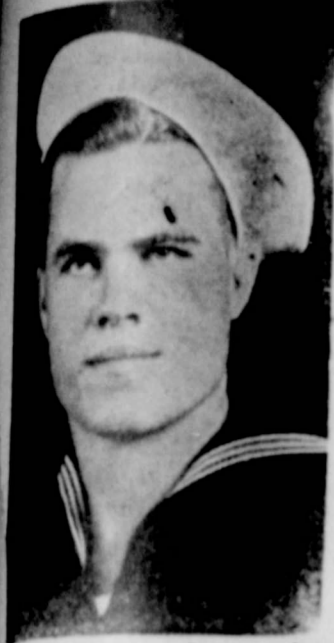


SANTA CLAUS?? WELL, ALMOST -- BUT NOT QUITE -- IT'S ME!



George Beasley, Jr., nephew of Mrs. R. F. Luttrell, was listed as one of the "safe and uninjured" following the torpedoing of the U. S. destroyer *Rubens James* October 31. Mrs. Luttrell, a twin sister of Mrs. George Beasley, was informed of the safety of her nephew early in November. He is a machinist mate second class, and was among the crew of the destroyer when it escorted troop ships to Iceland when the base was first established there last summer.

Beasley Is Saved When Ruben James Sunk In Atlantic

After many hours of anxious waiting, word was received here early in November by Mrs. R. F. Luttrell, telling of the safety of her nephew, George N. Beasley. George N. Beasley of Heavener, Oklahoma, was listed "safe and uninjured" following the torpedoing and sinking of the United States destroyer *Rubens James* on October 31.

The father of the sailor was on duty as a car inspector for the Kansas City Southern railroad when the news came. The telegram, from the Navy department, was received by Mr. Beasley four days after the ship was sunk. Beasley enlisted in the navy shortly after graduating from the Heavener High School and has served on the *Rubens James* since that time. He is 22 years old and is a machinist mate second class. His mother is a twin sister of Mrs. Luttrell. Mr. and Mrs. Beasley and their son visited in Floydada three years ago.

H. O. Withers, Brother Of L.G., Dead

H. O. Withers of Fort Worth, a brother of L. G. Withers of this city, died in the Methodist hospital in Fort Worth Tuesday morning at 3 o'clock, and was buried, following rites held yesterday, at Vernon. Fifty-three years of age, Mr. Withers had been in the hospital since August. He was a member of the 7th Engineers in the A. E. F. during World War I. Mr. and Mrs. L. G. Withers and daughters attended the funeral rites. Other surviving relatives include his father, J. B. Withers of Vernon, three sisters and two other brothers, one of whom is Jerry, who at one time resided in Floydada.
