**THE LIBERAL WING** of the Democratic party is currently pressing for an "open convention" for the upcoming Democratic convention.

The party has spent millions of dollars in holding primaries or state caucuses, in order to determine which candidate will get delegate votes at the convention. More than 20 million people turned out to vote in the states which held primaries.

And Ted Kennedy, who came out of these primaries with only about a third as many delegates as President Carter, now is leading the movement which would require the president to release his delegates.

In effect, they are asking the officials of the Democratic convention to change their rules, now that the primaries have all been held, and the casting of the die is ready.

You may recall that it was this same liberal element, champions of the Equal Rights Amendment, which, when they did not achieve approval of the amendment by the prescribed deadline somehow succeeded in getting the deadline for passage extended.

We wonder if they will now be successful in wrecking Carter's nomination through a similar changing of rules.

If so, then our entire system for nominating, and even electing a president will be wrecked, and the average voter will have lost their voice in the process.

We are not necessarily a Carter fan, but we believe these liberal Democrats, who have been seeing the poll results which show Carter trailing Reagan, should not be allowed to run the convention to their satisfaction, and ignore the wishes of the millions of voters who participated in the party primaries.

It will be interesting to see what happens during the upcoming convention. One thing is for sure. The moderates and conservatives are facing a battle royal from the liberals, who in reality are already beaten, but want to throw out the results of this "game," and start completely over, from scratch.

The worst of it is that the liberal-minded national TV media is leading the fight for the open convention, or at least keeping the issue hot.

**THE FUROR OVER** President Carter's "Brother Billy" is, of course, one of the things which has caused the liberal element to start their "Dump Carter" move.

Billy Carter has definitely not been much of an asset to his brother while he has been in office. This is unfortunate, but is just one of those things.

The younger Carter's activities prompted a statement this week from Stuard Udall, who said there should be a constitutional amendment to the effect that only men who had been adopted could run for president. This he figured, would solve the problem of bad publicity by way of his family after a president had been elected.

Udall had another gem. When asked if he was a candidate in the "open convention," he said, "If nominated, I would run for the Mexican border, and if elected, I would fight extradition."

## Bills May Be Shocking

Extremely hot weather has increased the use of electricity for air conditioning during the last few weeks and has established a new system peak for Southwestern Public Service Company. The peak, which is the highest amount of electricity used during the year, reached 2,651,000 kilowatts on July 14, at 5 p.m.

Cooling systems are one of the largest users of electricity and as a

result, many customers will see their electric bill go higher than in the past few months.

SPS officials say that on an average, customers with refrigerated air conditioning will experience an increase of about 42 per cent over the same period last year. The increase is due in part to the increase in rates granted June 2, but due mostly to the hot weather.

## Frionans Complete Mission Project

Some 45 residents of Friona took part July 20-25 in one of the most sweeping and ambitious "good neighbor" programs ever undertaken here.

Sponsored by the First Baptist Church and Templo Bautista of Friona, the efforts resulted in a new church building, a new water well, plus special medical care for the people in Banderas, Mexico.

During the week, the Frionans worked in a boiling sun that sent temperatures as high as 120 degrees. They lived in tents, and the only air conditioning was "natural." Yet, they accomplished their task, even finishing ahead of schedule.

Also during the week, a Bible School was conducted for the children of Banderas during the daytime, and each evening a revival service was held, with Rev. Rudy Trevino, pastor of Templo Bautista, doing the preaching.

"I have never seen so much hard work in my life. Those people were at it from early until late. It was a labor of love, too. During the entire week, I never heard a cross word or complaint," said Rev. Carroll Green, pastor of Friona's First Baptist Church.

And, the group returned home without mishap, except for some minor bruises and callouses one could expect.

The project has been completed at a cash cost of around \$17,000. The best part is that it is completely paid for. A special "in-gathering offering" by First Baptist Church on July 20 brought in enough to pay for the project.

The church members had worked for days getting everything ready for the trip. The church building was built of pre-stressed concrete, under the direction of Delton Lewellen, and the walls were made in Friona.

Also before the group left Friona, they made church pews, a lectern, built a shower, and a number of other things which were to be used in the new church.

The first group of 15 left Friona at 6 a.m. July 20. They took a large semi-truck loaded with materials and supplies, two pick-up trucks and a van.

Banderas is about 400 miles from Friona. You go by way of Van Horn, and probably the highlight of the trip is crossing the Rio Grande River. There are a couple of selected places in the river where you hope to be able to drive your vehicles across. If this is not possible, the "long way" adds time to the trip.

But the river cooperated this time. The first group arrived in Banderas at

7 p.m. Sunday and established their camp. The truck was unloaded and tents were pitched.

First order of business on Monday was the water well. A group from Van Horn had dug the well in April, in preparation for the project. The Friona group brought a windmill and water tank.

The well tower was raised, and the first beam of the new church building was up by 3 p.m. Monday, and by 9 p.m., the well was pumping water, much to the delight of the Friona group.

Rev. Green had built a shower, which was installed near the well.

At 3 p.m. Monday, the party had been joined by the second group from Friona, who had left home about 5 a.m. that day, led by Rev. Green and Geary Brogden.

By 7 p.m. Tuesday, the floor of the new church had been completed. A sand and gravel crew, headed by Danny Campbell and Mike Buchanan had worked tirelessly. "Although the temperature had reached 121 degrees at noon, the Lord sent a cloud cover and a breeze, or we never would have made it," said Rev. Green.

The building really took shape on Wednesday, and was complete enough for church services that night. A crowd of over 200 people overflowed the building. Most of the Friona delegation watched and listened through the windows.

At the close of the service, one of the local men took a guitar, and the people gathered around and sang a number of songs.

"The people there were so grateful for their new church building, and for their water well. They also pitched in and helped us. About eight of the local church members worked side by side with us every day," said Bro. Green.

Also on Wednesday, a medical team composed of Dr. Bob Alexander, RN Mary Johnston, and Dr. Beto Gutierrez of Carlsbad, N.M. were flown down by Fred Church, in a plane belonging to Friona State Bank.

The medical team spent all day Thursday seeing local residents, and examined 71 persons in all, with a variety of problems. The patients

ranged in age from two weeks to 88 years of age. Kathy Buchanan and Jacquelyn Hight assisted the team.

The group did not lack for food. Curtis Murphree was in charge of the cooks. The menu during the week included fried chicken and trimmings, pork chops and barbecue. Breakfast was not slighted, with eggs, bacon and sausage, or pancakes prepared daily, with coffee or Tang.

During the daytime, the ladies were kept busy preparing ice water and cold drinks, which were especially in demand on Tuesday when the temperature was so high. The cool drinks at the noon and evening meals were just as welcome as the food.

A pump was installed on the windmill, so it can pump water when there is no wind. The well water also was used in mixing cement for the church floor.

On Thursday evening, the service was held around the new well, with those attending sitting wherever they could find a seat (some pews were taken out to the well). A baptismal service was held, with four people being baptized in a tank which was built adjacent to the well.

Among those taking part in the effort were David and Betty Smith, Kenneth and Stephen Smith, Philip Weatherly, Danny Campbell, Raymond Hamilton, Delton and Betty Lewellen, Ruben Villanueva, Danny Murphree, Ralph Robinson, Jim and Milton Dixon and Mike Buchanan (group one).

Danny Compos, who lives in Clint, Texas, is pastor of the church at Banderas. The Friona church has been working closely with the folks there for the past two or three years, and provides a partial salary for Compos, who serves three Mexican churches in all.
