EDITORIAL VIEWS AND COMMENT

Another Side To It. A somewhat vexed reader the other day said there are two sides to the rental business. The Heserian has been "riding" some of the prople who offer houses for rent. As said, we have thought these places should be put into condition for people to live in or not offered for rent. The other side is the story of the renter who tears up, or permits his family to tear up, the rental property he moves into. In some cities the property owner protects himself with a contract and a deposit guaranteeing the condition of the house. The kind that will take care of premises do not mind the owner protecting himself within reason. The other kind could be kept out of the house with few words.

Cattlemen's Troubles stem largely from operations of the State Department. Trying to make it good for the sheepmen, cattlemen, sugar men, wheat men,.. of other countries, our federal government is making all kinds of agreements that are costing the people of our country, in their various lines of endeavor. The flash in the pan in Cuba is most likely to result in a considerably higher sugar price in coming years. Cuba has been our favored off-spring these many years. Other tropical countries which can raise cane are raising Cain because we insist on sitting tight with Cuba, the spoiled child. The U.S. Government controls the sugar raised and the sugar imported into our countryevery pound of it.

Excessive Cattle and beef imports work to the disadvantage of the American cattleman, who has insisted all along he wants to keep free of entanglements with government subsidies. The imports are used to balance trade accounts with South American nations that need dollar exchange. The cattleman realizes he cannot be free of government subsidies without subjecting himself to possibly ruinous foreign competition. Additionally there is no indication that the cattle industry will succumb to the lure of subsidies. But he could use a little of the sympathetic interest the government is bestowing on the people south of the equator.

Doesn't Always Pay. Fertilizer does pay big dividends applied to the right crops at the right times. This has been demonstrated in this county time and again. But fertilizing, willy nilly, is expensive sometimes. A report in the current prints tells of experiments with soybeans. Some way to increase soybean ly accepted fertilizers for other crops must be found to make it profitable. High Plains Research Foundation has an interesting report in this connection in the public-prints this week.
