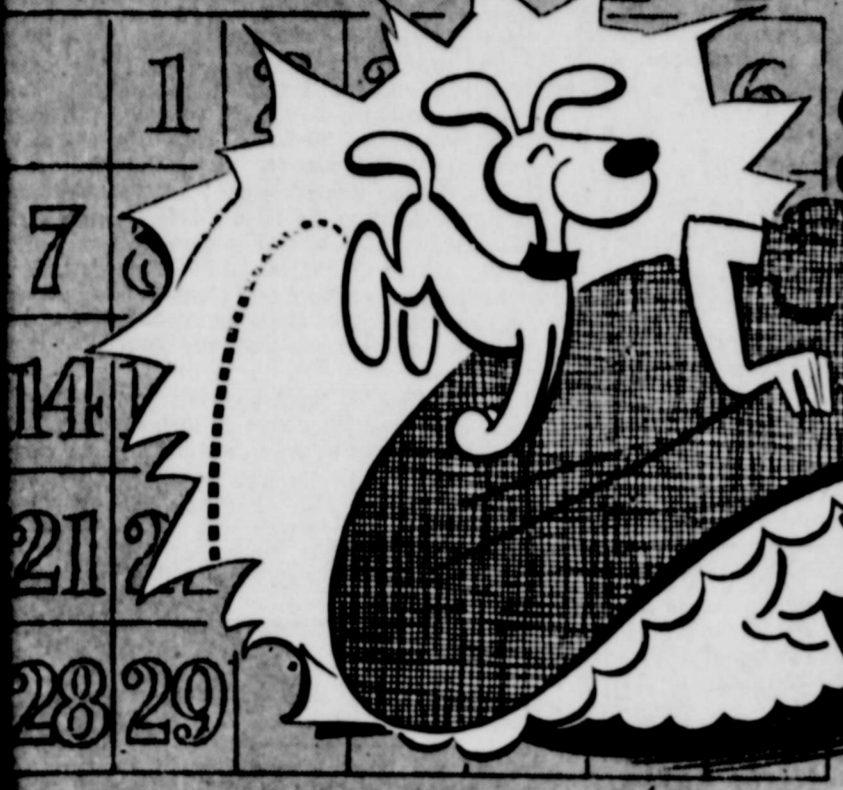

## Reliance In Talk T. Munn

as a professional speaker on television, radio, and to educational groups is an insurance agent with a firm in Tampa. He was formerly with the Dallas Chamber of Commerce. While with the Dallas organization he broke all records in the year of 1936 when he added 1362 members to the roster of that organization.

Mr. Munn is an active worker with the Key Club in Tampa, an organization for high school boys and has numerous other civic ties there.

The speaker dwelled on the importance of voting. Especially this year, he said, when America is at a crucial stage. He hit the Social Security law and the position in which it is leaving the employe and employer.

**Cites Social Security Law**

"The Social Security law alone will be enough in 20 years to collapse the American economy," he declared, charging that his 10-year-old son will have to pay more than \$3,000 of a \$10,000 in come 20 years from now "just to provide me the benefits the government is promising me today through Social Security."

He said the first fundamental of American freedom is a belief "in God as we understand him, yet a minority regularly attends church. Another fundamental he listed was a belief that "the individual is of great importance and another was a belief that the individual "has a right to choose for himself."

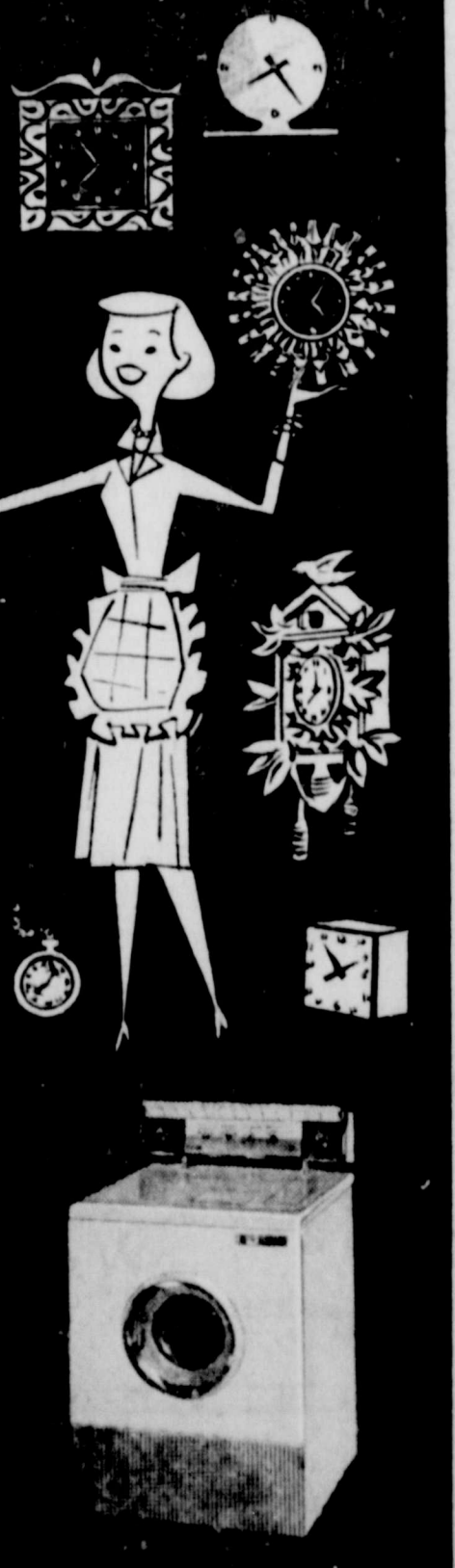

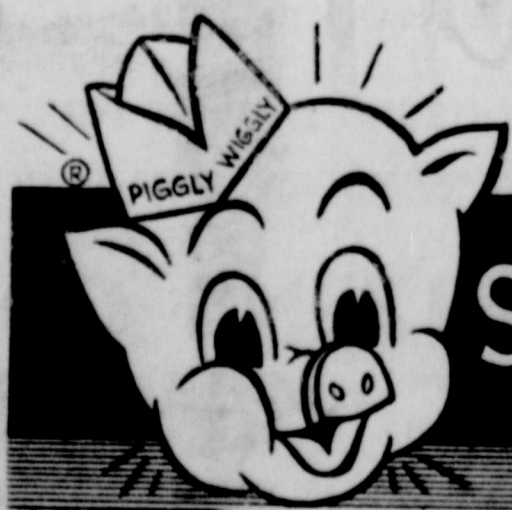
