The striking of gas aroused hopes that oil production might extend that distance since there are a series of fields northwest from Yates through Crane, Upton, Ward, Winkto New Mexico.

Mid-Kansas retains the block on which it's Goode well is located and may deepen the gasser or do further exploration before the leases expire.



A lesson in heredity was pointed out the other day by George Ketng, Ballinger dairyman in conversation with the county agent. He exhibited two half sister heifers. 


