City Lights Dis-arranged. City fathers are hoping The Hesperian will say a word in explanation of the fact that stop lights are temporarily out on Calfornia Street. The lights had to be dismantled while repairs are under way on some of the sidewalks. The light at California and Main definitely will go back in as soon as possible. The council would like to follow highway Department's lead and have as few stop lights as possible. Accordingly, they are toying with the idea of eliminating the light at California and Fifth and using stop signs instead. People are doing more enlightened driving than formerly and the stop signs could be adequate.

The House and Senate of the current legislature, due to close their third called session this month, never did agree on a tax program. The bill that finally was adopted was a compromise between the extreme of the two bodies. Cigarettes will carry the biggest burden of any of the many new taxes, and corporation franchises the second biggest. The House finally got through their "severance beneficiary tax on natural gas" as a considerable cost in sales tax items, however. Texas people have been insistent on a severance tax on natural gas that is leaving the state by the millions of cubic feet every day, and House members considered they had a mandate to levy the tax. It may or may not prove to be constitutional, with the odds in favor of it being

Whether the different taxes will work out equitably is to be found out. Generally, following the close of every legislative session, there are a considerable number of surprises. The tax bill may have some unexpected bad news f a good many people, especially those who find they will have to set up some new bookkeeping procedures and be out additional money reporting to the state.

The People of Texas are demanding more and more services from their state government and those who want more things done for education, highways, penal and elemosynary institutions, will e insisting immediately that more be one, entailing even additional taxes.

Teachers, for instance, think they are entitled to another \$100 million and more to bring their profession up to par with industry and comparatively with other states. We Suspect Teachers will find the peo-






