Copter Crash Claims Seven

FT. KNOX, Ky. (AP) - Seven soldiers were killed early today when an Army helicopter crashed during a flight to evaluate a new night vision device, a base spokesman said.

The wreckage of the helicopter was found at 8:20 this morning, nearly eight hours after the craft was due to return to the base.

A search for the chopper was launched when the UH1-H helicopter failed to return to the post's Godman Army Air Field at 12:35 a.m. as

The wreckage was found about two miles north of Muldraugh, Ky., nearly four miles north of the base airfield, the base spokesman said.

Names of the dead were withheld pending notification of next of kin.

Many Grads Here To Study Trades

Of the 325 spring graduates at Big Spring High School, around 2/3 of the class will probably enter either a four-year college, a junior college or a trade school. Only 20 per cent will enter a

four year college. Of that group, probably only 15 per cent will complete a four-year college course. Many will complete trade courses. The largest percentage attend junior colleges and many of these eventually finish their course, although not always in four

This is according to counselors at the high school, who estimate that a very small percentage of the class - possibly only one or two per cent

will go into the military service immediately. Around 20 per cent of the class have already married or plan to marry within three months after graduation. Most of these will then find themselves in the position of having to go immediately to work, although a small group will try to marry and attend college as well, counselors

Election Commission Proposed By President

Spurred by Watergate revelations, President Nixon asked Congress today to create a special nonpartisan commission to conduct "a complete re-examination of our system of elections and campaign practices." **ABUSES**

In a special message, Nixon said "recent disclosures of widespread abuses during the presidential campaign of 1972" make reform an urgent and essential priority item to help "restore the faith of the American people in the integrity of their political processes."

While not once mentioning the word Watergate in his message or in a companion address prepared for radio broadcast, Nixon said many more disclosures of 1972 campaign misdeeds "will doubtless soon be

Uniform Salary Scale Adopted By HC Board

Howard County Junior College trustees adopted an uniform faculty salary scale Tuesday, both for parttime and fulltime members, and then elected present administrative and teaching staff members to fill places they now hold.

The faculty scales begins with \$7,800 for a beginning teacher Bachelors degree and no experience or \$8,500 for a master's with no experience, and increases at the rate of \$100 per year up to 22 years and to a maximum of \$11,800 for a PhD. with 22 years SPELLED OUT



Something Food Basket

"I still think," said a cotton producer, "that we need to begin to think about raising food instead of fiber for our backs."

That time, as a long range proposition, may not be within a few years, but it likely will come in due season. It may not be by direct progression, but in indulations, depending upon various factors, not the least of which will be weather here and even more so - weather elsewhere in the

In this respect, we might get something of a trial run this year. There is every reason to believe that the fertile and productive Mississippi basin will be sorely limited this year by floods, etc. in its production of both food and fiber. The usual heavy plantings on the west slope of the continent are not measuring up to par, either, leaving the prospect that the Plains must take up the slack or else see critical shortages develop.

We do not know what the economics of it

will be, but we hope that farmers will find a way to put in more food crops such as practical types of truck. With the price situation as it is, there doubtless would be a record amount of food processed or put up, relieving the pressure on both the market and the family budget.

Pinto and blue lake beans come to mind, along with cream and black-eyed peas, perhaps corn, along with squash, okra, cucumbers. Irrigated areas can do this with reasonable assurance of good yields; for dryland there is more an element of chance - but worth taking.

I am torn between two attitudes. You see, someone has hurt me and my family terribly. This person lied, cheated, stole money and used us shamelessly. While I understand the Bible speaks of "forgiving" your enemy, yet Paul in Ephesians 5 says, "Don't let anyone deceive you with foolish words - have nothing to do with these people.' How do I handle this apparent conflict?

I commend you for trying to resolve a problem in Biblical interpretation. Too many, I'm afraid, when faced with alternatives, choose that which selfishly is easy and advantageous.

Actually there is no conflict. The apostle Paul in that Ephesian reference was talking of words which might contradict his earlier statement in verse 5 - about covetous and idolatrous people not inheriting Christ's Kingdom. The prevalence of sensual vice at Ephesus prompted Paul to warn the Christian about it. In his day, morality received no backing from the mythology.

Now, in no way does this suggest or even permit our removal from society, because after all, Jesus who was "separate from sinners" was always in the middle of people in need. These two references say that there is a way to have nothing to do with evil, that is, not be in any way a collaborator in wrongdoing, yet at the same time hang in there with Christian love and forgiveness. Certainly, the Christian is to go beyond patience and nonresistance. Love and forgiveness are sentiments love.



Around The Rim

loe Pickle

A most unusual Spring makes it impossible for me to resist further the temptation to write once more about our wildflowers. We've probably never had a greater array, although foliage is so lush that this may seem to hide some of the flowers.

THE MOST dominant color is yellow or gold. Right now there are two dominant varieties on the local scene — the paper flower and the yellow daisy, with its look-alike the paper daisy. The cut-leaf (or Engelmann) daisy supports a broad leaf foliage, and the thelesperma (with its light brown center, rises on a lacier plant as does the smaller sleepy daisy. Wild mustard has about disappeared from the scene; it largely presents a dried stalk now. The sneezeweed, with its brown center which quickly becomes a ball as the petals fall away. Much later the sunflower will come along. In some areas bitterweed is abundant, and yellow bladderpod is plentiful. The star performer is the buttercup genothera triloba or serrulata.

THERE ARE few - if any striking reds. The winecup, a beautiful but not too plentiful flower sometimes seen along the lowlands, may approach this, although it often tends toward purple. More likely colors are pinks - such as the delicate pink bindweed, or the pink evening prim-

Whites are not as extensive as one might suspect, but the lazy daisy, the Yuccu, the rock daisy and other similar blossoms offer a delightful change of pace and at times rise in clumps like a little bouquet.

OUR HEARTIEST flower in the prolific purples and lavenders is the tansy aster, called by some the Tahoka daisy. This year, because of abundant moisture or for some other

reason, they seem to have a deeper color than usual. Like bluebonnets in Central Texas, they blanket the landscape. A deep-colored and prolific performer is the prairie verbenae. The lighter range includes such things as the Texas thistle, purple cone flowers, horsemint, trompillo (or silver nightshade), occasionally a prairie larkspur, and the delicate (almost pink) devil's claw and desert

THE CACTI family will soon present a variety of colors with the prickly pear producing a profusion of exotic bronzes, crimsons and fuchsias. Much the same can be said for the cholla (that character which resembles spiny, jointed pickles).

Multi-colored flowers have no equal of the fire wheel or Indian blanket (Gaillardia). The Mexican hat, or cone flower, is another striking number, having a center that resembles the crown of a 10-gallon hat, and petals that turn down like a colorful brown and gold brim. The guara, or honeysuckle weed, more likely never had more blossoms, and the copper mallow are just coming along with their salmon and light bronze hues. The umbrella wort has a fragile, pastel green (almost white) blossom. The ground cherry has a hexagonal bloom, yellow on the outside, around a brown hexagon which envelops a yellow center.

THESE ARE but a few you can spot. There are scores and scores of others that I couldn't begin to identify. I keep hoping someone will in such a way that will enable more and more people to enjoy these flowers by name. In the meantime I recommend "Roadside Flowers of Texas" by Mary Motz Wills (U-T Press) or the beautiful Texas Highway Department folder, "Flowers of

Damaging Claim

WASHINGTON — A public attack on Greek exile leader Elias Demetracopoulos as "an obscure, Greek Communist journalist" at the height of the presidential campaign last fall has now been linked by federal agents to an anti-McGovern letter-writing campaign inspired by John B. Connally's Democrats-for-Nixon organization. Also attacked were Sens. Edmund Muskie, Hubert H. Humphrey and Henry M. Jackson in Florida, New Hampshire and elsewhere in last year primaries.

SHORTLY AFTER his nomination last summer, Sen. George McGovern gave a statement to Demetracopoulos. a Greek exile leader, pledging to cut off all U.S. military aid to Greece if elected. On Aug. 18, Mayor John Rousakis of Savannah, Ga., wrote McGovern that he was "shocked and appalled" both by this policy and by McGovern's "irresponsibility" choosing "an obscure Greek Com-

munist journalist" as his mouthpiece. That "obscure Greek Communist journalist" could only be Demetracopoulos, a respected editor and writer in pre-1967 Greece who has been lobbying against Greek strongman George Papadopoulos and Mr. Nixon's support for him ever

THE ATTACK on Demetracopoulos via Mayor Rousakis's private letter to McGovern was then published throughout the U.S. in the Greek-American press — not at the time it was written but just three weeks before the election. On Nov. 28, lawyers for Demetracopoulos formally asked the mayor to retract what looked like an "intention to defame" the exile Greek leader.

But it was not until Jan. 8 that the mayor found time to reply, and his reply stated that he had been wrong. It also stated that his original use of the word "Communist" to describe Demetracopoulos "was based on a report that was given to me.'

WHEN WE called the mayor to ask the source of this "report," he was evasive but finally said he had "read it" in a newspaper column. When we asked him to quote from that column. he said the column had reported that Demetracopoulos, upon leaving Greece after the coup d'etat in 1967, stopped off in Poland for a few days. This was the entire basis for his labelling Demetracopoulos "Communist," he insisted to us. "No one prompted me on this," the mayor

BUT ACCORDING to federal investigators, the essence of the mayor's letter to McGovern was originally drafted on Democrats-for-Nixon letterhead and sent to Mayor Rousakis. The mayor's own letter became a principal exhibit in the anti-McGovern campaign of Sam Nakis, named vice chairman of Democratsfor-Nixon in September to attract the large Greek ethnic vote to Mr. Nixon.

PEKING — Responding to questions cities. in an interview, this compact, intense bundle of energy might be addressing a rally of thousands. He is Prince Norodom Sihanouk, who is out to convince all his visitors that within the foreseeable future he will be returned to Cambodia as head of government in the country over which

he ruled for so many years.

AS AMERICAN B-52 bombers continue to batter Cambodia, Sihanouk is setting out on a journey to Eastern Europe and Africa to rally support for his cause. He is visiting the capitals of Rumania, Albania and Yugoslavia, and will also call at a half-dozen African nations that recognize him not as head of a government-in-exile but as the duly constituted head of state of Cambodia.

He certified this claim by returning recently to the liberated areas in Cambodia. In a secret journey of nearly three weeks accompanied by his wife. Princess Monique, he saw much of the country that had been taken by the Khmer Rouge, the Cambodian fighting units that have encircled Phnom Penh and other must go back to Phnom Penh.'

A FILM of the journey has been widely shown in China. The People's Republic has given Sihanouk complete support, providing the plane and crew for his return journey and the resources for his foray to Eastern Europe and Africa. This is one of the points of friction with the Soviet Union, since Moscow backs the Lon Nol government in Phnom Penh.

"Brezhnev does not like me and President Nixon does not like me," the prince says, his high, plaintive voice at an even higher pitch. "They are both for Lon Nol and he cannot win. Your press reports every day that he grows weaker and weaker.

Harry Jordan is 55, plays tennis, and thinks men tennis players are better than women tennis players.

But other than that, there's no similarity between him and Bobby Riggs. "I've got six sisters, three daughters and a wife," said Jordan, "and I don't need to get any women mad at me. I don't want them to think I'm a male chauvinist

Nevertheless, Jordan is in almost complete agreement with his contemporary Riggs, also 55, who claims that women netters are only one-fourth as good as men and proved it Sunday by defeating Margaret Court 6-2, 6-1 — the No. 1 women's plant in the world.

"I wasn't at all surprised, really. Riggs has been there longer and he played smarter tennis than Court. She has practiced against men who play a lot like many women do. They're power hitters that like to maintain a pace, and they work off each other's speed and power. The one who hits the hardest usually wins," commented Jordan, who watched the match with his daughter Judy, the No. 1 girl player at Big Spring High, and won a small wager.

Everytime Court would try to adapt to what he was doing, Riggs would change his style - and he's got a million of them." According to Jordan, who still plays at least two or three times a week, the outcome couldn't have been any other way.

Riggs said over and over that a good 55-year old man, or even some of the better 15-year old boys, could beat the top women regularly.

'I think that a good player of 55 years of age, who has kept himself in shape and worked out as much as Riggs, could handle the best women most of the time," Jordan agreed. "Even when I was a high school kid struggling along, I never did think any of those gals were nearly as good." Uh oh, maybe I shouldn't have quoted that.

"But please don't get me wrong. I'm not knocking women's tennis. I'm trying to promote it right now." Well okay, that's better.

Still, Jordan realizes that this wasn't just a one shot match, but in reality was the premier performance in what could become a tour featuring the "oldtimers," like Pancho Segura, Don Budge, Riggs, and some others. It all started two years ago when Riggs half-jokingly challenged then top-rated Billie Jean King to a match, and it snowballed when Mrs. Court, currently No. 1, accepted several weeks

"This is just a thing to help get some of the oldtimers back into prominence," offered Jordan. They missed out on the big money during their prime 25 or 30 years ago, and this seems to be the time to get back into it. The publicity received on Riggs' \$10,000 match victory certainly didnt' hurt things any.

Actually, just where this thing will come to is hard to say. There is talk of a return match between Riggs and Court, and other matches such as Riggs-Billie Jean King and Riggs-Chris Evert are being bandied about. A match pitting Riggs and 18-year-old Chris could be the best draw of them all, Jordan thinks.

'It would be a great money-making proposition," he said, "and that's the name of the game for tennis these days. However, I don't think Chris would stand any better chance against Riggs than Court did."

"If I was white, all America would be proud of me," Aaron said. "But I am black. There are some sick people in this world. Or else I wouldn't get the mail I do. These are sick people who thrive on trying to make other people miserable."

"I can't do anything about the mail," said Aaron, here with the Braves for a series with the Houston Astros. "I'd say that the ratio is 60-40, that 60 per cent of it is of a racist nature. "It's very offensive. They call me 'nigger'

and every other bad word you can come up with.' The Braves have a fulltime secretary in charge of Aaron's mail, which is increasing as he gets closer to the record. And Hank reads it all.

But why read such letters and postcards? "That's a good question, he said. "I don't know why. Except I always have, from the very start of my career. You get a piece of mail and you have to read it. I want to look at my own mail. I want to read what people are writing . . . what they think."

Aaron doesn't like the slurs he receives through the mail, but they won't deter him from his quest for the Babe's record.

"You can't ignore them," Aaron said. "They are here. But this is just the way things are for black people in America. It's something you battle

He obviously wants the record. "I'd be lying if I said I didn't," he said.
