Most of those who testified voiced concern on the impact of the MX system on the region. Also testifying was Frank Ford of Hereford, on behalf of himself and
the Texas Corn Girowers Asn. Ford charged that the impact of the MX construction on groundwater supplies would be far greater than indicated
on the Air Force's draft on the Air Force's draft
Environmental Impact Statement
"The EIS just scratches the surface on the water (shortage) danger,"
Ford said. "Construction of the MX Ford said. "Construction of the MX system could reduce supplies to the point that there wouldn't be enough
water to support life in the Panhandle," he added.
Ford said that he was unconvinced
by Air Force estimates predicting tha by Air Force estimates predicting that
the total amount of water used by the the total amount of water used bespan
MX system during its 3 -year lifespan would not exceed "seven per cent" of
that currently consumed in the Panhandle each year.
"There is a big difference between
theoretical water supplies practical water supplies in the Texa Panhandle," the Hereford residen said.
He claimed that the MX system would amount to "an atrocious wast of taxpayers' money
