# THE FLOYDADA SCHOOI BOND ELECTION 

The patrons and taxpayers of Floydada Independent School District go to the polls Saturday, September 28th, 1963, in the Court House af Floydada, to vote whether or not they will approve the 5800,000 bond issue called for by the Frusiees of the Schools.

Ask yourself the following questions: Does the school need S800,000 to spend at this time? Are the items set up in the budget all "Needs" or are part o ithem "Wants"? Are you aware that the proposed bonds, if voted, would create a lien against your home or farmuntil they are paid? Have you figured the Grand Iotal Cost to the District, including interest? Get the figures and you will be staggered at the total.

LET'S SERIOUSLY AND CAREFULLY ANALYZETHIS MATTER BEFORE WEVOTE EITHERWAY.

FACT1-..The approvai of the bonds will not affect the operation of the schools. Spokesmen for the school board at the public meeting in the high school auditorium in Floyd-
ada on September 6th said: "The Trustees are empowered to assess and collect sufficient funds to operate the schools, and this will be done regardless of Bond lssues". (The law provides for this.)

FACT 2 -.. Gross inequities resulting from the survey and recommendations by the three wise men from another county who were hired by the trustees are wholly inefficient and faulty and do not reflect a fair and equitable appraisal of true cash values. Cotton allotments on land ... one of the greatest factors in the selling price of land ... ranging in an extremely wide variation in prices, have not been given a thought by the appraisers in seiting prices for the owners to pay taxes on.

FACT 3… Our water supply is being depleted thirty fimes as tast as nature is restoring it. We are headed for dry-land farming where irrigation is now used. And, this time is near at hand. When it comes where will your 3550 per acre land be? This is some-
thing to seriously think about.

FACT 4 ...If thehonds were tobeam it would not be possible for school ings to be erected for use in the o schoolyear.
