





25 FATALITIES ON TEXAS ROADS

Two Die In Dance Hall Shooting

By The Associated Press Traffic accidents took the heaviest toll, as usual, in a rash of violent deaths across Texas during the weekend. There were 25 fatalities on streets and highways and the state recorded a total of 36 dead.

**STEPS TOWARD HEALING '72 PAINS**  
**Demos Mull Compromise**

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Democratic party took several more steps toward healing its 1972 wounds over the weekend, as rival factions showed a new willingness to compromise in the name of unity.

The most dramatic demonstration of the spirit of togetherness came Saturday when the party's Delegate Selection Commission unanimously approved the recommendations of its drafting committee for revising the rules that caused much of the 1972 unhappiness.

The rules brought charges of quotas and resulted in the exclusion of many old-line party leaders while producing record numbers of women, minorities and young people at last year's convention.

Although many party regulars and party chairman Robert S. Strauss still favor altering the provision on proportional representation, Strauss said after the meeting, "I don't feel black caucus and other liberals strongly enough to want to cause a big fight over it."

Such a battle would surely occur if the issue is reopened when the rules come before the full Democratic National Committee for approval early next year.

At another party meeting in Louisville, Ky., Friday, the black caucus and other liberals on the national committee supported top aide to Alabama Gov. George C. Wallace over a Mississippi liberal.

### Junta Eyes Hard Times

SANTIAGO — The head of Chile's military junta has warned that "very difficult days" of food shortages and soaring prices are ahead for the country.

"We must tighten our belts because we are going to lack foodstuffs and other essentials," Gen. Augusto Pinochet said here during a tour of provinces south of the capital.

"But this sacrifice will have to be shared, from the junta to the last Chilean citizen."

Prices, swollen by rampant inflation and a crumbling economy under the Marxist government of President Salvador Allende, skyrocketed this month after the junta removed price controls in an effort to encourage production.

Pinochet also said the state of siege in force since the Sept. 11 coup may be lifted within eight months but a "state of war" would be maintained beyond that. He did not elaborate on the difference between the measures, both of which grant the military virtually full power.

### Ex-Costa Rica President Dies

SAN JOSE, Costa Rica (AP) — Otilio Ulate, 82, president of Costa Rica from 1949 to 1953, died Saturday of a stroke. He was owner of the newspaper *Diario de Costa Rica*.

## Israelis Let Supplies Roll To Egyptian Units

ON THE CAIRO-SUEZ ROAD, Egypt (AP) — Senior Israeli and Egyptian military officers met 60 miles from Cairo at 1:30 a.m. Sunday on a desolate piece of no man's land.

Ten hours later, the first 10 of 100 Egyptian trucks with U.N. drivers crossed Israeli lines and headed for the Suez Canal carrying critical supplies for the beleaguered Egyptian 3rd Army.

**TRAPPED**  
The 20,000-man Egyptian force has been trapped for six days in the sweltering heat of the Sinai Desert along the southern portion of the canal.

The meeting between Israeli Maj. Gen. Aharon Yariv and Egyptian Brig. Bashir Shariff took place near a dry gully called Wadi al-Jandali.

They agreed that the Egyptians would leave the trucks loaded with water, food and medical supplies on their side of the cease-fire line, the Israelis would search each truck for concealed weapons and U.N. drivers would take them through the Israeli lines to their destination.

U.N. observers control the desert checkpoint here 60 miles from Cairo and 20 miles from the town of Suez. Israeli soldiers are dug in on one side, and sandbagged Egyptian fortifications can be seen through

binoculars on a low ridge less than a mile away.

"Every night there is firing — small arms firing — but that's nothing," said Capt. Carl Lohgius, a tall Swede who was trapped for 2½ days in a bunker on the east bank of the canal at the start of the war.

Shortly before the supply convoy moved past the checkpoint Sunday, more than a dozen open trucks, carrying blue-helmeted Finnish members of the U.N. peacekeeping force, rolled along the Cairo-Suez highway.

Lohgius said they were headed for the City of Suez, at the southern end of the canal.

Israeli officers kept newsmen from entering the town on Sunday saying there were sporadic grenade attacks.

An antiaircraft missile exploded overhead, missing two planes. The Israelis claimed it was an Egyptian missile and that the planes were theirs.

**BANDAGED ARMS**

On the road to Fayid, the Israelis had turned an old movie house into a prisoner of war transit center. An Israeli major said 3,000 POWs had been

through the windowless sandstone building, including 200 to 300 wounded.

Capt. Ahmed Magdi Samaha, 23, a captured Egyptian doctor, said the wounded POWs got good treatment: "It's given under my supervision."

The seats were gone from the former movie hall. The prisoners sat on the floor in groups, segregated by rank. A few had bandaged arms or legs.

Outside, an Israeli officer showed newsmen a can of dehydrated potatoes from Canada which he said had been sent from Rome for the Palestinian refugees. He said a large quantity of such cans were found in a nearby military base.

Another Israeli produced a can of boneless turkey from Canada with the same label and said a lot of them had been found in an arms dump near Suez.

WASHINGTON (AP) — Both houses of Congress faced a calendar laden with Watergate-related matters and anticipated little legislative action this week.

The Senate Judiciary Committee had the first activity scheduled — hearings beginning today into the firing of Watergate special prosecutor Archibald Cox. The first witness was to be Cox.

The full Senate and House will reconvene Tuesday at noon after the weekend recess.

Senate Judiciary Chairman James O. Eastland, D-Miss., said that besides Cox he expected to hear from former Atty. Gen. Elliot L. Richardson and Richardson's former deputy, William D. Ruckelshaus.

They left the administration Oct. 20 after refusing Nixon's order to fire Cox.

The House Judiciary Committee, meanwhile, will continue its study of whether to begin impeachment proceedings against Nixon.

The committee also is entrusted with Nixon's nomination of Rep. Gerald R. Ford to succeed Spiro T. Agnew as vice president, but no action is expected this week.

The Senate Rules Committee planned to meet this afternoon to discuss a timetable for the Ford hearings. Some Senate Democrats are urging a moratorium on the matter until questions arising from the firing of Cox are settled.

## LITTLE LEGISLATIVE ACTION To Talk Ford Timetable

In legislative action, the Senate will vote Tuesday on overriding Nixon's eighth veto of the year, this one on a \$216.7-million authorization for the U.S. Information Agency.

Nixon objected to a provision cutting off funds if the agency refused a congressional request for information or documents.

The House on Thursday will attempt to override Nixon's ninth veto, on a bill that would

limit a president's power to commit U.S. troops to hostile situations for more than 60 days without congressional approval.

Nixon's first seven vetoes this year were upheld by Congress.
