



Don't neglect to have your name changed on your social security account card when you get married. If you don't it may cost you money in the long run

In case you take a job, part time or full time during the holiday season (or at any other time during the year) be certain to give your social security account number to your em-

You can secure a statement of the wages credited to your oldage and survivors insurance account by requesting it on a post card prepared for that purpose | No which may be secured from any Social Security Board office.

Keep your social security account card in a safe place at all

You need only one social security account number-it is the number you will have throughout your life.

Don't lose your social security account card-however, if you do, ask the Social Security Board field office for a "duplicate" and do not ask for a "new number". Aplications for securing a new number or duplicates are available at your Post Office. When you have completed your aplication, you should mail it to the Social Security Board, 414 Rust Building, San Angelo,
