Pastor Reviews With Local Church

Report Discloses that Church Has Enviable Financial Record

Sunday being the beginning of he eighth year of his pastorate with the Sanderson Presbyterian church, Rev. J. V. McCall reviewed some causes for gratitude during the past seven years taking as the basis for his remarks the text, "Ebenezer-Hitherto hath the Lord Helped Us." After calling attention to the meaning and the value of memorials, he summed up the past seven years as ollows:

The church has received 32 members during that time, the present membership numbering 59 just about the same as it was seven years ago. The membership has lost heavily by removals and the death of J. W. McKee and one o rtwo others.

The church has done well in finances, having raised \$8680 for local work, and \$3358 for benevolences, or an average per year of \$1240 for current expenses, and \$479 for the benevolences.




