PIONEER CITIZEN ENDS 35 YEARS THURSDAY NIGHT OFFICIAL SERVICE FOR TERRELL CO.

Very few changes were made in officials of Terrell County. effective January 1. but the new year marked the end of 35 years of faithful service to Sanderson and Terrell County by one of its pioneer citizens.

W. J. Banner first started his career as a public servant for Terrell County serving as its first tax assessor, beginning in the latter part of 1905 when the county was organized and serving in that capacity for nine years He later served the people of precinct 4 as commission er before being elected to the office of sheriff and tax assessor in 1928. He served one term in that capacity and then in 1934 was named commissioner of precinct 1 and has served in that capacity since that time Mr Banner came to this section of the country when it was still a part of Pecos County, and was instrumenal in the organization of this county. Since the beginning of the county he has offered his services to the people unstintingly, and has done much in promoting the development and growth it has enjoy

ed since its organization. He thas always found time to devote to the needs of the county and at the same time has taken care of his ranching interests. The people of Terrell County regret that Mr. Banner's health is such that it was necessary that he retire from active publie life but his many friends know that his efforts have left many monuments of his work and they hope for him many years of contentment and better health, knowing that he has given his all for the betterment of Terrell County and the welfare of his fellowmen.





First Aid Made Compulsory For CCC Men

WASHINGTON, D. C. --- T h American Red Cross here announced that it was coperating with the Civilian Conservation Corps and the War Department in the training of 300.000 CCC enrollees in Red Cross first ald, as a part of its national defense program

This cooperative effort initiated by John J. McClure. CCC director, provides for 20 hours of first aid instruction for every CCC enrollee Director McEntee informed the War Department that arrangements had been completed with the Red Cross requiring all supervisory personnel and enrollees to receive training in Red Cross first aid. Harold F. Enlows, national director of Red Cross First Aid Service, said his organization would assign a supervisor for each of the nine CCC corps areas throughout the country. Working in cooperation with CCC officials, members of the national staff of the Red Cross will train some 3.000 instructors, who in turn, will conduct classes in the 1.500 camps for the 200,000 CCC

enrollees. Instructors' training schools call for an intensive two-week course and will be attended by camp personnel having previous first aid training. Describing the project as the

most extensive single undertaking the Red Cross has assumed in the first aid field, Mr. Enlows declared the program has a twofold purpose: to reduce accidents in CCC camps and to better equip enrollees being absorbed by the defense industries. Since 1934, the Red Cross, work-

ing with the CCC. has trained 65.000 enrollees annually in first aid. CCC workers who have completed first aid training are given preference by employers, he said

"Last year accidents claimed 93,00 lives and temporarily disabled some 8.500,000 persons," Mr. Enlows stated. "Enrollees completing their service in the CCC will return to their homes. sure of around 250 pounds. The with her parents.
