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News Review Of The Week

Monday, June 20

WASHINGTON — The U. S.-Nazi relations, reflected in the past two months in public speeches of mutual recrimination, a series of sharp diplomatic notes and a pronounced lack of cooperation, have approached a new high following Germany's complete disregard of four notes from Secretary of State Cordell Hull.

MILES CITY, Montana — Twenty of 29 known victims in the most tragic American railroad accident in a decade were identified tonight while exhausted searchers probed a silt filled tourist sleeper for more bodies.

Spy Investigation

NEW YORK — The government's first intensive spy investigation since the World War was climaxed today with the naming of 18 persons, including several German officials, in three indictments charging conspiracy and espionage.

TOKYO — Japan marked out today a vast "no-man's land" for foreigners in China where she warned war operations would probably be extended. She requested foreigners to evacuate the forbidden zone.

Tuesday, June 21

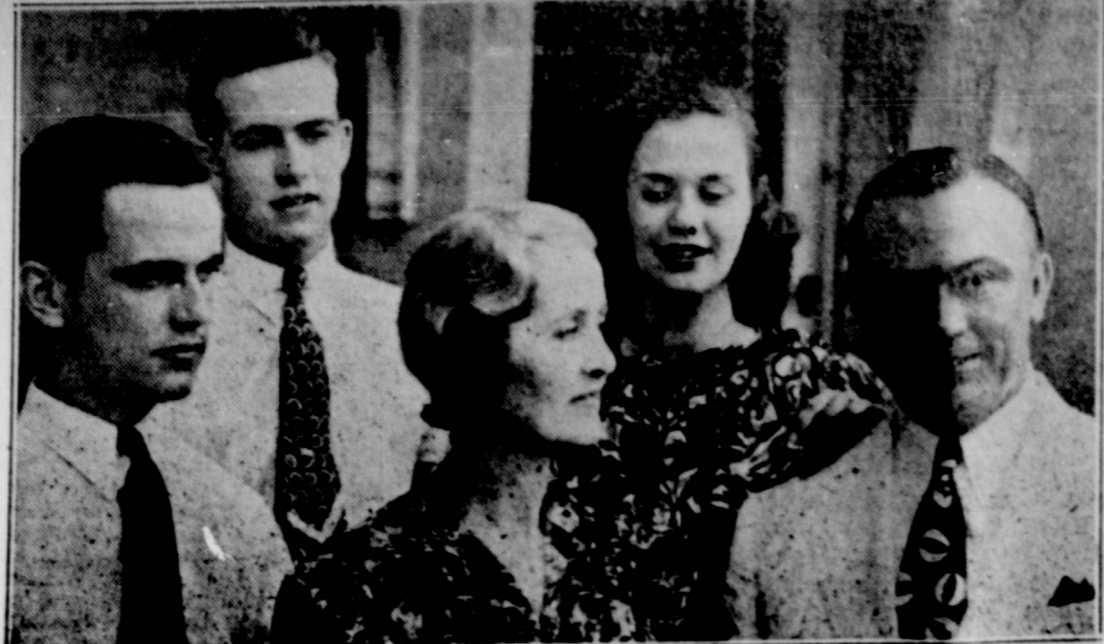
HYDE PARK, N. Y. — President Roosevelt signed the \$3,750,000,000 lending and spending bill today and asserted that business is not and has not been as bad as a lot of people believe it to be.

LONDON — The prospect of curbing or even ending Spain's destructive civil war became more promising tonight than at any time since the first shot was fired July 18, 1936. The committee for non-intervention finally agreed on the removal of foreign fighters from the Spanish ranks.

Free Speech Trial

NEWARK, N. J. — Presentation of charges that Mayor Frank Hague abrogated free speech and assemblage in Jersey City ended in federal court today with the mayor seeking in vain to make another attack on CIO council Morris L. Ernest.

ALPINE — The gruesome confession of Francis Marion Black, Jr., that he tossed 13-year-old Marvin

Wednesday, June 22

ALPINE — In less than 30 minutes today a jury of tanned West Texans found Marvin Dale Noblitt, guilty of pushing Marvin Dale Noblitt to his death from a 400-foot cliff, and voted to send the former University of Kansas student to the electric chair.

LONDON — The British government calmly ignored the sinking of two more of her merchant ships in the Mediterranean today and continue to canvass possibilities of a truce in Spain and early operation of her friendship pact with Italy.

Peace Moves In China

SHANGHAI — New peace moves to halt the spreading Chinese-Japanese warfare was reported under way today, as Japanese war planes struck three times at South China ports. New American-Japanese friction cropped up in Nanking and at Shanghai.

LOS ANGELES — Captured in a jury room in the Hall of Records, Arthur Emil Hansen, 38 years old, confessed today, sheriff's officers said, that he had shot and killed two lawyers in superior court chambers.

Thursday, June 23

HOBBS, New Mexico — Seven men, including a prominent New Mexico financier, were killed and five injured today in the premature explosion of a nitro-glycerin time bomb with which a drilling crew was preparing to shoot an oil well.

NEW YORK — In a court tilt without precedent, the government battled today to prevent one of its former ace "G-men" from publishing what was advertised as the "inside story" of a German espionage ring.

Fail Recorded

NEW YORK — A mobile television transmitter picked up a street scene of life and death today—the plunge of a young woman from a Rockefeller Center skyscraper—speeding clear images of her fatal fall to a Radio City studio screen

before which a little group of technicians sat in shocked silence. **KANSAS CITY, Mo.** — Jackson County sheriff's deputies have been instructed to "shoot to kill" if they catch vandals in the act of throwing bricks through windows or bombing building establishments, the Kansas City Journal Post said in a copyrighted story today.

Friday, June 24

ALBUQUERQUE, N. M. — A U. S. Forest Service employe reported tonight searchers for young Medill McCormick, heir to a publishing fortune, and his hiking companion had definitely found one body in the precipitous Sandia Mountains northeast of here.

NEW YORK — When the closing gong sounded through the big trading hall of the New York Stock Exchange today, the total quoted value of securities dealt in there was some \$4,000,000,000 (billion) higher than at the beginning of the week.

Another Spy Hunt

WASHINGTON — The army and navy may intensify and expand their counter-espionage activities to prevent foreign spies from getting valuable military secrets.

ANKARA, Turkey — President Kamal Ataturk is rapidly realizing his desire to make Turkey the most powerful of all Balkan states in the air. The goal, in the air, is 1,000 first class fighting planes and bombers.

Saturday, June 25

ROME — Europe was plunged into a new war scare tonight by Spanish government threats of bombing reprisals against Italy and a quick warning from Rome that Italy would meet such reprisals by wiping Spanish government cities "off the map."

LOS ANGELES — A combination good-will and "experimental" flight across the Atlantic and possibly around the world, will be Howard Hughes' next contribution to aviation history. The flight however is

also to "advertise" the New York Worlds Fair and smells highly of another "publicity stunt."

New Party?

WASHINGTON — President Roosevelt's rallying cry to "liberals" all over the country, regardless of party lines, heralded another advance toward some form of party realignment by 1940.

ALBUQUERQUE, N. M. — Darkness called a halt tonight to the search of Sandia Peak for Medill McCormick, heir to the McCormick publishing fortune, who has been missing since yesterday on a mountain climbing expedition.

Sunday School Lesson

THE STORY OF JOSHUA

International Sunday School lesson for Sunday, July 3, 1938.

Golden Text: Choose you this day whom ye will serve.—Joshua 24:15. Lesson Text: Joshua 1:2-6; 24:14-21.

Joshua 1:2-6—
Moses, my servant is dead; now therefore arise, go over this Jordan, thou, and all this people, unto the land which I do give to thee, even to the children of Israel.

3. Every place that the sole of your foot shall tread upon, that have I given unto you as I said unto Moses.

4. From the wilderness and this Lebanon even unto the great river, the river Euphrates, all the land of the Hittites, and unto a great sea toward the going down of the sun, shall be your coasts.

5. There shall not be any man able to stand before thee all the days of thy life, as I was with Moses, so I will be with thee, I will not fail thee nor forsake thee.

14. Now therefore fear the Lord and serve him in sincerity and in truth; and put away the Gods which your fathers served on the other side of the flood, and in Egypt, and serve the Lord.

15. And if it seems evil unto you to serve the Lord, choose you this day whom you will serve; whether the Gods which your fathers served, that were on the other side of the flood or, the Gods of the Amorites in whose land ye dwell, but as for me and my house, I will serve the Lord.

16. And the people answered and said, God forbid that we should forsake the Lord, to serve other Gods;

17. For the Lord our God, he it is that brought us up and our fathers out of the house of bondage, from the land of Egypt, and which did those great signs in our sight, and preserved us in all the way therein we went, and among all the people through whom we passed;

18. And the Lord drove out from before us, all the people, even the Amorites, which dwell in the land; therefore we will also serve the Lord for he is our God.

19. And Joshua said unto the people, Ye cannot serve the Lord; for he is an Holy God, he is a jealous God; he will not forgive your transgressions nor your sins.

20. If ye forsake the Lord and serve strange Gods, then he will turn and do you hurt, and consume you, after that he hath done you good.

Selected by Jehovah as the successor to Moses in leading the people of Israel over Jordan was Joshua. And, in the evidence of his life accomplishments, Joshua presents a proof of the reality of God's call to the heart of man.

It was not by chance that the task of continuing the work of Moses, with all its honor and its responsibility, fell upon Joshua. We have the picture of him as one of the twelve going up to spy the land which the children of Israel were seeking to enter. Ten of these twelve spies returned with discouraging and fear-stricken stories. The land was peopled by great and strong enemies, and there was no possibility of the Israelites being able to conquer it. But two men, Joshua and Caleb, had a different report. They emphasized the richness of the land which awaited the people and they said, "We are well able to possess it."

It was in this clear faith that Joshua accepted his leadership, and it was in the expression of his own spirit that he passed on to the people the admonition that had come to him, to be strong and of good courage.

But Joshua saw the people themselves weakened by their own lack of faith and by the immorality that prevailed among them. The worshipping of false gods on the part of the Israelites was not merely a matter of setting up other images. It meant the moral decay of the people and their lapse into evil practices that were associated with the worship of these false gods. Surrounded by pagan peoples whose religion lacked the emphasis upon righteousness and the moral virtues, emerging in the monotheistic faith of Israel, there was a constant tendency for social corruption to lay hold of the Israelites, sapping the ideals and visions that their prophetic leaders ever sought to inculcate.

It is in this situation that Joshua stands forth and makes a demand upon the people for a definite choice in the matter of loyalties. He sees them drifting into evil practices with no vital decision, and he calls upon them to realize that they must decide either for Jehovah and the religion of purer ideals, or for the false gods and the practices associated with their worship.

Aroused by this plain challenge, the people renounce the idea that they would forsake Jehovah to serve other gods, but this is not enough for Joshua. He does not want sen-

timental or pious profession. What he wants is a clear sense of what it means to serve Jehovah. That service means the renunciation of sin and unrighteousness. It means the giving of one's heart and will to the cause of truth and the welfare of Israel.

Times have changed but the old issues remain, and the challenge of Joshua, or of some equally prophetic leader of today, is as keen and vital as ever.

The welfare of America—much as the welfare of ancient Israel—depends upon clear, definite, and moral choice on the part of those who would "serve God, and the commonwealth."

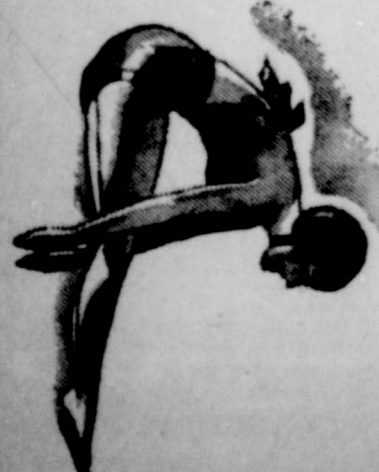
