College of Mines Io Install Lights For Night Foolball

| EL PASO, Aug. 25-Heralding the return of ehe Texas College of mines to the intercollegiate football wars is the installation of a $\$ 28,000$ lighting system to illuminate the Miners' Kidd Field for night play. <br> Dispite present shortages, College of Mines officials have obtained materials to installa lighting system which will be on par or better than any in the country. <br> Six steel towers 18 inches in diameter are now being installed. Each tower will be equipped with 24 Crouse-Hinds narrow beam floodlights with clear lens and cross-arm base, each ūsing a 1500 -watt bulb. <br> When completed, the engineer says the new unit will generate 45 foot candle power on the playing field.
