After the launch, the first ever in darkness, the astronauts orbited earth twice and then were propelled on a path toward the moon, where they hope to find the missing links in man's knowledge of lunar evolution.

The smooth flight was blemished by only two small, nagging, but not serious problems. An alarm system in the cabin of the spacecraft was sounding without reason whenever the astronauts threw certain switches. ALARM PROBLEM It was a more serious problem earlier, however, that delayed Apollo 17's launch. Officials on the ground said the lost time would be recovered by a speeded up voyage to lunar orbit and Monday's moon landing would occur at the originally scheduled time.

The astronauts ended their long work day at about 9:40 a.m. EST when they started a rest period of about six hours.

The caution and warning system which had been giving frequent false alarms was turned off for the rest period. Cernan told Mission Control

Mission Control said the he would sleep wearing a communications head set so he could be awakened in the event a genuine emergency arose. The spacecraft's complex communications system allows Mission Control to monitor the condition of all of the systems on

the moon ship. As the crew began the rest period, their craft was about 47,000 miles from earth and was speeding toward the moon at 6,374 miles per hour. The moon at that time was about 200,000 miles away.

A computer which refused to acknowledge a manual signal from launch control technicians caused the Apollo 17 countdown to stop less than a half minute before the huge Saturn 5 rockets were to ignite.

Battling against time, engi-

neers at Cape Kennedy and at the Marshall Spaceflight Center at Huntsville, Ala., quickly developed and tested a plan to outwit the confused computer. The new system worked and Apollo 17 blazed into space at 12:33 a.m. EST, less than an hour before the ever-changing position of sun, earth and moon would have forced a 24-hour

postponement. SMOOTH, MAN Despite the countdown, the

launch was smooth and spectacular:

While hundreds of thousands of persons watched from Cape Kennedy viewing areas, the 36story Saturn 5 rocket lifted slowly, majestically from its nest of concrete and steel, climbing into a nearly clear, black Florida sky.

the rocket's 2,200-foot tail of flame burned away the darkness and lighted the sand flats and Atlantic beaches where the awed crowds watched

After orbiting earth for nearly three hours, the astronauts re-ignited the third stage of their Saturn 5 rocket. The powerful thrust sent them hurtling out of earth's gravity grasp and put them firmly on their way to the moon.

About an hour later, at 5:20 a.m. EST, the astronauts freed their command ship from the third-stage rocket, which is called the S4B. The spac3men turned their cone-shaped craft and linked its pointed nose with the lunar module, which still nested in the S4B.

After securing three latches which had earlier failed to engage properly, the astronauts activated a spring system which ejected the combined command ship America and lunar module Challenger from

#### **State Attorneys Favoring Death** Penalty, 32-1

CORONADO, Calif. (AP) -With only one dissenting vote, the nation's state attorneys general have recommended reinstatement of the death penalty for certain crimes.

The National Association of Attorneys General voted 32-1 Wednesday for a resolution asking that "the death penalty be provided as a legal punishment where it is appropriate by the Congress and the state legislatures.

The only dissenter was a representative of Minnesota Atty. Gen. Warren Spannaus. Some attorneys general were absent or did not vote.

She is American Legion Auxiliary (ALA) and Veterans Administration Voluntary Service (VAVS) representative of Big Spring.

COLLECTED BOXES Mrs. H. D. Bruton, deputy representative of the VAVS Advisory Committee, serves as Mrs. Rea's assistant. She is responsible for collecting enough empty boxes of all sizes, a project that starts in March She has worked with the gift shop since it started in 1950.

## Wholesale Prices Rise

WASHINGTON (AP) - The rise in wholesale prices accelerated sharply in November, dampening the Nixon administration's hopes that Inflation has been brought under control, government officials said today.

The Labor Department's Bureau of Labor Statistics reported that the wholesale price index rose six-tenths of one per cent, both on an adjusted and unadjusted basis, last month. It was the biggest increase in wholesale prices since July and it reversed a recent trend on slower price increases at the wholesale level. The index was pushed up by price increases

of fresh vegetables, eggs and dairy products, cars

and furniture, lumber, leather and some textile

products. Also contributing to the rise were in-

creases in the prices of coal, hides and skins, and natural gas. The report means that it will be difficult for President Nixon to reach his target of slowing the rate of inflation to at least 3 per cent by the end of the year. Rises in wholesale prices are

usually reflected quickly in retail prices. In the six months that ended in November, wholesale prices went up at a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 5.7 per cent. That rate has slowed somewhat in the last 3 months, mainly because the index declined slightly in October on an unadjusted basis.



In the spring of 1912, Alvin Clarence Thomas, 20, was in Joplin, Mo., beating a fellow named Snow Clark out of \$500

in a game of nine-ball. To give Clark a chance to get even, Thomas wagered \$500 he could jump across the pool table without touching it. An old mattress was positioned on the floor beside the pool table. Then, with a running start, Thomas dived head-first over. the table.

#### 'SINKS EVERYBODY'

While Thomas who now lives in Colleyville, a Fort Worth suburb, was counting his money, someone asked Clark what his name was "It must be Titanic," Clark said. "He sinks everybody."

PALO ALTO, Calif. (AP) - Santa Claus standards are higher than ever this season, and old St. Nick himself might have a tough time getting hired by department stores.

So says Tressa Houck, operator of a Santa Claus employment service for four years in Palo Alto, just south of San Francisco.

"There are black Santas, bilingual Santas and Santas of all sizes and shapes," said Mrs. Houck, whose Western Girl agency has placed more than 400 Santas around the county over the years.

In an average day, she said, Santa may interview 1,200 children.

For the \$3 an hour they are paid, the fat, jolly gents she hires are expected to work six days a week; avoid smoking and drinking like the plague; eschew drugs, even prescription types; roll out the Santa-spiel endlessly - and be prepared for the worst.

"We always keep a spare pair of pants handy," said Mrs. Houck.

### Time To Do Something

Texas voters' treatment of the 14 state constitutional amendments on the Nov. 7 ballot demonstrates a number of truths.

First and foremost, the election outcome showed again and beyond dispute that constitutional amendments are an unwise and unsatisfactory approach to good public policy.

One thoroughly innocuous amendment was on the ballot — No. 2, which would abolish the Lamar County Hospital District (Paris). Why should anyone outside Lamar County care, and certainly, why should anyone oppose that proposition?

But 911,643 Texans voted no. Fortunately, however, it passed, with 1,470,348 voting yes.

And why should a voter not ballot the same way - either yes or no, on amendment No. 9, which would authorize Soil Conservation District directors to hold local civic offices, and amendment No. 12, which would authorize all state employes INCLUDING Soil Conservation District directors to hold civic offices?

No. 9 was defeated, 1,060,370 to 1,441,773, while **No. 12** passed 1,288,338 to 1,223,487.

Three other amendments lost, and here was valid reason for knowledgeable voters to differ on these issues. Two concerned pay raises — No. 1 for members of the legislature, and No. 11 for

sided.

West opened the king of hearts and was permitted to hold the trick, as East followed with the three. West assumed that when his partner failed to give him an encouraging signal in the suit, that South must have the ace. He feared that a continuation might offer declarer an opportunity to develop North's long card for a discard by playing the ace

and another heart. Deciding that it was necessary to attack diamonds without delay, West shifted to the five of that suit. East played the jack which dislodged declarer's ace.

South had already conced-

BY CHARLES H. GOREN ed one heart trick and was confronted with an additional loser each in hearts and diamonds. If the king of spades did not succumb, his contract might go on the rocks. Before making a play in trumps, however, declarer decided to take a finesse first in clubs.

If the queen were favorably located, South planned to discard one of his red suit losers on North's third club. thereby assuring the success of his contract. Even if the finesse failed, the defense could do no better than cash a diamond trick inasmuch as declarer still had the ace of hearts.

A club was led and the jack was played from dummy. East won the trick with the queen, cashed the queen of diamonds and shifted to a heart. South put up the ace and played the dummy's high clubs, discarding his remaining heart on the third round. He now tried the spade finesse as a last resort; however, when West turned up with the king, the decision went in favor of the West's diamond shift at

trick two was the key play of the deal. If he continues with a heart, declarer is in position to restrict his losses by playing the ace and another heart to clear the suit. If a diamond shift is now forthcoming, South is in with the ace and cashes the ace of trumps, permitting the king to remain outstanding. He then crosses over the dummy in clubs and plays the 13th heart on which he disposes of his remaining diamond. The defense is thereby limited to two heart tricks

plus the king of spades.





The war between banks and robbers is continuing, and sometimes it's a little hard to tell who has the edge.

On the one hand, bank robberies are soaring, up 122 per cent since 1966. That's 2.586 offenses a year - about nine

On the other hand, banks are getting tough on security, using everything from hidden cameras to - believe it or not - exploding money

GREEN STUFF One reason for the soaring rate of robberies is that everyone's getting into the act. A 12-year-old boy on a bicycle robbed an eastern bank not too long ago. Extremist groups have been looking to banks for an extra supply of the green

Other robber groups are more professional, according to Schroder. One man recently held up an eastern bank, flew to LA. and robbed another, then flew to still another city and rolled a third.

"He may have been a member of one of these extremist groups," Schroder speculated.

Like their brothers, the bank -burglars, robbers are learning new techniques to handle tightened security. More and more robbers are wearing masks to fool the hidden cameras. But FBI agents, in

reply, whave become adept at deducing physical peculiarities hidden by the masks. Bank tellers have been told not to get in the way of robbers - just give them the money

and hope they don't shoot. But that doesn't mean that the banks don't have ways of getting at thieves before or just after they leave the banks.

The thief jumped into a waiting car and sped off.

Then there was the case of the two men who, early this vear, posed as Brink's guards and made off with \$300,000 from a branch of the Lake County National Bank in Mentor, Ohio.

The real Brink's guards showed up an hour later to make their routine collection.

### 1,001 Pen Gig Upheld In Texas

AUSTIN (AP) — The Texas Court of Criminal Appeals Wednesday upheld a 1,001-year prison sentence for rape, but reiterated that such sentences "serve no purpose."

Larry Joe Knox was assessed the prison time by a Dallas jury that convicted him of raping a 25-yearold divorcee in her apartment about 2 a.m. June 31, 1969.

The high court noted that in a previous case it had said sentences beyond a human lifetime did not serve any useful purposes, since parole eligibility is the same for a 60-year, life or 1,000-year sentence.

A convict is eligible for parole after serving a third of his sentence, or 20 years, whichever is less, with reduction in time behind bars for good behavior. The court said the legislature should set minimum and maximum sentences for each criminal offense.

"We adhere to what we said ... and again invite the legislature's attention to this matter,'

The rape victim said Knox broke into her apartment and choked her while telling her not to scream.
