Federal School Aid. The bill for federal aid to education which has passed the Senate has written into it controls over the way the money will be spent. Any governmental body has a responsibility for control over the taxpayers money it collects and spends. This is simple ABC. Schools built with federal aid would be subject to the federal act, with the provisions of which we are unfamiliar, except in a general way. One of these provisions is that workers wages would be determined by the U.S. Secretary of Labor. Also, although the State Education Agency has no authority over letting of school building contracts, it would be required to give "adequate assurance" that local school boards would accept and comply with federally determined rates. The federal people would, of course, have to inspect and check (regulate) the inspections made by local boards.

The Law Has Formulas. As would be expected the bill passed by the Senate has basic formulas. One of these formulas would be applied by the U.S. Commissioner of Education. His judgment would govern, based on a most recent "satisfactory" data furnished him. By this formula the commission could reduce the aid to schools in a state, should it appear the state is not trying as hard as others to provide for the education of its children.

Numerous Other Provisions. The formula also requires the state to put up matching money. Some states are more able to raise money for education than others. A state which would not or could not match the federal money, would be faced with the threat of withholding money collected in part from its own citizens. The formula would set up accepted standards with a minimum per cent of increase that would be recog-

The Logical Outcome. Such controls are necessary for spending federal money, where it is spent and how. There can be no federal aid without federal control. The fact is the bill is fashioned for control by the Secretary of Labor and the Commissioner of Education. After the pattern is set then the federal authorities would add new interpretations and regulations, pushing their authority further and further. The outcome: decisions which ought to be made on the local level and approved by the State Education Agency would be made in Washington.




