals serving on the district board of directors, Osborn will be responsible for district policies and procedures for carrying out the district program within the framework of the Texas soil conservation district law.

In other areas of leadership, Osborn is active in Evening Lions Club, Chamber of Commerce, and Texas Wheat Board.

M.C. and his wife Ann have five children.

In Texas there are 200 soil and water conservation districts. Each is a legal subdivision of state government organized by local agricultural landowners with the assistance of the Texas State Soil and Water Conservation Board. Unlike most other legal subdivisions of state government, S.W.C.D.s do not have the powers of taxation or eminent domain. All conservation programs managed by the districts are of a voluntary nature to the landowner or operator.

Organized in November 1947, the Parmer County S.W.C.D. makes its services available to all land users in the District. No regard is given to the race, sex, or size of the operating unit of the person making application for assistance.

## Sales Totals Given For Parmer Co.

State Comptroller Bob Bullock Tuesday reported that gross sales in Texas during the first quarter of 1980 totaled \$60.9 billion.

He said first quarter sales this year passed 1979 first quarter sales by \$12.4 billion.

Bullock said the sales tax analysis of gross sales for January, February and March show that 250,681 outlets reported gross sales.

The Comptroller's office also released a computer analysis showing reported sales for each of the state's 254 counties and a sales tax analysis broken down by the state's 25 Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas.

First quarter sales in 1980 for Harris County were \$15.9 billion as recorded by 40,987 reporting outlets compared to \$12.4 billion reported in the first quarter of 1979 by 41,727 outlets.

Parmer County's gross sales for the quarter amounted to \$16,751,724.

Neighboring Bailey County reported gross sales of \$19,025,539, and Castro County's sales for the same period were \$27,208,602.

### Loans Are Available

The Small Business Administration's (SBA) declaration No. 1900 for drought has brought much needed assistance to the agriculture industry in Texas.

"The disaster victim is eligible for crop losses sustained during the 1980 growing season providing the crop was in the ground during the incident period of the declaration, regardless of the harvest date," stated Russell R. Berry, Lubbock District Director of the SBA, "and partial crop losses will be computed only after harvest and determination of actual yield."

The following formula will be used to compute eligible loss: Acres planted x established yield x percentage of loss x market price (less insurance received, less ASCS low yield payment and other recoveries) equals eligible loss.

Farmers and ranchers have until February 12, 1981 to file their physical loss applications under this declaration. Agriculture-related businesses have until May 12, 1981 to file for Economic Injury Disaster Loans.
