Panhandle, there were 2481 accidents investigated by the Texas DPS, and according to Captain Bob Russell o the DPS, Texas Troopers investigated 91 fatal accidents with a total of 10 persons killed, 875 injury accidents
with a total of 1426 persons injured and 1515 property accidents for the 1981 year.
However, within the month of December alone, in the same district there were 221 accidents investigated
