CONGRATULATIONS President Reagan on getting his economic package through Congress. The president called upon all of his "moxy" and used a little armtwisting where it counted, to get his program passed.

With President Reagan moving ahead in his efforts to cut down on government spending, cutting out unnecessary waste in government, he is keeping his campaign promises, and living up to everything that his supporters have always expected of

Naturally, the liberal leaders across the nation are already striking up a chorus, crying like the proverbial "stuck pig.

The vote by Congress was blasted by the Texas Coalition of Black Democrats, for example, as a serious blow to the poor. Maybe so, but personally we think it's high time the 'poor' got up off their backsides and attempted to make a little of their own way

"I was approached by a friend I had known for a number of years, who offered me what I felt was a good opportunity. This came up rather sudden, and we did a lot of thinking. The move will be strictly for financial reasons," Houston said.

Houston's wife Judy has taught third grade at Friona, and was preferring not to teach. Houston said in his new position, he felt this could

be accomplished. While bandmaster at Friona, Houston's bands won the UIL sweepstakes trophy in competition twice, winning "first division" ratings in sight reading five years, similar ratings in concert four

years, and in the marching contest three years.

In addition, the Friona band was chosen "Honor Band" for the region twice, in 1977 and 1979.

Superintendent Tom Jarboe said it was with much regret that the resignation of Houston was accepted. "It may be a problem getting a quality director, as a number of other schools are also looking for a replacement this summer," Jarboe

#### 10 YEARS AGO-JULY 8, 1971



### **About Your Neighbors**

By JUNE FLOYD

Anyone who knocks on the door at 810 Woodland Avenue in Friona is likely to be greeted by a smiling face, which belongs to Alvin Carter. This charming lady has been a Parmer County resident since 1926.

She and her husband, the late Carl D. Carter, and their two small daughters, Glenda and Carol Dean, along with one of her brothers, the late Jim Coldiron, moved to a farm seven miles southeast of Friona when most of the farm land in the neighborhood was sod.

The first spring they were here the men broke out the farm land with horses and mules. At that time tractors were almost non-existent.

There wasn't any pavement in the county and very few graded roads. Alvin remembers that all road working equipment was pulled by horses or mules and farmers living along the roads were assigned different areas of the road to keep up.

"Carl's job," she said, "was to drag the road from our house south to the Syndicate Hotel, which was located on the road from Bovina to Dimmitt and later moved to Friona."

When the Carters came to Friona. they cut across pastures. At that time Spring Mercantile was located on South Main Street where the Sears Catalog Office, Strout Realty and H&R Block offices are now.

In her trip back down Memory Lane Mrs. Carter made the following observations:

"It was hard for me to learn to say 'Dr. Lee' and 'Dr. Paul,' and I still think of them as big boys helping their Dad in the operation of the

"Dr. McElroy and Dr. Wills were our doctors back then. Dr. Wills came to the farm to deliver our two daughters, Wynona and Zada, who were born after we moved here.

"Some of our neighbors in those days were the Otis Masseys, the Homer Hydes, the Clinkscales and the Frosts.

Alvin Coldiron was born February 25, 1899, in Coryell County, Texas. Carl Carter was born April 30, 1898 in Ellis County, Texas.

These two were married July 14, 1917 in Erath County, and lived there nine years before moving to Parmer County. In addition to his farming and road grading duties, Carl did construction work in his spare time and at one time was a butcher for a local store.

Mrs. Carter said, "We kept hens, milk cows and hogs; grew a garden and did just about anything else that we could to make ends meet during those days."

Then, she added, "No one, except those of us who lived through the Depression and Dust Bowl Days in this country during the early thirties can possibly understand how things really were. Prices were low, but money was so scarce that we had to make every penny count."

Her husband the victim of what was then called "dust pneumonia" died in 1933. For the next few years Alvin and the girls continued to live on the farm. Her brother, Jim, did most of the field work, but there were times when Alvin left the older girls to look after the younger ones and went to the field to help out during the growing season.

Then, in the fall of the year she and the girls helped with the cotton

"At that time," she said, "There were no mechanical cotton harvesters, so the only way to gather the cotton was to stoop over, pull it off the stalks, stuff it into long sacks, drag them through the field, weigh them and empty the contents into a wagon.'

She went on to say, "That was the only way the girls had to earn money for school things. Jim always paid each one of them just like he did the hired hands.'

A few years after her husband's death, Alvin, Jim and the girls moved to town. The most impressive thing to the girls at that time were running water in the house and a radio, which their uncle had swapped one of his plows for.

"For a few years," Alvin remembers, "We did whatever work we could find to do on a day to day basis. I did a lot of ironing and house cleaning for which I was paid very little, but somehow we managed to get by. When the girls and I are together now, we remember those days as lean but happy ones."

Her first full time job was with Dilger's Cleaners, which was the forerunner of Reed's Cleaners. She kept this job about twenty years before she retired.

All four of the Carter girls grew up and married here. At the present time, only one, Wynona, who is married to Clarence Martin, still lives here. However, Carol Dean, who lives in Farwell, commutes to Friona Mike and Greg Martin.

"Clarence (Martin) is the only sonin-law I have left," Mrs. Carter said. "Glenda, Carol Dean and Zada are all widows.'
