Floyd County's "big money per acre crop" began ta roll to the packing sheds this week as three onion associations began harvesting operations.

The S & H Onion Shed, The Floydada Growers And Marketing Association, and The Barwise Onion Association were employing over 800 Latin-Americans in the fields and grading sheds and growers estimate the harvest will be finished in two or three weeks.

Yields are average with 400 to 500 sacks per acre and prices are exceptionally good. Prices are averaging up to \$3.00 per sack. It is possible that the 700 acre in the county could produce almost a million dollars
